Project Description	The demand for skilled labor in South Florida continues to outpace the size of the
J	industry workforce. Employers across Broward County including the District's Office
	of Facilities and Construction Management, lack skilled employees. Under the
	auspices of the Career Technical Adult and Community Education department, this
	pilot program will initially begin a career technical program providing high school
	students with the technical and soft skills and work experience needed for a career in
	facilities and construction management. The Office of Facilities and Construction
	Management will engage these high school students in quality group and individual
	internships. The goal of the program is to help young people attain the skills,
