Recommendation of \$500,000 or Less - 19-021V - Student Psychiatric Services

REQUESTED ACTION:
Approve the recommendation to award the above Request for Proposal (RFP). Contract Term: July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019, 1 Year; User Department: Exceptional Student Learning Support; Award Amount: \$200,000; Awarded Vendor(s): Nyrma N. Ortiz, P.A.; Small/Minority/Women Business Enterprise Vendor(s): None.

SUMMARY EXPLANATION AND BACKGROUND:
The School Board of Broward County, Florida, received one (1) proposal in response to RFP 19-021V - Student Psychiatric Services. This RFP provides psychiatric services to students at Whispering Pines Center and Cross Creek School to serve students with emotional and behavioral disabilities as part of a therapeutic program.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY
Recommendation of \$500,000 or Less
19-021V – Student Psychiatric Services

A recent Surgeon General’s report noted that many young people with emotional and behavioral needs are not accurately assessed and treated. Recent data published by the Center for Disease Control shows an increased prevalence of developmental conditions in children today. About one-quarter of children in the United States have a diagnosable psychiatric disorder, such as autism, depression, or bipolar disorder; however, only about twenty (20) percent receive evaluation and treatment by medical professionals, and only a fraction are evaluated by one (1) of the country’s approximately 8,300 child and adolescent psychiatrists. Child and adolescent psychiatrists have the opportunity to treat children in the context of their families, schools, and communities.

In Broward County Schools, psychiatric services are provided at Whispering Pines and Cross Creek schools to serve students with Emotional Behavioral Disabilities (EBD) as part of a therapeutic program identified on their Individual Educational Plan. Students identified as needing extensive therapeutic support receive services to include, but not limited to, individual and group therapy, family therapy, specialized groups, crisis management and intervention, on-going situational support, and medication management. The services of a licensed child psychiatrist can be provided at the EBD separate day schools rather than more costly residential and private school placements.

The District’s model of service is unique in utilizing the expertise of a trained medical doctor to identify and treat students with severe psychiatric, emotional, and behavioral concerns. This model offers the on-site consultation by a team of clinicians composed of mental health therapists and nurses, led by an experienced medical doctor.

This type of service (solicitation) has been released on Demandstar many times throughout the years, but Procurement & Warehousing Services Department (PWS) received only one (1) bid from Dr. Nyrma Ortiz.

PWS released, on Demandstar, a Request for Information (RFI) for student psychiatric services on August 28, 2017, to see if there are any new bidders for this type of service. The following companies responded to the RFI placed on Demandstar but did not submit a proposal.

Alliance Counseling and Education Services, Inc.	(Unable to provide a Psychiatrist)
Cobb Pediatric Therapy	(Thought this was for Psychology Services)
FCS, Inc.	(Psychiatric Recruitment only)
Invo/Progressus Therapy	(Unable to provide Psychiatric Services at this time)
Speech Rehab Services	(Unable to provide Psychiatric Services at this time)
Wasatch Contracting Services	(Recruitment Services only)

Dr. Nyrma Ortiz, PA, is an experienced physician who has worked with the EBD population in the District for over seventeen (17) years. She has successfully passed her board certification in general adult psychiatry, as required by the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology, as well as the additional board certification in Child Adolescent Psychiatry. Dr. Nyrma Ortiz is part of an exclusive, small number of psychiatrists that are board certified in both psychiatry and child/adolescent psychiatry. Dr. Nyrma Ortiz would like to continue providing these needed services under the existing RFP, and the District’s Exceptional Student Learning Support (ESLS) Department would like to continue its partnership with Dr. Nyrma Ortiz.

The demand for child and adolescent psychiatrists outweighs the supply nationally and locally. Miami-Dade County Public Schools did have a student psychiatric contract, but it is no longer available on their website to compare current costs. Palm Beach County Schools’ contract with Dr. Cleopatra Ortiz has a cost of \$185 per hour, and they only received one proposal. Palm Beach Schools is having the same issue in bidding and only received one (1) proposal. The District’s cost for this service is \$190/hour and is in the competitive range for this service. The cost of malpractice insurance has risen nationally at a cost from \$10,696 up to \$22,509 annually depending on the specialty.

Recommendation of \$500,000 or Less
19-021V – Student Psychiatric Services
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Dr. Ortiz has stated that she does not take vacations or time-off during the time school is in session. She has not taken any time off for illness, or personal family leaves to date. Dr. Ortiz stated that she would take her vacation when the school district is closed (holidays). In order to provide coverage in case of an illness or unexpected leave, there are private agencies or locum tenens that provide coverage to private practices, hospitals, and institutions. They are professional healthcare staffing companies. Dr. Ortiz is in contact with Barton Associates, a healthcare professional staffing company that is a job board for physicians.

Dr. Ortiz's workload: Dr. Ortiz conducts a psychiatric evaluation for each student as part of the referral process (school and Multi-agency Network for Students with Emotional/Behavioral Disabilities referrals). She has conducted evaluations on approximately one hundred and fifty (150) students between Whispering Pines and Cross Creek schools for 2017/2018 fiscal school year. This sometimes includes observing a student at the referring school. When determined there is a need as part of a student's re-evaluation plan, Dr. Ortiz also conducts a psychiatric evaluation for students currently attending Whispering Pines Center and Cross Creek.

There is an average of three hundred (300) students enrolled in Whispering Pines and Cross Creek schools (approximately one hundred and fifty (150) at each). Dr. Ortiz provides services to these students in the following manner:

- Direct services as needed, observing and evaluating a student in crisis;
- Holds individual and group consultation/supervision with therapist to discuss all students, regularly scheduled and as needed;
- Collaborates with the school nurse, the student's community psychiatrist, and other doctors and families regarding psychotropic medication and other issues;
- Participates in child study meetings to plan for students such as when students are being mainstreamed back to a less restrictive environment.

The ESLS department has implemented numerous effective supports and services over the years to promote student success in the least restrictive environment which has led to the reduction of students in need of the EBD separate day schools.

Financial Impact

(*)Recommend an additional spending authority of \$200,000 to cover the new contract period. In light of the recent focus on student mental health needs; there will likely be an increase in the number of hours of psychiatric services provided.

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into as of this 8th day of May, 2018, by and between

WHEREAS, SBBC issued a Request for Proposal as RFP 19-021V – Student Psychiatric Services (hereinafter referred to as "RFP"), dated November 17, 2017; which is incorporated by reference herein, for the purpose of receiving proposals for Student Psychiatric Services; and

WHEREAS, VENDOR offered a proposal dated January 8, 2018 (hereinafter referred to as "Proposal") which is incorporated by reference herein, in response to this RFP; and

WHEREAS, SBBC is desirous of obtaining, by VENDOR, psychiatric and therapeutic services to students that are emotionally/behaviorally disabled as identified on their Individual Educational Plans (IEPs).

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of the mutual covenants contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1 – RECITALS

1.01 **Recitals.** The parties agree that the foregoing recitals are true and correct and that such recitals are incorporated herein by reference.

ARTICLE 2 – SPECIAL CONDITIONS

2.01 **Term of Agreement.** Unless terminated earlier pursuant to Section 3.05 of this Agreement, the term of this Agreement shall commence on **July 1, 2018** and conclude on **June 30, 2019**. The term of the Agreement may, by mutual agreement between SBBC and VENDOR be extended for two additional one-year periods and, if needed, 180 days beyond the expiration date of the renewal period. SBBC's Procurement & Warehousing Services Department, will, if considering renewing, request a letter consenting to renewal from VENDOR, prior to the end of the term. Any renewal period shall be approved by an Amendment to this Agreement executed by both parties.

2.02 **Priority of Documents.** In the event of a conflict between documents, the following priority of documents shall govern:

- First: This Agreement, then;
- Second: RFP 19-021V – Student Psychiatric Services
- Third: Proposal submitted in response to RFP 19-021V by VENDOR

2.03 **Scope of Services.** VENDOR shall provide to SBBC the Scope of Services as described in **Attachment A** pursuant to the terms of this Agreement.

2.04 **Cost of Services.** SBBC shall pay VENDOR an hourly rate of \$190 per hour for services performed pursuant to the terms of this Agreement.

2.05 **SBBC Disclosure of Educational Records.**

- (a) SBBC will provide the types of education records listed in 2.03 (b), pursuant to parental consent as listed in 2.03 (c), for the purpose of VENDOR performing her responsibilities as listed in this Agreement.
- (b) SBBC will provide VENDOR with academic records, attendance records, and any additional records of the students VENDOR serves, as long as the records are limited to the types of information VENDOR needs as related to the services VENDOR provides pursuant to this Agreement.
- (c) SBBC will obtain consent from each student’s parent/guardian or student age 18 or older prior to disclosing education records to VENDOR. Consent form shall list the types of educational records to be disclosed, purpose(s) and recipient.

2.06 **VENDOR Confidentially of Educational Records.**

- (a) Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary within this Agreement, VENDOR shall:
 - 1) fully comply with the requirements of Sections 1002.22, 1002.221, and 1002.222, Florida Statutes; the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, 20 U.S.C § 1232g (FERPA) and its implementing regulations (34 C.F.R. Part 99), and any other state or federal law or regulation regarding the confidentiality of student information and records;
 - 2) hold any education records in strict confidence and not use or re-disclose same except as required by this Agreement or as required or permitted by law unless the parent of each student or a student age 18 or older whose education records are to be shared provides prior written consent for their release;
 - 3) ensure that, at all times, all of its employees who have access to any education records during the term of their employment shall abide strictly by its obligations under this Agreement, and that access to education records is limited only to its employees that require the information to carry out the

responsibilities under this Agreement and shall provide said list of employees to SBBC upon request;

- 4) safeguard each education record through administrative, physical and technological standards to ensure that adequate controls are in place to protect the education records and information in accordance with FERPA's privacy requirements;
 - 5) utilize the education records solely for the purposes of providing products and services as contemplated under this Agreement; and shall not share, publish, sell, distribute, target advertise, or display education records to any third party;
 - 6) notify SBBC immediately upon discovery of a breach of confidentiality of education records by telephone at 754-321-0300 (Manager, Information Security), and 754-321-1900 (Privacy Officer), and email at privacy@browardschools.com; and take all necessary notification steps as may be required by federal and Florida law, including, but not limited to, those required by Section 501.171, Florida Statutes;
 - 7) fully cooperate with appropriate SBBC staff, including Privacy Officer and/or Information Technology staff to resolve any privacy investigations and concerns in a timely manner;
 - 8) prepare and distribute, at its own cost, any and all required breach notifications, under federal and Florida Law, or reimburse SBBC any direct costs incurred by SBBC for doing so, including, but not limited to, those required by Section 501.171, Florida Statutes;
 - 9) be responsible for any fines or penalties for failure to meet breach notice requirements pursuant to federal and/or Florida law;
 - 10) provide SBBC with the name and contact information of its employee who shall serve as SBBC's primary security contact and shall be available to assist SBBC in resolving obligations associated with a security breach of confidentiality of education records; and
 - 11) securely erase education records from any media once that media equipment is no longer in use or is to be disposed; secure erasure will be deemed the deletion of the education records using a single pass overwrite Secure Erase (Windows) or Wipe (Unix).
- (b) All education records shall remain the property of SBBC, and any party contracting with SBBC serves solely as custodian of such information pursuant to this Agreement and claims no ownership or property rights thereto and, upon termination of this Agreement shall, at SBBC's request, return to SBBC or dispose of the education records in compliance with the applicable Florida Retention Schedules and provide SBBC with a written acknowledgment of said disposition.

- (c) VENDOR shall, for itself, its officers, employees, agents, representatives, contractors or subcontractors, to fully indemnify and hold harmless SBBC and its officers and employees for any violation of this section, including, without limitation, defending SBBC and its officers and employees against any complaint, administrative or judicial proceeding, payment of any penalty imposed upon SBBC, or payment of any and all costs, damages, judgments or losses incurred by or imposed upon SBBC arising out of a breach of this covenant by the party, or an officer, employee, agent, representative, contractor, or sub-contractor of the party to the extent that the party or an officer, employee, agent, representative, contractor, or sub-contractor of the party shall either intentionally or negligently violate the provisions of this section or of Sections 1002.22 and/or 1002.221, Florida Statutes. This section shall survive the termination of all performance required or conclusion of all obligations existing under this Agreement.

2.07 **HIPAA Compliance.** VENDOR agrees to adhere to all applicable HIPAA guidelines as they relate to SBBC students and to enter into a Business Associate Agreement with SBBC regarding HIPAA rules, regulations and procedures. Because VENDOR may access, use and disclose HIPAA-covered information from SBBC, SBBC is considered the “Covered Entity” and VENDOR is considered the “Business Associate” in the HIPAA agreement. A copy of the HIPAA agreement (Business Associate Agreement) is attached and incorporated into this Agreement as **Attachment B**.

2.08 **Scope of Services.** VENDOR agrees to provide SBBC with the Scope of Services as described in **Attachment A**. SBBC shall pay VENDOR an hourly rate of \$190 per hour for services performed pursuant to the terms of this Agreement.

2.09 **Inspection of VENDOR’s Records by SBBC.** VENDOR shall establish and maintain books, records and documents (including electronic storage media) sufficient to reflect all income and expenditures of funds provided by SBBC under this Agreement. All VENDOR’s applicable records, regardless of the form in which they are kept, shall be open to inspection and subject to audit, inspection, examination, evaluation and/or reproduction, during normal working hours, by SBBC’s agent or its authorized representative to permit SBBC to evaluate, analyze and verify the satisfactory performance of the terms and conditions of this Agreement and to evaluate, analyze and verify the applicable business records of VENDOR directly relating to this Agreement in order to verify the accuracy of invoices provided to SBBC. Such audit shall be no more than one (1) time per calendar year.

(a) **Duration of Right to Inspect.** For the purpose of such audits, inspections, examinations, evaluations and/or reproductions, SBBC’s agent or authorized representative shall have access to VENDOR’s records from the effective date of this Agreement, for the duration of the term of this Agreement, and until the later of five (5) years after the termination of this Agreement or five (5) years after the date of final payment by SBBC to VENDOR pursuant to this Agreement.

(b) **Notice of Inspection.** SBBC’s agent or its authorized representative shall provide VENDOR reasonable advance written notice (not to exceed two (2) weeks) of any intended audit, inspection, examination, evaluation and or reproduction.

(c) Audit Site Conditions. SBBC's agent or its authorized representative shall have access to VENDOR's facilities and to any and all records related to this Agreement, and shall be provided adequate and appropriate work space in order to exercise the rights permitted under this section.

(d) Failure to Permit Inspection. Failure by VENDOR to permit audit, inspection, examination, evaluation and/or reproduction as permitted under this section shall constitute grounds for termination of this Agreement by SBBC for cause and shall be grounds for SBBC's denial of some or all of any VENDOR's claims for payment.

(e) Overcharges and Unauthorized Charges. If an audit conducted in accordance with this section discloses overcharges or unauthorized charges to SBBC by VENDOR in excess of two percent (2%) of the total billings under this Agreement, the actual cost of SBBC's audit shall be paid by VENDOR. If the audit discloses billings or charges to which VENDOR is not contractually entitled, VENDOR shall pay said sum to SBBC within twenty (20) days of receipt of written demand unless otherwise agreed to in writing by both parties.

(f) Inspection of Subcontractor's Records. If applicable, VENDOR shall require any and all subcontractors, insurance agents and material suppliers (hereafter referred to as "Payees") providing services or goods with regard to this Agreement to comply with the requirements of this section by insertion of such requirements in any written subcontract. Failure by VENDOR to include such requirements in any subcontract shall constitute grounds for termination of this Agreement by SBBC for cause and shall be grounds for the exclusion of some or all of any Payees' costs from amounts payable by SBBC to VENDOR pursuant to this Agreement and such excluded costs shall become the liability of VENDOR.

(g) Inspector General Audits. VENDOR shall comply and cooperate immediately with any inspections, reviews, investigations, or audits deemed necessary by the Florida Office of the Inspector General or by any other state or federal officials.

2.10 Notice: When any of the parties desire to give notice to the other, such notice must be in writing, sent by U.S. Mail, postage prepaid, addressed to the party for whom it is intended at the place last specified; the place for giving notice shall remain such until it is changed by written notice in compliance with the provisions of this paragraph. For the present, the Parties designate the following as the respective places for giving notice:

2.11 **Background Screening.** VENDOR agrees to comply with all requirements of Sections 1012.32 and 1012.465, Florida Statutes, and all of its personnel who (1) are to be permitted access to school grounds when students are present, (2) will have direct contact with students, or (3) have access or control of school funds, will successfully complete the background screening required by the referenced statutes and meet the standards established by the statutes. This background screening will be conducted by SBBC in advance of the VENDOR or its personnel providing any services under the conditions described in the previous sentence. VENDOR shall bear the cost of acquiring the background screening required by Section 1012.32, Florida Statutes, and any fee imposed by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement to maintain the fingerprints provided with respect to the VENDOR and its personnel. The parties agree that the failure of VENDOR to perform any of the duties described in this section shall constitute a material breach of this Agreement entitling SBBC to terminate immediately with no further responsibilities or duties to perform under this Agreement. VENDOR agrees to indemnify and hold harmless SBBC, its officers and employees from any liability in the form of physical or mental injury, death or property damage resulting from VENDOR'S failure to comply with the requirements of this Section or with Sections 1012.32 and 1012.465, Florida Statutes.

2.12 **Insurance Requirements.** VENDOR shall comply with the following insurance requirements throughout the term of this Agreement.

- (a) **General Liability.** Limits not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence for Bodily Injury/ Property Damage; \$1,000,000 General Aggregate. Limits not less than \$1,000,000 for Products/Completed Operations Aggregate. Indicate on certificate, "All policies are primary of all other valid and collectable coverage maintained by The School Board of Broward County, Florida" and "Certificate holder is named as an additional insured" in the description box on General Liability certificate.
- (b) **Professional Liability/Errors & Omissions.** Limit not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence covering services provided under this Agreement.
- (c) **Medical Malpractice Liability:** Limits not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence covering services provided under this Agreement.
- (d) **Workers' Compensation.** Florida Statutory limits in accordance with Chapter 440; Employer's Liability limits not less than \$100,000/\$100,000/\$500,000 (each accident/disease-each employee/disease-policy limit).
- (e) **Auto Liability.** Owned, Non-Owned and Hired Auto Liability with Bodily Injury and Property Damage limits of not less than \$1,000,000 Combined Single Limit.

If VENDOR does not own any vehicles, hired and non-owned automobile liability coverage in the amount of \$1,000,000 shall be accepted. In addition, an affidavit signed by the VENDOR must be furnished to SBBC indicating the following:

Nyrma N Ortiz, P.A. does not own any vehicles. In the event insured acquires any vehicles throughout the term of this agreement, insured agrees to provide proof of "Any Auto" coverage effective the date of acquisition.

- (f) Acceptability of Insurance Carriers. The insurance policies shall be issued by companies qualified to do business in the State of Florida. The insurance companies must be rated at least A- VI by AM Best or Aa3 by Moody's Investor Service.
- (g) Verification of Coverage. Proof of Insurance must be furnished within 15 days of execution of this Agreement. To streamline this process, SBBC has partnered with EXIGIS RiskWorks to collect and verify insurance documentation. All certificates (and any required documents) must be received and approved by SBBC before any work commences to permit VENDOR time to remedy any deficiencies. EXIGIS RiskWorks will send an email notification within three (3) business days after receipt of the award letter.
- New VENDOR will receive an email notification requesting account verification and insurance agent information.
 - Existing VENDOR will receive an email notification of current status.
- (h) Required Conditions. Liability policies must contain the following provisions. In addition, the following wording must be included on the Certificate of Insurance:
1. The School Board of Broward County, Florida, its members, officers, employees and agents are added as additional insured.
 2. All liability policies are primary of all other valid and collectable coverage maintained by the School Board of Broward County, Florida.
 3. Certificate Holder: The School Board of Broward County, Florida, c/o EXIGIS Risk Management Services, P. O. Box 4668-ECM, New York, New York 10163-4668
- (i) Cancellation of Insurance. VENDOR is prohibited from providing services under this Agreement with SBBC without the minimum required insurance coverage and must notify SBBC within two business days if required insurance is cancelled.
- (j) The School Board of Broward County, Florida reserves the right to review, reject or accept any required policies of insurance, including limits, coverage's or endorsements, herein throughout the term of this Agreement.

2.13 **Nondiscrimination.**

(a) As a condition of entering into this Agreement, VENDOR represents and warrants that it will comply with the SBBC's Commercial Nondiscrimination Policy, as described under, Section D.1 of SBBC's Policy No. 3330 – Supplier Diversity Outreach Program.

(b) As part of such compliance, VENDOR shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, religion, ancestry or national origin, sex, age, marital status, sexual orientation, or on the basis of disability or other unlawful forms of discrimination in the solicitation, selection, hiring, or commercial treatment of subcontractors, vendors, suppliers, or commercial customers, nor shall VENDOR retaliate against any person for reporting instances of such discrimination. VENDOR shall provide equal opportunity for subcontractors, vendors, and suppliers to participate in all of its public sector and private sector subcontracting and supply opportunities, provided that nothing contained in this clause shall prohibit or limit otherwise lawful efforts to remedy the effects of marketplace discrimination that have occurred or are occurring in the SBBC's relevant marketplace. VENDOR understands and agrees that a material violation of this clause shall be considered a material breach of this Agreement and may result in termination of this Agreement, disqualification of the company from participating in SBBC Agreements, or other sanctions. This clause is not enforceable by or for the benefit of, and creates no obligation to, any third party.

ARTICLE 3 – GENERAL CONDITIONS

3.01 **No Waiver of Sovereign Immunity.** Nothing herein is intended to serve as a waiver of sovereign immunity by any agency or political subdivision to which sovereign immunity may be applicable or of any rights or limits to liability existing under Section 768.28, Florida Statutes. This section shall survive the termination of all performance or obligations under this Agreement and shall be fully binding until such time as any proceeding brought on account of this Agreement is barred by any applicable statute of limitations.

3.02 **No Third Party Beneficiaries.** The parties expressly acknowledge that it is not their intent to create or confer any rights or obligations in or upon any third person or entity under this Agreement. None of the parties intend to directly or substantially benefit a third party by this Agreement. The parties agree that there are no third party beneficiaries to this Agreement and that no third party shall be entitled to assert a claim against any of the parties based upon this Agreement. Nothing herein shall be construed as consent by an agency or political subdivision of the State of Florida to be sued by third parties in any matter arising out of any Agreement.

3.03 **Independent Contractor.** The parties to this agreement shall at all times be acting in the capacity of independent contractors and not as an officer, employee or agent of one another. Neither party or its respective agents, employees, subcontractors or assignees shall represent to others that it has the authority to bind the other party unless specifically authorized in writing to do so. No right to SBBC retirement, leave benefits or any other benefits of SBBC employees shall exist as a result of the performance of any duties or responsibilities under this Agreement. SBBC shall not be responsible for social security, withholding taxes, and contributions to unemployment compensation funds or insurance for the other party or the other party's officers, employees, agents, subcontractors or assignees.

3.04 **Equal Opportunity Provision.** The parties agree that no person shall be subjected to discrimination because of age, race, color, disability, gender identity, gender expression marital status, national origin, religion, sex or sexual orientation in the performance of the parties' respective duties, responsibilities and obligations under this Agreement.

3.05 **Termination.** This Agreement may be canceled with or without cause by SBBC during the term hereof upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other parties of its desire to terminate this Agreement. In the event of such termination, SBBC shall be entitled to a *pro rata* refund of any pre-paid amounts for any services scheduled to be delivered after the effective date of such termination. SBBC shall have no liability for any property left on SBBC's property by any party to this Agreement after the termination of this Agreement. Any party contracting with SBBC under this Agreement agrees that any of its property placed upon SBBC's facilities pursuant to this Agreement shall be removed within ten (10) business days following the termination, conclusion or cancellation of this Agreement and that any such property remaining upon SBBC's facilities after that time shall be deemed to be abandoned, title to such property shall pass to SBBC, and SBBC may use or dispose of such property as SBBC deems fit and appropriate.

3.06 **Default.** The parties agree that, in the event that either party is in default of its obligations under this Agreement, the non-defaulting party shall provide to the defaulting party (30) days written notice to cure the default. However, in the event said default cannot be cured within said thirty (30) day period and the defaulting party is diligently attempting in good faith to cure same, the time period shall be reasonably extended to allow the defaulting party additional cure time. Upon the occurrence of a default that is not cured during the applicable cure period, this Agreement may be terminated by the non-defaulting party upon thirty (30) days' notice. This remedy is not intended to be exclusive of any other remedy, and each and every such remedy shall be cumulative and shall be in addition to every other remedy now or hereafter existing at law or in equity or by statute or otherwise. No single or partial exercise by any party of any right, power, or remedy hereunder shall preclude any other or future exercise thereof. Nothing in this section shall be construed to preclude termination for convenience pursuant to Section 3.05.

3.07 **Annual Appropriation.** The performance and obligations of SBBC under this Agreement shall be contingent upon an annual budgetary appropriation by its governing body. If SBBC does not allocate funds for the payment of services or products to be provided under this Agreement, this Agreement may be terminated by SBBC at the end of the period for which funds have been allocated. SBBC shall notify the other party at the earliest possible time before such termination. No penalty shall accrue to SBBC in the event this provision is exercised, and SBBC shall not be obligated or liable for any future payments due or any damages as a result of termination under this section.

3.08 **Excess Funds.** Any party receiving funds paid by SBBC under this Agreement agrees to promptly notify SBBC of any funds erroneously received from SBBC upon the discovery of such erroneous payment or overpayment. Any such excess funds shall be refunded to SBBC.

3.09 **Public Records:** The following provisions are required by Section 119.0701, Florida Statutes, and may not be amended. VENDOR shall keep and maintain public records required by SBBC to perform the services required under this Agreement. Upon request from SBBC's custodian of public records, VENDOR shall provide SBBC with a copy of any requested public records or to allow the requested public records to be inspected or copied within a

reasonable time at a cost that does not exceed the cost provided in Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, or as otherwise provided by law. VENDOR shall ensure that public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of the Agreement's term and following completion of the Agreement if VENDOR does not transfer the public records to SBBC. Upon completion of the Agreement, VENDOR shall transfer, at no cost, to SBBC all public records in possession of VENDOR or keep and maintain public records required by SBBC to perform the services required under the Agreement. If VENDOR transfer all public records to SBBC upon completion of the Agreement, VENDOR shall destroy any duplicate public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements. If VENDOR keeps and maintains public records upon completion of the Agreement, Insert Name shall meet all applicable requirements for retaining public records. All records stored electronically must be provided to SBBC, upon request from SBBC's custodian of public records, in a format that is compatible with SBBC's information technology systems.

IF A PARTY TO THIS AGREEMENT HAS QUESTIONS REGARDING THE APPLICATION OF CHAPTER 119, FLORIDA STATUTES, TO ITS DUTY TO PROVIDE PUBLIC RECORDS RELATING TO THE AGREEMENT, CONTACT THE CUSTODIAN OF PUBLIC RECORDS AT 754-321-1900, REQUEL.BELL@BROWARDSCHOOLS.COM, RISK MANAGEMENT DEPARTMENT, PUBLIC RECORDS DIVISION, 600 SOUTHEAST THIRD AVENUE, FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA 33301.

3.10 **Compliance with Laws.** Each party shall comply with all applicable federal state and local laws, SBBC policies codes, rules and regulations in performing its duties, responsibilities and obligations pursuant to this Agreement.

3.11 **Place of Performance.** All obligations of SBBC under the terms of this Agreement are reasonably susceptible of being performed in Broward County, Florida and shall be payable and performable in Broward County, Florida.

3.12 **Governing Law and Venue.** This Agreement shall be interpreted and construed in accordance with and governed by the laws of the State of Florida. Any controversies or legal problems arising out of this Agreement and any action involving the enforcement or interpretation of any rights hereunder shall be submitted exclusively to the jurisdiction of the State courts of the Seventeenth Judicial Circuit of Broward County, Florida or to the jurisdiction of the United States District Court for the Southern District of Florida. Each party agrees and admits that the state courts of the Seventeenth Judicial Circuit of Broward County, Florida or the United States District Court for the Southern District of Florida shall have jurisdiction over it for any dispute arising under this Agreement.

3.13 **Entirety of Agreement.** This document incorporates and includes all prior negotiations, correspondence, conversations, agreements and understandings applicable to the matters contained herein and the parties agree that there are no commitments, agreements or understandings concerning the subject matter of this Agreement that are not contained in this document. Accordingly, the parties agree that no deviation from the terms hereof shall be predicated upon any prior representations or agreements, whether oral or written.

3.14 **Binding Effect.** This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns.

3.15 **Assignment.** Neither this Agreement nor any interest herein may be assigned, transferred or encumbered by any party without the prior written consent of the other party. There shall be no partial assignments of this Agreement including, without limitation, the partial assignment of any right to receive payments from SBBC.

3.16 **Incorporation by Reference.** **Attachments A and B** are attached hereto and referenced herein shall be deemed to be incorporated into this Agreement by reference.

3.17 **Captions.** The captions, section designations, section numbers, article numbers, titles and headings appearing in this Agreement are inserted only as a matter of convenience, have no substantive meaning, and in no way define, limit, construe or describe the scope or intent of such articles or sections of this Agreement, nor in any way affect this Agreement and shall not be construed to create a conflict with the provisions of this Agreement.

3.18 **Severability.** In the event that any one or more of the sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses or provisions contained in this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, illegal, unlawful, unenforceable or void in any respect, such shall not affect the remaining portions of this Agreement and the same shall remain in full force and affect as if such invalid, illegal, unlawful, unenforceable or void sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses or provisions had never been included herein.

3.19 **Preparation of Agreement.** The parties acknowledge that they have sought and obtained whatever competent advice and counsel as was necessary for them to form a full and complete understanding of all rights and obligations herein and that the preparation of this Agreement has been their joint effort. The language agreed to herein expresses their mutual intent and the resulting document shall not, solely as a matter of judicial construction, be construed more severely against one of the parties than the other.

3.20 **Amendments.** No modification, amendment, or alteration in the terms or conditions contained herein shall be effective unless contained in a written document prepared with the same or similar formality as this Agreement and executed by each party hereto.

3.21 **Waiver.** The parties agree that each requirement, duty and obligation set forth herein is substantial and important to the formation of this Agreement and, therefore, is a material term hereof. Any party's failure to enforce any provision of this Agreement shall not be deemed a waiver of such provision or modification of this Agreement unless the waiver is in writing and signed by the party waiving such provision. A written waiver shall only be effective as to the specific instance for which it is obtained and shall not be deemed a continuing or future waiver.

3.22 **Force Majeure.** Neither party shall be obligated to perform any duty, requirement or obligation under this Agreement if such performance is prevented by fire, hurricane, earthquake, explosion, wars, sabotage, accident, flood, acts of God, strikes, or other labor disputes, riot or civil commotions, or by reason of any other matter or condition beyond the control of either party, and which cannot be overcome by reasonable diligence and without unusual expense ("Force Majeure"). In no event shall a lack of funds on the part of either party be deemed Force Majeure.

3.23 **Survival.** All representations and warranties made herein, indemnification obligations, obligations to reimburse SBBC, obligations to maintain and allow inspection and audit of records and property, obligations to maintain the confidentiality of records, reporting requirements, and obligations to return public funds shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

3.24 **Agreement Administration.** SBBC has delegated authority to the Superintendent of Schools or his/her designee to take any actions necessary to implement and administer this Agreement.

3.25 **Counterparts and Multiple Originals.** This Agreement may be executed in multiple originals, and may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original, but all of which, taken together, shall constitute one and the same Agreement.

3.26 **Liability.** This section shall survive the termination of all performance or obligations under this Agreement and shall be fully binding until such time as any proceeding brought on account of this Agreement is barred by any applicable statute of limitations.

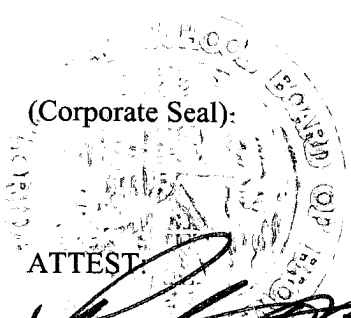

3.27 **Authority.** Each person signing this Agreement on behalf of either party individually warrants that he or she has full legal power to execute this Agreement on behalf of the party for whom he or she is signing, and to bind and obligate such party with respect to all provisions contained in this Agreement.

STATEMENT OF WORK/SCOPE OF SERVICES

1. VENDOR shall provide psychiatric assessments, treatment plans, and therapy for students and their families.
2. VENDOR shall provide clinical oversight, evaluation and responsibility for the treatment services.
3. VENDOR shall review medical assessments, prescriptions for medications and monitor medications.
4. VENDOR shall hold case consultations on individual students with clinical staff by meeting individually or in groups.
5. VENDOR shall provide crisis intervention and emergency clinical consultations (to include Baker Act evaluations, if necessary) on school days.
6. VENDOR shall attend a variety of regularly scheduled school meetings, including IEP meetings and weekly meetings as scheduled. VENDOR shall provide consultation and participation in case conference/team meetings.
7. VENDOR shall communicate with parents/guardians to maintain an update on the status of the child at school and learn how the student is functioning outside the school setting.
8. VENDOR shall provide collateral or direct therapy with students and parents (group and individual), as determined by the Center Psychiatrist and the Center Principal.
9. VENDOR shall maintain malpractice insurance for the term of the contract as stated in the RFP.
10. VENDOR shall provide written documentation, as appropriate, to meet community standards for service.
11. VENDOR shall provide input to the Center Principal on the skills of clinical personnel.
12. VENDOR shall serve as liaison with psychiatrists in the community.
13. VENDOR shall provide consultation services to other students in the School District as requested by the Center School Principal or the Director of ESLS or designee.
14. VENDOR shall be provided, by the Center Principal, the schedule for weekly service. Some evening hours may be required to accommodate counseling schedules with the families.

ATTACHMENT A

15. VENDOR shall develop a written plan for extended absences (including vacations) in collaboration and approval by the Center Principal. The plan must include coverage for the entire school year, including summers if students are in attendance. If coverage is not provided by another Center Psychiatrist, any substitute Psychiatrist must meet all requirements as set forth in this Agreement. VENDOR shall pay the substitute Psychiatrist directly for services performed during VENDOR's absence.
16. VENDOR shall provide written documentation of weekly services to include student names, date, duration of time and type of service provided, and submit this information with monthly invoice.

HIPPA BUSINESS ASSOCIATE AGREEMENT

This Business Associate Agreement (“*Agreement*”) is made and entered into as of this 8th day of May 2018 (the “*Effective Date*”), by and between

(hereinafter referred to as “*SBBC*” or “*Covered Entity*”),
a body corporate and political subdivision of the State of

(hereinafter referred to as “*Business Associate*”),
whose principal place of business is

WHEREAS, by virtue of some of the services that Business Associate performs for SBBC, Business Associate may be a “business associate”, as the term is defined at 45 C.F.R. §160.103; and

WHEREAS, SBBC and Business Associate may share Protected Health Information (“PHI”) (as defined below) in the course of their relationship; and

WHEREAS, SBBC and Business Associate understand that, with respect to coverage subject to regulation under the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (“HIPPA”), they are subject to the requirements governing business associates, including but not limited to the Privacy Rule and the Security Rule (both defined below) of HIPPA, the Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health Act of 2009 (“HITECH”), the Omnibus Rule of 2013, and the applicable Florida law, any of which may be amended from time to time or supplemented by new legislation or guidance (hereinafter collectively referred to as “Business Associate Requirements”).

WHEREAS, SBBC and Business Associate intend to fully comply with current and future Business Associate requirements and mutually desire to outline their individual responsibilities with respect to Protected Health Information (“PHI”) as mandated by the “Privacy Rule”, the “Security Rule”, and the HITECH Act; and

WHEREAS, SBBC and Business Associate understand and agree that the Business Associate requirements require SBBC and Business Associate to enter into a Business Associate Agreement which shall govern the use/or disclosure of PHI and the security of ePHI.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1 – RECITALS

1. **Definitions.** When used in this Agreement and capitalized, the following terms have the following meanings:

- (a) “**Breach**” has the same meaning as that term is defined in §13400 of the HITECH Act and shall include the unauthorized acquisition, access, use, or disclosure of PHI that compromises the security or privacy of such information.
- (b) “**Business Associate**” shall mean Business Associate named above and shall include all successors and assigns, affiliates, subsidiaries, and related companies.
- (c) “**Designed Record Set**” has the same meaning as the term “designated record set” in 45 CFR §164.501, which includes enrollment, payment, billing, claims adjudication and case or medical management record systems maintained by or a health plan, or other information used in whole or part by or for the Plan to make decisions about individuals.
- (d) “**EDI Rule**” shall mean the Standards for Electronic Transactions as set forth at 45 CFR Parts 160, Subpart A and 162 Subpart A and I through R.
- (e) “**HIPPA**” means Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996.
- (f) “**HITECH Act**” means the Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health Act of 2009.
- (g) “**Individual**” shall have the same meaning as the term “Individual” in 45 C.F.R. §160.103 and shall include a person who qualifies as a personal representative in accordance with 45 C.F.R. §164.502(g).
- (h) “**Minimum Necessary**” means the least amount of PHI needed to accomplish the intended purpose of the use or disclosure.
- (i) “**Omnibus Rule**” means the HIPPA Omnibus Rule of 2013.
- (j) “**Privacy Rule**” shall mean the Standards of Privacy of Individuals Identifiable Health Information as set forth at 45 C.F.R. Parts 160 and 164, subparts A and E.
- (k) “**Protected Health Information**” or “**PHI**” shall have the same meaning as the term “protected health information” in 45 C.F.R. §130.103 (as amended by the HITECH Act) limited to the information created or received by Business Associate from or on behalf of SBBC.
- (l) “**Required by Law**” shall have the same meaning as the term “required by law” in 45 C.F.R. §164.103.
- (m) “**Secretary**” shall mean the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services or his or her designee.
- (n) “**Security Rule**” shall mean the Standards for Security of ePHI as set forth 45 C.F.R. Parts 160 and 164 Subpart C.

- (o) “*Unsecured PHI*” shall mean PHI that is not secured through the use of a technology or methodology specified by the Secretary in guidance or as otherwise defined in §13402(h) of the HITECH Act.

Terms used but not defined in this Agreement shall have the same meaning as those terms in 45 C.F.R. §§ 164.103 and 164.501 and the HITECH Act.

ARTICLE 2 – SPECIAL CONDITIONS

2. Obligations and Activities of Business Associate Regarding PHI.

- (a) Business Associate agrees to not use or further disclose PHI other than as permitted or required by this Agreement or as Required by Law.
- (b) Business Associate agrees to comply with the “Minimum Necessary” rule when using, disclosing, or requesting PHI, except when a specific exception applies under HIPPA or HITECH Act.
- (c) Business Associate agrees to use appropriate safeguards and comply, where applicable, with the HIPPA Security Rule to prevent use or disclosure of the PHI other than as provided for by this Agreement.
- (d) Business Associate agrees to report to SBBC, as soon as reasonably practicable, any impermissible use or disclosure of PHI it becomes aware of, and any use or disclosure of PHI not provided for by this Agreement. Any report of breach should be substantially the same form as Exhibit A, hereto.
- (e) Business Associate shall promptly inform SBBC of a Breach of Unsecured PHI following the first day on which Business Associate knows of such Breach or following the first day on which Business Associate should have known of such Breach.
- (f) For the Breach of Unsecured PHI in its possession:
 - 1. Business Associate will perform a Risk Assessment to determine if there is a low probability that the PHI has been compromised. Business Associate will provide SBBC with documentation showing the results of the Risk Assessment. The Risk Assessment will consider at minimum the following factors:
 - a. The nature and extent of the PHI involved, including the types of identifiers and the likelihood of re-identification;
 - b. The unauthorized person who used the PHI or to whom the disclosure was made;
 - c. Whether the PHI was actually acquired or viewed; and
 - d. The extent to which the risk to the PHI has been mitigated.
 - 2. Business Associate will prepare and distribute, at its own cost, any and all required notifications under Federal and Florida law, or reimburse SBBC any direct costs incurred by SBBC for doing so.
 - 3. Business Associate shall be responsible for all fines or penalties incurred for failure to meet Breach notice requirements pursuant to by Federal and/or Florida law.

ATTACHMENT B

- (g) Business Associate agrees to ensure that, and obtain assurance from, any and all agents, including sub-contractors (excluding entities that are merely conduits), to whom it provides PHI agree to the same restrictions and conditions that apply to Business Associate with respect to such information. All agents and subcontractors engaged by the Business Associate that create, maintain, receive or transmit PHI must comply with the HIPPA Rules, including the rules to extend the requirements to the agent's or subcontractor's subcontractors.
- (h) Business Associate agrees to provide access, at the requires of SBBC, and in the time and manner designated by SBBC, to PHI in a Designated Record Set that is not also in SBBC's possession, to SBBC in order for SBBC to meet the requirements under 45 C.F.R. §164.524.
- (i) Business Associate agrees to make PHI available for amendment and incorporate all amendments to PHI in a Designated Record Set that SBBC directs or agrees to pursuant to 45 C.F.R. §164.526 at the request of SBBC or an Individual in the time and manner designated by SBBC. Business Associate agrees to make internal practices, policies, books and records relating to the use and disclosure of PHI available to SBBC, or at a request of SBBC to the Secretary, in a time and manner as designated by SBBC or the Secretary, for the purposes of the Secretary determining SBBC's compliance with the Privacy Rule. Business Associate shall immediately notify SBBC upon receipt or notice of any and all requests by the Secretary to conduct an investigation with respect to PHI received from SBBC.
- (j) Business Associate agrees to document any and all disclosures of PHI and information related to such disclosures that are not excepted under 45 C.F.R. §164.528(a)(1) as would be reasonably required for SBBC to respond to a request by an Individual for an accounting of disclosures of PHI in accordance with 45 C.F.R. §164.528.
- (k) Business Associate agrees to provide to SBBC or an Individual, in a time and manner by SBBC, information collected in accordance with paragraph (j) above, to permit SBBC to respond to a request by an Individual for an accounting of disclosures of PHI in accordance with 45 C.F.R. §164.528.
- (l) Business Associate agrees to use or disclose PHI pursuant to the request of SBBC; provided, however, that SBBC shall not request Business Associate to use or disclose PHI in any manner that would not be permissible under the Privacy Rule if done by SBBC.
- (m) Business Associate agrees to mitigate, to the extent practicable, any and all harmful effects that are known to Business Associate of a use or disclosure of PHI, or a Breach of Unsecured PHI, by Business Associate in violation of the requirements of this Agreement, the Privacy Rule, the Security Rule, the HITECH Act or HIPAA generally.
- (n) Business Associate shall provide SBBC with a copy of any notice of privacy practices it produces in accordance with 45 C.F.R. §164.520, as well as any and all changes to such notice.
- (o) Business Associate, if performing a function that applies to Covered Entity, agrees to comply with the requirements that apply to the Covered Entity.

3. Permitted Uses and Disclosures of PHI by “Business Associate”

- (a) Except as otherwise limited in this Agreement, Business Associate may use or disclose PHI to perform functions, activities or services for, or on behalf of, SBBC as previously agreed to by the parties (the “Service Agreement”) provided that such use or disclosure would not violate the Privacy Rule if done by SBBC.
- (b) Except as otherwise limited in this Agreement, Business Associate may use PHI for the proper management and administration of Business Associate and to carry out the legal responsibilities of Business Associate.
- (c) Except as otherwise limited in this Agreement, Business Associate may disclose PHI for the proper management and administration of Business Associate and to carry out the legal responsibilities of Business Associate if: (i) such disclosure is Required by Law, or (ii) Business Associate obtains reasonable assurances from the person to whom the information is disclosed that such information will remain confidential and used for further disclosed only as Required by Law or for the purposes for which it was disclosed to the person, and the person agrees to notify Business Associate of any and all instances of which it is aware that the confidentiality of the information has been breached.
- (d) Except as otherwise limited in this Agreement, Business Associate may use PHI to provide Data Aggregation services to SBBC as permitted by 42 C.F.R. §164.504(e)(2)(i)(B).

4. Obligations of SBBC Regarding PHI

- (a) SBBC shall provide Business Associate with the notice of privacy practices that SBBC produces in accordance with 45 C.F.R. §164.520, as well as any changes to such notice.
- (b) SBBC shall provide Business Associate with any and all changes in, or revocation of, authorization by an Individual to use or disclose PHI, if such changes affect Business Associate
- (c) SBBC shall notify Business Associate of any and all restrictions to the use or disclosure of PHI that SBBC has agreed to in accordance with 45 C.F.R. §164.522.
- (d) SBBC and its representatives shall be entitled with ten (10) business days prior written notice to Business Associate to audit Business Associate from time-to-time to verify Business Associate compliance with the terms of this Agreement. SBBC shall be entitled and enabled to inspect the records and other information relevant to Business Associate compliance with the terms of this Agreement. SBBC shall conduct its review during the normal business hours of Business Associate, as the case may be, and to the extent feasible without unreasonably interfering with Business Associate normal operations.

5. Security of Electronic Protected Health Information.

- (a) Business Associate has implemented policies and procedures to ensure that its receipt, maintenance, or transmission of “electronic protected health information” (as defined in 45 C.F.R. §160.103) (“ePHI) on behalf of SBBC complies with the applicable administrative, physical, and technical safeguards required for protecting and confidentiality and integrity of ePHI under the Security Standards 45 C.F.R. Part 160 and 164 subpart C.

- (b) Business Associate agrees that it will ensure that agents or subcontractors agree to implement the applicable administrative, physical, and technical safeguards required to protect the confidentiality and integrity of ePHI under the Security Standards 45 C.F.R. Part 164.
- (c) Business Associate agrees to report to SBBC all Security Incidents (as defined 45 C.F.R. Part 164.304 and in accordance with applicable Florida law) of which it becomes aware. Business Associate agrees to report the Security Incident to SBBC as soon as reasonably practicable, but later than 10 business days from the date the Business Associate becomes aware of the incident.
- (d) SBBC agrees and understands that SBBC is independently responsible for the security of ePHI in its possession or for ePHI that it receives from outside sources including "Business Associate".

6. Compliance with EDI Rule.

Business Associate agrees that, on behalf of SBBC, it will perform all transactions for which a standard has been developed under the EDI Rule that Business Associate could reasonably be expected to perform in the ordinary course of its functions on behalf of SBBC.

Business Associate agrees that it will comply with all applicable EDI standards. Business Associate further agrees that it will use its best efforts to comply with all applicable regulatory provisions in addition to the EDI Rule and the Privacy Rule that are promulgated pursuant to the Administrative Simplification Subtitle of HIPPA.

7. Subsequent Legislative or Regulatory Changes.

Any and all amendments to the laws or regulations affecting the Privacy Rule, Security Rule, the HITECH Act, Omnibus Rule, or HIPPA in general, shall be deemed to amend this Agreement to incorporate said changes without further action.

8. Amendment.

The parties agree to take any and all actions necessary to amend this Agreement from time to time so that SBBC is in compliance with the Privacy Rule, the Security Rule, the HITECH Act, and HIPPA in general. The parties may agree to amend this Agreement from time to time in other respect that they deem appropriate. This Agreement shall not be amended except by written instrument executed by the parties.

9. Term and Termination.

- (a) ***Term.*** This Agreement shall be effective as of the Effective Date and shall remain in effect until such time as SBBC exercises its right to termination under section 9(b) or 9(c) and until the requirements of Section 9(d) below are satisfied. The rights and obligations of Business Associate under Section 9(d) shall survive termination of this Agreement.
- (b) ***Termination for Convenience.*** This Agreement may be terminated without cause and for convenience by SBBC during the term thereof upon thirty (30) days written notice to Business Associate.

- (c) ***Termination for Cause by SBBC.*** Upon SBBC's knowledge of a material breach by Business Associate, SBBC shall provide an opportunity for Business Associate to cure the breach. If Business Associate does not cure the breach within thirty (30) days from the date that SBBC provides notice of such breach to Business Associate, SBBC shall have the right to terminate this Agreement, the Service Agreement, or both, by providing thirty (30) days advance written notice of such termination to Business Associate.

SBBC may terminate this Agreement without penalty or recourse to SBBC if SBBC determines that Business Associate has violated a material term of this Agreement.

Upon Business Associate knowledge of a material breach by SBBC, for example, if SBBC makes illegal demands on Business Associate, Business Associate shall provide an opportunity for SBBC to cure the breach. If SBBC does not cure the breach within thirty (30) days of the date that Business Associate provides notice of such breach to SBBC, Business Associate shall have the right to terminate this Agreement, the Service Agreement, or both, by providing thirty (30) days advance written notice of such termination to Covered Entity.

- (d) ***Effect of Termination.*** Except as set forth in this Section 9(d), upon termination of this Agreement for any reason, at the request of SBBC, Business Associate shall return or destroy all PHI received from SBBC, or created or received by Business Associate on behalf of SBBC. Business Associate shall not retain any copies of the PHI. In the event that Business Associate determines that returning or destroying the PHI is infeasible, such as in the use of data aggregation, Business Associate shall provide to SBBC written notification of the conditions that make return or destruction infeasible. If the return or destruction of PHI is infeasible, Business Associate shall extend the protections of this Agreement to such PHI and limit further uses and disclosures of such PHI to those purposes that make the return or destruction infeasible, for so long as Business Associate maintains such PHI.

10. **Indemnification.**

- (a) **By SBBC:** SBBC agrees to be fully responsible for its acts of negligence or its agent's acts of negligence when acting within the scope of their employment and agrees to be liable for any damages resulting from said negligence.
- (b) **By Business Associate:** Business Associate agrees to indemnify, hold harmless and defend SBBC, its agents, servants and employees from any and all claims, judgments, costs and expenses including, but not limited to, reasonable attorney's fees, reasonable investigative and discovery cost, court costs and all other sums which SBBC, its agents, servants and employees must pay or become obligated to pay on account of any, all and every claim or demand, or assertion of liability, or any claim or action founded thereon, arising or alleged to have arisen out of the products, goods, or services furnished by Business Associate, its agents, servants or employees while such equipment is on premises owned or controlled by SBBC; or the negligence of Business Associate agents when acting within the scope of their employment or agency, whether such claims, judgments, costs and expenses be for damages, damage to property including Business Associate property, and injury or death of any person whether employed by Business Associate, SBBC or otherwise.

ARTICLE 3 – GENERAL CONDITIONS**11. No Waiver of Sovereign Immunity.**

Nothing contained herein is intended to serve as a waiver of sovereign immunity by any agency or political subdivision to which sovereign immunity may be applicable or as waiver of limits to liability or rights existing under Section 768.28, Florida Statutes.

12. No Third Party Beneficiaries.

The parties expressly acknowledge that it is not their intent to create or confer any rights or obligations in or upon any third person or entity under this Agreement. The parties agree that there are no third party beneficiaries to this Agreement and that no third party shall be entitled to assert a claim against any of the parties based upon this Agreement. Nothing herein shall be construed as consent by an agency or political subdivision of the State of Florida to be sued by third parties in any matter arising out of any contract.

13. Non-Discrimination.

The parties shall not discriminate against any employee or participant in the performance of the duties, responsibilities and obligations under this Agreement because of age, color, disability, gender identity, gender expression, national origin, marital status, race, religion, sex or sexual orientation.

14. Records.

Each party shall maintain its own respective records and documents associated with this Agreement in accordance with the records retention requirements applicable to public records. Each party shall be responsible for compliance with any public documents request served upon it pursuant to Section 119.07, Florida Statutes, and any resultant award of attorney's fees for non-compliance with that law.

15. Preparation of Agreement.

The parties acknowledge that they have sought and obtained whatever competent advice and counsel as was necessary for them to form a full and complete understanding of all rights and obligations herein and that the preparation of this Agreement has been their joint effort. The language agreed to herein expresses their mutual intent and the resulting document shall not, solely as a matter of judicial construction, be construed more severely against one of the parties than the other.

16. Waiver.

The parties agree that each requirement, duty and obligation set forth herein is substantial and important to the formation of this Agreement and, therefore, is a material term hereof. Any party's failure to enforce any provision of this Agreement shall not be deemed a waiver of such provision or modification of this Agreement. A waiver of any breach of a provision of this Agreement shall not be deemed a waiver of any subsequent breach and shall not be construed to be a modification of the term of this Agreement.

17. Compliance with Laws.

Each party shall comply with all applicable federal and state laws, codes, rules and regulations in performing its duties, responsibilities and obligations pursuant to this Agreement.

18. Binding Effect.

This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns.

19. Assignment.

Neither this Agreement nor any interest herein may be assigned, transferred or encumbered by any party without the prior written consent of the other party. There shall be no partial assignments of this Agreement including, without limitation, the partial assignment of any right to receive payments from SBBC.

20. Force Majeure.

Neither party shall be obligated to perform any duty, requirement or obligation under this Agreement if such performance is prevented by fire, hurricane, earthquake, explosion, wars, sabotage, accident, flood, acts of God, strikes, or other labor disputes, riot or civil commotions, or by reason of any other matter or condition beyond the control of either party, and which cannot be overcome by reasonable diligence and without unusual expense ("Force Majeure"). In no event shall a lack of funds on the part of either party be deemed Force Majeure.

21. Place of Performance.

All obligations of SBBC under the terms of this Agreement are reasonably susceptible of being performed in Broward County, Florida and shall be payable and performable in Broward County, Florida.

22. Notices.

When any of the parties desire to give notice to the other, such notice must be in writing, sent by U.S. mail, postage prepaid, addressed to the party for whom it is intended at the place last specified; the place for giving notice shall remain such until it is changed by written notice in compliance with the provisions of this paragraph. For the present, the parties designate the following as the respective places for giving notice:

23. Severability.

In case any one or more of the provisions contained in this Agreement shall for any reason be held to be invalid, illegal, unlawful, unenforceable or void in any respect, the invalidity, illegality, unenforceability or unlawful or void nature of that provision shall not affect any other provision and this Agreement shall be considered as if such invalid, illegal, unlawful, unenforceable or void provision had never been included herein.

24. Captions.

The captions, section numbers, title and headings appearing in this Agreement are inserted only as a matter of convenience and in no way define, limit, construe or describe the scope or intent of such articles or sections of this Agreement, nor in any way effect this Agreement and shall not be construed to create a conflict with the provisions of this Agreement.

25. Authority.

Each person signing this Agreement on behalf of either party individually warrants that he or she has full legal power to execute this Agreement on behalf of the party for whom he or she is signing, and to bind and obligate such party with respect to all provisions contained in this Agreement. The person signing on behalf of "Business Associate" has authority to bind "Business Associate" with respect to all provisions contained in this Agreement.

26. No Waiver of Rights, Powers and Remedies.

No failure or delay by a party hereto in exercising any right, power or remedy under this Agreement, and no course of dealing between the parties hereto, will operate as a waiver of any such right, power or remedy of the party. No single or partial exercise of any right, power or remedy under this Agreement by a party hereto, nor any abandonment or discontinuance of steps to enforce any such right, power or remedy, will preclude such party from any other or further exercise thereof or the exercise of any other right, power or remedy hereunder. The election of any remedy by a party hereto will not constitute a waiver of the right of such party to pursue other available remedies. No notice to or demand on a party not expressly required under this Agreement will entitle the party receiving such notice or demand to any other or further notice or demand in similar or other circumstances or constitute a waiver of the right of the party giving such notice or demand to any other or further action in any circumstances without such notice or demand. The terms and provisions of this Agreement may be waived, or consent for the departure there from granted, only by written document executed by the party entitled to the benefits of such terms or provisions. No such waiver or consent will be deemed to be or will constitute a waiver or consent with respect to any other terms or provisions of this Agreement, whether or not similar. Each such waiver or consent will be effective only in the specific instance and for the purpose for which it was given, and will not constitute a continuing waiver or consent.

27. Regulatory References.

A reference in this Agreement to a section in the Privacy Rule, the Security Rule, the HITECH Act, or HIPAA in general means the referenced section or its successor, and for which compliance is required.

28. Governing Law.

This Agreement shall be interpreted and construed in accordance with and governed by the laws of the State of Florida. Any controversies or legal problems arising out of this Agreement and any action

involving the enforcement or interpretation of any rights hereunder shall be submitted to the jurisdiction of the State courts of the Seventeenth Judicial Circuit of Broward County, Florida.

29. Entire Agreement.

This Agreement incorporates and includes all prior negotiations, correspondence, conversations, agreements and understandings applicable to the matters contained herein and the parties agree that there are no commitments, agreements or understandings concerning the subject matter of this Agreement that are not contained in this Agreement. Accordingly, the parties agree that no deviation from the terms hereof shall be predicated upon any prior representations or agreements, whether oral or written.






