	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An open, noticed School Board Meeting to approve an annual instructional materials plan to identify any instructional materials that will be purchased through the District’s instructional materials review process (March 20, 2018). <p>If necessary, a second Public Hearing, chaired by a Hearing Officer, to address any formal objections returned to the District regarding the adoption of these instructional materials shall be held at least 30 days following approval by the Board (no sooner than April 20, 2018).</p>
