Project Description	To provide educational services to female students between the ages of 12-18, in a prevention/intervention day treatment program from commencement of board approval. The Department of Equity and Academic Attainment is responsible for the educational and administrative support services for the students who are under the supervision of the Department of Juvenile Justice. The educational services follow an alternative 230-student contact day calendar as required by Florida Statute

	SBBC will annually assess student achievement using District and State approved assessments such as the Florida Standards Assessment (FSA), End of Course Exam (EOC), number of High School Diplomas awarded, number of High School Equivalency Diplomas awarded, number of High School credits awarded as established by the Florida Department of Education, and post-secondary career opportunities: Eight students passed the Reading FSA; Six students passed the EOC's (Civics, Biology, & American History); Three High School Diplomas awarded; two High School Equivalency Diplomas awarded; 158 High School Credits awarded, and 160 students enrolled in job- training/vocational courses/programs.
Research Methodology	Florida State Statutes 1003.27 and 1003.51 support the rationale of this program, which mandate that the Department of Juvenile Justice and local school district collaborate to provide a free and public education to all youth in juvenile justice settings.
