Broward County Public Schools Data Snapshot 2016 and 2017 SAT School Days Report from Student Assessment \& Research August 2017

SAT Participation Increased by 37
Percentage points when SAT Day was introduced in 2016

- The first SAT School Day was held in 2016.
- Overall participation increased from 50\% in 2015 to $87 \%$ in both 2016 and 2017.
- The participation gap was virtually eliminated for all groups except for students with disabilities, whose gap dramatically decreased.

*Note: 2015 represents any SAT taken during the school-year.

## SAT Performance

- The overall average scores increased over the two-year period. The Evidence-Based Reading and Writing (EBRW) score went from 492 in 2016 to 503 in 2017, and the math score increased from 477 in 2016 to 481 in 2017.
- Just over half of $11^{\text {th }}$ grade test takers met the college readiness benchmark for EBRW, and just under a third met the benchmark for Math in both years.


Over one-third of all students taking the SAT to achieve concordance were successful:

- $36 \%$ of $11^{\text {th }}$ graders in 2016
- $44 \%$ of $11^{\text {th }}$ graders in 2017
- 33\% of $12^{\text {th }}$ graders in 2017
