**RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF ATTENDANCE AWARENESS MONTH
SEPTEMBER 2016**

WHEREAS, cities and communities across the country are confronted with the issue of one in four students missing a month or more of school, placing them at risk of academic failure, drop out risk and reduced socialization; and

WHEREAS, it is the goal of the School Board of Broward County, Florida to increase student achievement. Research has shown a direct correlation between student attendance and academic achievement; and

WHEREAS, chronic absence is defined by Florida State Statutes as a student who has had at least five unexcused absences, or absences for which the reasons are unknown, within a calendar month, or 10 unexcused absences, or absences for which the reasons are unknown, within a 90-calendar-day period, may be exhibiting a pattern of non-attendance (F.S. 1003.26 (1) (b)), contributes to lower student achievement; and

WHEREAS, chronic absenteeism is a proven predictor of struggles in academics. Chronic absenteeism also increases the likelihood of dropping out; and

WHEREAS, The School Board of Broward County has partnered with community agencies such as The State Attorney's Office and state funded Children in Need of Services/Families in Need of Services (CINS/FINS) agencies to address the needs of students demonstrating chronic absence, both excused and unexcused; and

WHEREAS, ensuring and monitoring regular school attendance is the responsibility of all stakeholder groups in Broward County, Florida,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that The School Board of Broward County, Florida, in conjunction with other agencies and organizations, hereby declares

September 2016 as Attendance Awareness Month

and urges everyone within its jurisdiction and under its authority to join in this annual observance.

WHEREAS, The School Board understands its role in educating students to demonstrate responsibility, citizenship, respect, kindness, and tolerance in a free democratic society; and





WHEREAS, Section 111 states that all educational institutions receiving funds from the Federal Department of Education are required to comply by implementing an educational program pertaining to the United States Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the School Board of Broward County, Florida is an educational institution receiving funding from the Federal DOE;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that The School Board of Broward County, Florida, in conjunction with Public Law 108-447, Section 111, of the Consolidated Appropriation Act, 2005 declares

RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH
OCTOBER, 2016

WHEREAS, October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month, which is an annual campaign by major breast organizations to increase awareness of the disease and encourage screening for early detection to uncover malignant cells forming in the breast; and

WHEREAS, women get breast cancer more than any other type of cancer except for skin cancer. Breast cancer is second only to lung cancer as a cause of cancer death in women; and it is estimated nearly 200,000 women will be diagnosed with breast cancer, and more than 40,000 will die. Additionally, approximately 1,700 men will also be diagnosed with breast cancer and 450 will die each year. Men are also encouraged to be evaluated and to utilize mammography as a means of prevention; and

WHEREAS, early detection empowers an individual to begin to learn how to fight, get the facts, and instills hope leading to longer survival and improved survival rates; and educating the public about early detection, the cause, diagnosis, and treatment strengthens support for survivors; and

WHEREAS, performing breast self-exams and looking for signs of change; following a schedule of age appropriate examinations and mammograms; maintaining a healthy weight, following a low-fat diet, getting regular exercise, quitting smoking and reducing alcohol consumption are all positive actions an individual can do to reduce the incidence of breast cancer; and

WHEREAS, The School Board of Broward County, Florida, values each of its employees, and since breast cancer primarily affects so many working women; urges everyone to become educated and proactive in combating this disease, utilizing health coverage available for early screenings, mammograms and accessing the mobile mammovan, if needed for annual screenings; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, The School Board of Broward County, Florida, hereby declares its support of

**RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF
DISABILITY MENTORING DAY - OCTOBER 19, 2016**

WHEREAS, more than one million people with disabilities have entered the labor force since the passage of the Americans with Disabilities Act in 1990; and

WHEREAS, taxpayers, consumers, and workers, people with disabilities are contributing to our society and to their own fulfillment of the American dream; and,

WHEREAS, new generations of young people with disabilities are growing up in Broward County, Florida, graduating from high school, going to college, and preparing to participate in the workplace; and,

WHEREAS, job seekers with disabilities, regardless of age, are striving to attain economic independence through self-sufficiency and gainful employment; and,

WHEREAS, both students and job seekers with disabilities have the right to maximize their potential by making the most of their intellect, talents, and abilities in an environment free of physical, programmatic, and attitudinal barriers; and,

WHEREAS, the month of October was first declared National Disability Employment Awareness Month by the U.S. Congress in 1945 and U. S. Department of Labor supports "Workers with Disabilities: Ready for Tomorrow's Jobs Today"; and

WHEREAS, Disability Mentoring Day, planned in conjunction with National Disability Employment Month, provides an opportunity for students and job seekers with all types of disabilities to gain insight into career options by spending part of their day in the workplace "shadowing" an employee as he or she goes through a normal day on the job; and

WHEREAS, employers from the private, governmental, and non-profit sectors may benefit from mentoring people with disabilities as a way of learning about the experience of disability, developing lasting relationships with disability community leaders, and recruiting new and emerging talent for meaningful internships and employment opportunities; and

WHEREAS, in Broward County Schools, 2285 students were identified as homeless during the 15-16 school year of which 2% attended pre-school; 18% attended middle school, 29% attended high school and 51% attended elementary school; and

WHEREAS, of the 2,285 homeless students, 1% were awaiting foster care; 2% were unsheltered; 10% resided in motels and hotels; 23% resided in temporary shelters; and 64% resided doubled-up out of economic necessity or similar situation; and

WHEREAS, youths of color and lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer and questioning (LGBTQ) are disproportionately represented in this population; and

WHEREAS, youths experiencing homelessness are 87% more likely to drop out of school; and

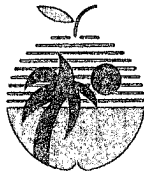

One in three teenagers report knowing a friend or peer who has been hit, punched, kicked, slapped, choked or physically hurt by their partner. 42% of boys and 43% of girls say the abuse occurs in a school building or on school grounds. And, if trapped in an abusive relationship, 73% of teens said they would turn to a friend for help; but only 33% who have been in or known about an abusive relationship said they have told anyone about it; and,

As a community, we must not be silent on this issue and must actively promote dating violence awareness in addition to supporting and promoting programs offering vital prevention and assistance services to our community; and

RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF CONCUSSION MANAGEMENT PROTOCOLS INCLUDING NEUROCOGNITIVE TESTING FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT ATHLETES

WHEREAS, a concussion is a disturbance in brain function that occurs following either a blow to the head, face, or neck or as a result of the violent shaking of the head or body; and

WHEREAS, a concussion resulting from playing in interscholastic sports may result in the rapid onset of neurological impairment and acute clinical symptoms such as chronic headache, fatigue, mental sluggishness, sleep difficulties, personality changes (e.g. increased irritability), sensitivity to light or noise, dizziness, and coordination difficulties as well as deficits in short term memory, concentration, problem solving, and general academic functioning that reflect a functional neurological disturbance; and

WHEREAS, the incidence of concussion leaves student-athletes vulnerable to conditions such as Second Impact Syndrome, which can result in death or permanent disability, or Post-Concussion Syndrome, which involves thinking, behavioral, and emotional difficulties that can last up to weeks, months, or even years after injury to the brain, should a student-athlete sustain a second concussion prior to the complete resolution of the primary injury; and

WHEREAS, the School Board of Broward County implements a series of concussion management protocols designed to prevent and manage concussions including the implementation of baseline and post injury neurocognitive testing; and

WHEREAS, concussion management protocols include:

- Annual pre-participation physical for all student athletes with medical history requirements on head injuries, concussions, severe headaches, tingling in extremities and memory loss,
- Agreements with Broward Health and Memorial Healthcare to provide state/nationally certified athletic trainers at all high schools. Athletic trainers serve as first responders for sports medicine issues including concussions,
- Adhere to Florida High School Athletic Association rule that any athlete who exhibits signs, symptoms or behaving consistent with a concussion (such as loss of consciousness, headache, dizziness, confusion or balance problems) shall be immediately removed from the contest or practice and shall not return to play until cleared by an appropriate health care professional,



- All head, paid coaches and student athletes are required to view the online education course, "Concussion in Sports-What you need to know." An affidavit of compliance for the concussion course must be maintained by each high school and signed by the school principal and athletic director,
- Contest officials shall be cognizant of athletes who display signs, symptoms or behaviors of a concussion and immediately stop play for injury evaluation within the rules of the game. Once the patient has been removed from a contest due to a suspected concussion, the coach, athletic trainer and appropriate health care professional shall assume full responsibility for that athlete's evaluation and safety. The national certified athletic trainer will assist with sideline evaluation of a student athlete when the athlete is sent out of a game or practice,
- High school football players must sit out one play if their helmet comes off while the ball is live,
- All student athletes participating in interscholastic sports shall be required as a participating condition to take a baseline neurocognitive test. Neurocognitive tests which are brief, computer-administered, neurocognitive screening devices developed by experts in the field of sport-related concussion, scientifically validated to measure the effects of concussive injuries, and designed to help clinicians evaluate an athlete's recovery following concussion by assessing aspects of an athlete's cognitive functioning such as working memory, sustained and selective attention and reaction time, can be used to help objectively evaluate a concussed athlete's post injury condition and track their recovery for a safe return to play and thereby help to prevent or minimize the cumulative effects of concussion,
- No athlete shall return to play or practice on the same day of a suspected concussion,
- Any athlete suspected of having a concussion shall be evaluated by an appropriate health care professional,
- Any athlete with a suspected concussion shall be medically cleared by an appropriate health care professional prior to resuming participation in any practice or competition,
- After medical clearance, return to play shall follow a graduated protocol with provisions for delayed return to play based upon the return of any signs or symptoms,
- Adhere to National Operating Committee on Standards for Athletic Equipment (NOCSAE) to annually recondition every football helmet,
- Limit the lifespan of helmets to five years, and destroy all helmets after the five-year period,
- Every student athlete and parent shall be required to read and sign Consent and Release from Liability Certificate for Concussions. Such certificate produced by the Florida High School Athletic Association shall educate parents and athletes on signs and symptoms of a concussion and action steps that must be taken; and



WHEREAS, the School Board of Broward County supports a comprehensive education campaign to increase awareness about concussion management, including prevention, symptoms and treatment developed with the assistance of Broward Health, Memorial Healthcare, Nova Southeastern, booster clubs and community organizations such as the Daniel Brett Foundation; and

WHEREAS, funding for the neurocognitive testing, called ImPACT, is jointly funded by the Broward County Athletic Association, Nova Southeastern University and Florida Community Bank;

WHEREAS, the Florida Legislature passed Florida Statute 383.50, *Treatment of Abandoned Newborns*, the Safe Haven Law, in July, 2000. Subsequently, in 2001 the Gloria M. Silverio Foundation, a 501(c)3 Florida not-for-profit organization, started the first major project, "A Safe Haven for Newborns", in response to the tragedy of newborn abandonment in Florida; and

WHEREAS, the Foundation started in Miami and today, through public awareness efforts, is in all 67 Florida counties, partnering with the Florida Fire Chiefs Association, Emergency Medical Services, many hospitals and other organizations and agencies throughout the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, Florida law states that a birth parent (mother or father) may anonymously leave an infant approximately three days old or younger, and who does not appear to be abused or neglected, in the hands of staff at a fire station or hospital, letting that person know they are leaving the baby in a "safe haven", without fear of being arrested or charged with abandonment; and

WHEREAS, many hospital emergency rooms, fire stations, and ambulance stations have a sign identifying their building as a "Safe Baby Station"; and

WHEREAS, the lifeline of the organization is the 24/7 statewide multilingual helpline, 1-877-767-BABY (2229), which was initially created to assist young mothers who were considering the "Safe Haven" option or wanted to know more about the law; and the organization has grown into helping pregnant girls/women or mothers in crisis or need covering a wide variety of issues; and the website <http://www.asafehavenfornewborns.com> has been established to assist in accessing information; and

WHEREAS, as of today over 236 babies have been saved from abandonment in the State of Florida; over 5,000 mothers have been assisted in their time of need or crisis; 61 mothers, their anonymity not a concern, chose to place their baby directly with a licensed adoption agency, 5 parents successfully regained their parental rights; and 4 newborns were saved from abandonment in other states, securing their future; and

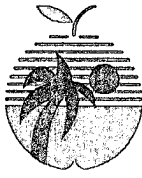





**RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF NATIONAL DAY OF SILENCE
APRIL 21, 2017**

WHEREAS, in April 1996, the National Day of Silence was created at the University of Virginia; and

WHEREAS, in 2015, hundreds of thousands of students from more than 9,000 K-12 schools, colleges and universities organized Day of Silence events. These numbers make the Day of Silence one of the largest student-led actions in the United States. The event has drawn significant attention to lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT) issues in schools over the years; and

WHEREAS the national focus of the Day of Silence is to help end LGBT bullying and prevent harassment of students, particularly physical violence and verbal threats; and

WHEREAS, according to the Gay Lesbian and Straight Education Network's (GLSEN) 2013 School Climate Survey, 30% of LGBT students missed at least one day of school in the past month because they felt unsafe or uncomfortable, 85% of students surveyed were verbally harassed (e.g., called names or threatened) in the past year because of their sexual orientation, and 63.9% because of their gender expression; and

WHEREAS, it was also determined a greater number of educators supportive of LGBT students was also associated with higher educational aspiration; and LGBT students in schools with Gay-Straight Alliances (GSAs) were more likely to feel safe in school than students whose schools do not have a GSA; and

WHEREAS, The School Board of Broward County, Florida supports the development and expansion of Gay-Straight Alliance Clubs in schools throughout Broward County to nurture and value all identities; and
