Requested Action:

Submit to the School Board of Broward County a formal request to rename Atlantic Technical Center, McFatter Technical Center and Sheridan Technical Center to Atlantic Technical College, McFatter Technical College and Sheridan Technical College.

Explanation/Background:

Broward County Technical Centers have the opportunity to change the three Technical Centers' names to Technical Colleges. This action would not change the current governance/operating structure or require formal legislative approval. The change of Atlantic, McFatter and Sheridan Technical Centers to Technical Colleges is authorized and approved by our accrediting commission, The Council on Occupational Education (COE).

The rationale for this name change is focused on increasing student access, interest and enrollment in our instructional programs. There would be an increase in the number of qualified program graduates, completers, and earned industry certifications as well as an improved high skilled workforce within Broward County. A long-standing issue for Technical Centers has been the public's perception that the term "vocational education" is considered a "second rate" education. The creation of public Technical Colleges will enable us to operate more competitively with the private for-profit technical schools which already use the name "College" and have the ability to offer degrees. Currently, there are over 15 private for-profit colleges operating in Broward, South Palm Beach and North Dade Counties.

Another opportunity that the Broward Technical Colleges will have is the ability to more effectively attract high school graduates to enroll in technical programs following their high school graduation. The opinion among high school students, staff and parents is that College is a more acceptable postsecondary educational option than attending a vocational technical school/center. The term "vocational" is viewed negatively as well as the name Technical Center. Nationally, many states have already made the conversion from Technical Centers/ Institutes to Technical Colleges.

Supporting Data:

The Florida Office of Program Policy and Government Accountability (OPPAGA) presented a report on January 8, 2014 to the Florida legislature about the consideration to rename Florida's Technical Centers to Technical Colleges. OPPAGA reported that there are 37 states with public sub-baccalaureate technical institutions. Tennessee and Utah recently changed their entire state system of Technical Centers to Technical Colleges. Both states reported an increase between 15% - 25% in enrollment after the name change. Most of the States in the southern region of the United States have already changed their post-secondary career Technical Centers to Technical Colleges. The name change will more clearly inform the general public as well as business and industry who the Broward Technical Centers are and the many technical career education training opportunities that they provide to support Florida's need for a skilled workforce.

School Advisory Committee Minutes
May 21, 2014

Attendees: Jim Anderson, Rhonda Biazar, Bob Boegli, Daryl Diamond, Joanne Endorf, Tony Gold, Lynn Goldman, Henry Graham, Art Goodman, Bob Hemingway, Hector Lopez, Clay Milan, and Mike Setzer.

The meeting was called to order by Hector Lopez at 11:53 and self-introductions were made.

The minutes from the March 19, 2014 meeting were not available for approval. They will be presented at the next meeting.

Old Business:

- Sheridan Scholarship Foundation – Lynn Goldman
 - It was reported that \$47,000 was raised at the Foundation event held on March 19, 2014. Twelve thousand dollars was allocated to Sheridan Technical Center (STC). Of that amount \$6,000 is now being disbursed to students.
- Sheridan Technical High School – Bob Boegli
 - Mr. Boegli welcomed the Committee to the new Sheridan Technical High School (STHS). He explained that the location was previously known as the Sunset Learning Center which was closed last school year.
 - STHS will, this year, house 150 9th grade students. Eventually STHS will be a full high school (9-12) with a total of 600 students. The school boundaries are Sunrise Blvd south to the Miami-Dade line.
 - Most of the classes for the 9th students will be face to face. Even though 2 ½ credits will be online, students will be on campus with a classroom monitor. This will be a similar scenario for 10th grade students. When students reach 11th and 12th grade, all their classes will be totally online or blended.
 - In addition to the STHS students, share-time students and two ESE programs (ACCESS and Career Placement).
 - Any high school student that needs transportation to Sheridan will be driven to STHS. If a student needs to go to the main campus from the high school, they will ride an activity bus between locations. At this time we have 297 career dual enrolled students.
 - In lieu of textbooks, students will receive a Yoga through which all books will be accessed.
 - All students will graduate with everything necessary to enter any college or university they choose. In addition, they will also have earned an industry credential.
 - Students will graduate via "Exhibition." Exhibitions will be presented to a panel of business people in their field of study.
- Student Industry Certifications – Bob Boegli
 - STC has reimbursed over \$50,000 to students who have taken and passed their industry credential exam.
