

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Declaration of One Hundred Thirty Three (133) Portables Located at School Sites Depicted in Exhibit No. 2 as Surplus

These portables are currently deemed as unsatisfactory in the Florida Inventory of School Houses (FISH). The one hundred thirty three (133) portables located at several schools are deemed unsatisfactory due to compromising effects on the structural integrity or excessive physical deterioration.

It should be noted that the proposed surplus of the one hundred thirty three (133) portables is consistent with the recent realignment in the 2014/15 Adopted District Educational Facilities Plan (ADEFP), where the Board directed that priority in the demolition of portables should be given to portables located at school sites. Additionally, the surplus of the portables and their subsequent demolition would allow for the restoration of the grounds at the affected schools where the portables used to occupy.

The condition of the portables have been confirmed by Physical Plant Operations (PPO), Safety, and Building Departments, and was accomplished in coordination with the affected school principals, Class Size Reduction, the Demographics and Student Assignments Department, the Facility Planning & Real Estate Department, and the Office of Facilities and Construction. Staff will continue to work with school principals to examine and process additional portables that could be deemed as unsatisfactory, be qualified to be declared as surplus, and be subsequently demolished.

Upon authorization by the School Board to declare the one hundred thirty three (133) portables as surplus, the PPO Department will commence the process of demolishing the portables.
