Middle School Promotion

2. Promotion from 6th to 7th and 7th to 8th Grades
 - a. A student must pass a minimum of four, year-long courses or the equivalent, two of which must be in English, Mathematics, Science, or Social Studies.
3. Promotion from 8th to 9th Grade
 - b. In order for a student to be promoted to high school from a school that includes middle grades, 6, 7, and 8, the student must successfully complete three courses in English, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies including Civics.



“SB” Grade

- Silver Seal of Biliteracy (SB)
 - Only standardized assessment eligibility criteria is used
 - Awards up to four credits
 - Does not impact GPAs
 - Special designation on transcript
- BCPS provides a free AP, IB, & AICE exam upon course completion
- All other assessments must be purchased by the student
 - Fee waivers are available for some assessments (e.g., SAT II)

“T” Grades

- Credit Acceleration Program (CAP)
 - AP Level 3
 - EOC Level 3
 - CLEP 50
- AP & CLEP award both “T” and “SB” credits and grades
 - Apply “T” to the first credit
 - Apply “SB” to any additional credits
- Does not impact GPAs
