

Policy 6313

Research and Program Evaluation Studies

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Overview

- The purpose is to update the policy to establish the requirements for conducting research in District schools
- A review of federal and state laws, research ethics, and policies from other large school districts was conducted to create this policy
- Proposed revision to Policy 6313 defines a two-step process:
 - 1. Institutional Review Board (IRB) review, examines the ethical and legal requirements for conducting research, and
 - 2. Research Review ensures compatibility of the research with a public school setting and value to the District.



Policy Alignment

IRB and Research Review Process

- IRB Review, ensures the ethical and legal protection of research participants through the District's IRB that is registered with The United States Department of Health and Human Services
- Research Review, determines if proposed research is compatible in a public school setting, research questions that are of value to the District, and the benefits of participation outweigh the impact on students, staff, and school resources



Policy Highlights

- Establishes research standards that align with the District's goals and objectives
- Applies to any research or program evaluation studies that alter the daily activities of students, staff, or schools
- Requires informed consent from all participants




Policy Highlights

- Exceeds Common Rule guidelines to further protect students and families by requiring active parent consent and student assent for participating students
- Includes continuing review to ensure compliance
- Requires submission of reports and findings for distribution to applicable District stakeholders at project completion
