REQUESTED ACTION: Approve contract - Dating Matters Initiative- with State of Florida, Department of Health.																
SUMMARY EXPLANATION AND BACKGROUND: <p>The purpose of the program, <i>Dating Matters: Strategies to Promote Healthy Teen Relationships</i>, is to build local public health capacity to establish a comprehensive community-wide teen dating violence prevention initiative that focuses on 11-14 year olds to promote respectful, non-violent dating relationships among youth in high-risk urban communities. This is year two of the five-year initiative.</p> <p>Middle Schools participating in the initiative include: Attucks, Crystal Lake, Deerfield Beach, Gulfstream, Lauderdale Lakes, Lauderhill, McNicol, Olsen, Pompano Beach, Rickards, Silver Lakes, and William Dandy.</p> <p>High Schools participating in the initiative include: Blanche Ely, Boyd Anderson, Coconut Creek, Deerfield Beach, Dillard, Hollywood Hills, Northeast, Piper and South Broward.</p> <p>This agreement has been reviewed and approved as to form and legal content by the Office of the General Counsel. This agreement will be executed after School Board approval.</p>
