

## **Proposed Amendment to the Adopted District Educational Facilities Plan Principal Survey - Summary of Responses**

The Principal Survey of the proposed amendment to the Adopted District Educational Facilities Plan resulted in 100 responses. Those responses and the staff follow-up actions fall into the following categories. Some responses fall into multiple categories so the total from the categories below exceeds 100.

- There are 76 responses that list a facility project concern, including four schools that had questions about music equipment upgrades. The Facilities Department is contacting each school or scheduling a site visit with each of these principals so they can discuss the project concerns in more detail.
- There are 19 responses that list a technology concern. The Information & Technology Department is contacting each of those principals.
- There are four responses that list music renovations and equipment concerns. They are being contacted by the Innovative Learning and Arts Department to address their concerns.
- There are 12 responses where the school did not list a concern with the plan.
- Finally, 15 of the responses provided positive feedback on the plan and their school's projects.

A common concern expressed throughout the responses is specifically related to the timing of projects. The follow-up discussion with these schools will help them understand the challenge facing all of the SMART program work is that it is all needed by our schools today. As such the projects are scheduled out over 5 years in order to manage each project effectively while also holding to our commitment to tax payers with regards to the increase in property taxes.
