EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Bid Recommendation for Bid Renewal 15-106C – Storm Sewer & Sewer Main Cleaning and Repair

The current Invitation to Bid (ITB) 15-106C – Storm Sewer & Sewer Main Cleaning and Repair was approved on May 19, 2015, with an initial three (3) year contract that will expire on June 17, 2018, plus two (2) one (1) year renewals. ITB 15-106C was originally awarded a spending authority of \$750,000.

This request is to exercise the first option-to-renew for one (1) additional year, from June 18, 2018 through June 17, 2019. Current spend to-date is \$290,287 for thirty-four (34) months, which translates to an average monthly expenditure for this contract of \$8,538, or \$102,454 for a twelve (12) month period. Currently, the total unused authorized and available spending is \$459,713. As such, no additional spending authority is required for this renewal. Bench mark was performed with Broward college contracts and found pricing within acceptable range and determined that it is the best interest of the District to renew existing contract.

The intent of this contract is to provide cleaning and video inspections of gravity sewer mains throughout Broward County. Sewer line cleaning will remove sand, silt, dirt, roots, rages, and grease along with other materials from sewer lines. The cleanings will restore these lines to ninety-fuve (95) percent of its original vertical height of the pipe. Debris within these lines will be removed from downstream manholes using a vacuum extraction unit. Chemical grouting/sealing will be utilized to eliminate possible inflow/infiltration sources within sewer lines by means of injection. Line segments which are grouted will be air tested and video recorded. Evaluating sewer conditions depends extensively on cleanliness of sewer lines. Awardee will be responsible for sewer repairs due to his/her negligence operations. Such repairs will be considered a part of the work and no additional compensation will be granted. All damages shall be repaired in accordance with District specifications. Material disposal will be measured in actual cubic yards, removed and disposed in accordance with District requirements and specifications.

Video inspections will determine successful completions and satisfaction to the District. If the video inspections reveals unsatisfactory cleaning, the lines shall be re-cleaned at no cost to the District. Inspection reports will be submitted in hardcopy and electronic data format on a weekly basis. Awardees will be required to begin work within two (2) hours of notification on an emergency call out.

This one (1) year renewal will be utilized by Environmental Health & Safety to ensure continuity of the required services from the awarded vendors.
