EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Recommendation to Approve Amendments and Renewal 58-104V - Dual Enrollment Articulation and Collegiate High School Agreements With Broward College

This request is to approve the Second Amendment to the Dual Enrollment Agreement between The District Board of Trustees of Broward College, Florida (BC) and The School Board of Broward County, Florida (SBBC). The agreement was approved on June 27, 2017, RSBM item FF-9. The agreement term was August 1, 2017 through July 31, 2018, with an approved spending authority of \$3,889,000. The First Amendment was approved on August 22, 2017, RSBM item FF-1 to facilitate the purchase of the instructional materials. This Second Amendment is to extend the agreement to July 31, 2019, requesting the same \$3,889,000 spending authority for the 2018-2019 school year.

Program Details

- SBBC and BC are required by Section 1007.271, Florida Statue to enter into a Dual Enrollment Articulation Agreement that outlines how both institutions will partner to provide accelerated programs to eligible students
- SBBC and BC have had an ongoing agreement to supply students with access to Dual Enrollment courses and the necessary instructional materials that go along with those courses.
- Secondary school students who meet requirements may enroll in Dual Enrollment opportunities through BC.

This request is to approve the First Amendment to Agreement between The District Board of Trustees of Broward College, Florida, and The School Board of Broward County, Florida (SBBC), that started on August 1, 2017 through July 31, 2018.

Program Details

- As required by Florida Statute (F.S. 1007.273), Broward College and The School Board of Broward
 County, Florida, must enter into a Collegiate High School Agreement to provide a rigorous
 collegiate academic program for serious high school students, who have the discipline required of
 a college campus and collegiate study.
- Students attend the high school full time, for their junior and senior years, simultaneously completing the remaining high school diploma requirements and AA Degree requirements.

Procurement Method

Pursuant to School Board Policy 3320, Section II, H, and the Department of Education, Rule 6A-1.012, 11(b), Florida Administrative Code as authorized by Section 1010.04(4)(a), Florida Statues, the requirement for requesting competitive solicitation for commodities or contractual services from three (3) or more sources is hereby waived as for the SBBC's purchase of copyrighted materials purchased directly from a recognized educational institution, Broward College.

FIRST AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT

THIS FIRST AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT is made and entered into as of this day of _______, 20 / _______ by and between

THE SCHOOL BOARD OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA

(hereinafter referred to as "SBBC"), a body corporate and political subdivision of the State of Florida, whose principal place of business is 600 Southeast Third Avenue, Fort Lauderdale, Florida 33301

and

THE DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF BROWARD COLLEGE, FLORIDA

(hereinafter referred to as "BC"), a body corporate and political subdivision of the State of Florida, having its principal place of business at 225 East Las Olas Blvd, Fort Lauderdale, Florida 33301

WHEREAS, SBBC and BC (collectively, the "Parties") entered into a Collegiate High School Agreement dated June 27, 2017 (hereafter referred as "Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the Parties are required by Section 1007.273, Florida Statutes to enter into the Agreement, which outlines how the Parties will partner to establish a Collegiate High School, College Academy @ BC, to district school students,

WHEREAS, the parties mutually desire to amend certain provisions of the Agreement.

- NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of the mutual covenants contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties hereby agree as follows:
- 1.01 <u>Recitals</u>. The Parties agree that the foregoing recitals are true and correct and that such recitals are incorporated herein by reference.
- 1.02 <u>Term of Agreement.</u> Pursuant to Article 2.01 of the Agreement, the term of the Agreement is hereby extended from August 1, 2018 through July 31, 2019, unless terminated earlier pursuant to Article 3.05 of the Agreement.
- 1.03 <u>Amended Provisions</u>. The Parties hereby agree to the following amendments to the Agreement:

The following appendices shall replace the respective appendices referenced in the Agreement:

- Appendix A General Education Requirements 20191
- Appendix B College Academy Student Performance Contract 18-19

The following shall be deleted from the Agreement:

- Article 3.10 <u>Student Records</u>.
- · Appendix C

The following provisions -2.04, 2.08, 2.09, 2.17, and 2.18- shall replace the respective provisions in the Agreement, by interlineation, as follows:

2.04 <u>Delineation of Courses</u>. Students select courses from the BC course dictionary. Course selections must include the required general education courses for an Associate of Arts degree (Appendix A). Students are subject to the general education requirements for the catalog year in which they become degree seeking at Broward College and will be advised accordingly.

The language arts curriculum offers both structure and choice. Students take English Composition 1 and 2 and Introduction to Literature as part of their required program. Students may also select additional language arts/humanities courses to fulfill elective requirements including Creative Writing, Professional Technical Writing, American Literature and British Literature. Emphasis is on shared inquiry into literature, writing and grammar, and vocabulary development. Students do formal and informal writing including literary critical analysis as well as completing a research paper. They are introduced to MLA documentation as a precursor to the writing requirements for the skills needed in all their college classes. Research skills, including using the library, Internet and electronic databases provide the foundation for presentations. The pace and depth of study is at the college level and utilizes writing labs provided by the college to remediate and provide enrichment. The English department assigns summer reading for current and prospective students who are part of the opening of school activities.

The CA @ BC social studies sequence begins with juniors taking six credits of United States History. The American History class is distinguished by real time research, examination of primary sources, and team projects on historical and contemporary issues. In the senior year, students take dual enrollment courses in National Government and Macroeconomics in which debate, lecture, and small group projects are a part of the instructional methods.

The mathematics sequence is tailored to individual needs, major and interest of the student. Placement test scores and prerequisite requirements guide the mathematics curriculum. Students enroll in College Algebra, but may test into an accelerated five

credit dual enrollment class, combining the study of Pre-calculus and Trigonometry. Students interested in STEM fields may progress through Differential Equations and Calculus III. The instructors of the mathematics curriculum are specialists in their field all having advanced degrees. The instructional methods used by instructors include face-to-face instruction, hands on manipulatives, cooperative groups, notes posted to Desire to Learn (D2L) from class lectures, and computer aided instruction through online math labs. Faculty maintain office hours to be available to their students for questions and assistance. Students may have access to tutoring via the BC Math Lab and the BC STEM Lab at no cost.

Students generally begin the science curriculum during the second semester, choosing from over twenty science courses. CA @ BC students interested in STEM majors generally begin their science studies taking Chemistry 1040. Students with a high school background in chemistry may take the more challenging and faster paced Chemistry 1045. Courses available include a wide diversity of college biological and physical science courses generally unavailable in traditional high schools including advanced physics, organic chemistry, astronomy and advanced biology. The rigorous science curriculum offers high school students the use of state of the art facilities, including the planetarium to enhance their study of astronomy, and the opportunity to use instruments and techniques during the required laboratory component.

Humanities classes including art and foreign language are also taken with BC professors. Students select from a variety of courses in fine and performing arts, including pottery, painting, photography, dance, music, and theater. STEM students are encouraged to select a course in philosophy, ethics, or logic. A two-year foreign language requirement can be met through Spanish, American Sign Language, or the many language programs offered in the college curriculum. Students may also enroll in the third and fourth level of language courses after conferencing with the department chair. (Sample junior and senior schedule within Student Performance Contract—Appendix B).

2.08 <u>Eligibility and Enrollment Process.</u> Students begin their application process with the CA @ BC in January, of their sophomore year, and come from public, private and home school settings. All CA @ BC students must reside in Broward County. Students may review the eligibility criteria at the CA @ BC website (http://collegeacademy.browardschools.com/) or attend the annual information sessions where the eligibility criteria are discussed.

A. Eligibility Criteria - Part I: Initial Screening

- 1) Sophomore status at time of application
- 2) Earned a minimum unweighted 3.25 GPA at time of application
- Exemplary attendance, conduct, grades, and behavioral history at the time of application

- B. <u>Eligibility Criteria Part 2: Testing Requirements</u>
 Pass all subtests of the Postsecondary Education Readiness Test (PERT) or SAT/ACT with the minimum scores required to place in college level courses (College Algebra and English Composition 1 or higher).
- C. <u>Eligibility Criteria Part 3: Continue to Meet Admissions Criteria</u> Applicants that meet the initial criteria and submit passing scores by the posted deadline will be placed into the qualified applicant pool. Should the number of qualified applicants exceed the number of available seats, a random selection process will take place once the deadline for testing has passed. Students selected through this process will be offered admission. The remaining students will be offered admissions as seats become available [waitlist].

2.09 Application/Enrollment Process.

A. Part 1: Initial Application & Screening

- The CA @ BC accepts applications once a year. The application is online at http://collegeacademy.browardschools.com. The application window is open from January through mid-February. All communication and forms are processed via the online application. Applicants must check the status of their application online throughout the admission process for updates. It is the responsibility of the applicant to meet all deadlines.
- Applicants, with their parents, complete an online application. Completed online applications will be reviewed and statuses updated to reflect if the student has or has not met the initial eligibility requirements. Applicants' educational records must be available for review within five days of the submission of the application.

B. Part 2: Testing

Students' online application statuses will be updated to reflect that they have met or have not met the initial screening requirements within ten days of submission. Incomplete applications will not be screened. Students who have met the initial screening criteria will have an opportunity to take the PERT test or submit passing scores from the PERT/ACT/SAT. Students will receive one free PERT test ticket during the application & testing window. Students may take the PERT once during the admission window.

 Take the Postsecondary Education Readiness Test (PERT) or submit SAT/ACT scores that meet admissions requirements by

- the deadline. Students who have qualifying SAT/ACT/PERT scores *do not* have to take the PERT.
- BC will communicate scores to CA if you test at BC. CA will only accept official PERT score reports.
- Submit PERT, SAT, or ACT scores by deadline
 Testing centers will have high demand. It is the responsibility
 of the applicant to test in a timely manner to meet testing
 deadline.

C. Part 3: Admission Status: Notifications and Responses

- 1) Students who meet testing requirements are placed in the qualified applicant pool and will be admitted unless the number of qualified applicants exceeds the number of available seats. If this occurs, a random selection process will be utilized once the deadline for testing has passed. Students selected through this process will be offered admission. The remaining students will be offered admission as seats become available [waitlist]. A waitlist is maintained throughout the summer and dismissed once the regular public school year begins.
- 2) Students who are offered admission must accept online by the specified deadline. Failure to respond by the deadline will be interpreted as a decline of the admissions offer.

D. Part 4: Enrollment Process

- Applicants accept admission by completing a BC Application online. Students who have a BC ID number do not need to reapply.
- 2) Once the applicant has a BC ID number, the applicant must submit an Enrollment form online to the CA @ BC.
- 3) Admitted students will be scheduled for a two hour registration session with the BC and CA @ BC advisors.
- 4) Registration takes place in April.
- 5) During Registration students will select their Term 1 classes.
- 6) A parent or guardian must attend registration with the student.

E. Part 5: Enrollment Process

- Registration Session Students meet with advisors and select Term 1 classes.
- 2) Student Orientation Students attend an orientation conducted by CA @ BC students. Orientation consists of a meet and greet for students and parents, a campus tour, transition activities, and textbook pickup.

2.17 SBBC Disclosure of Education Records.

A. SBBC shall provide BC with the records listed in 2.17 (B) for the purpose of SBBC District School students to meet qualifications for

cnrollment, and for SBBC and BC to provide ongoing academic advisement in dual enrollment course options and progression in dual enrollment courses at BC.

- B. SBBC shall provide BC with the following education records:
 - 1) High School Transcript, Unweighted High School Grade Point Average (GPA); and
 - either PSAT, SAT, ACT, Advanced Placement (AP) or Postsecondary Education Readiness Test (PERT) test scores
- C. SBBC shall obtain written consent from each student's parent/guardian or student age 18 or older prior to disclosing education records to BC pursuant to this agreement.

2.18 Confidentiality of Education Records

- A. Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary within this Agreement, SBBC and BC shall:
 - 1) fully comply with the requirements of Sections 1002.22, 1002.221, and 1002.222, Florida Statutes; the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, 20 U.S.C § 1232g (FERPA) and its implementing regulations (34 C.F.R. Part 99), and any other state or federal law or regulation regarding the confidentiality of student information and records;
 - 2) hold any education records in strict confidence and not use or redisclose same except as required by this Agreement or as required or permitted by law unless the parent of each student or a student age 18 or older whose education records are to be shared provides prior written consent for their release;
 - 3) ensure that, at all times, all of its employees who have access to any education records during the term of their employment shall abide strictly be its obligations under this Agreement, and that access to education records is limited only to its employees that require the information to carry out the responsibilities under this Agreement and shall provide said list of employees to SBBC or BC upon request;
 - 4) safeguard each education record through administrative, physical and technological standards to ensure that adequate controls are in place to protect the education records and information in accordance with FERPA's privacy requirements;
 - 5) utilize the education records solely for the purposes of providing products and services as contemplated under this Agreement; and shall not share, publish, sell, distribute, target advertise, or display education records to any third party;
 - 6) upon each party's discovery of a breach of confidentiality of education records, notify the other party. For SBBC: by telephone

- at 754-321-0300 (Manager, Information Security), and 754-321-1900 (Privacy Officer), and email at privacy@browardschools.com; For BC: Office of the General Counsel 954-201-7639;
- 7) take all necessary notification steps as may be required by federal and Florida law, including, but not limited to, those required by Section 501.171, Florida Statutes;
- 8) fully cooperate with appropriate SBBC and BC staff, including a Privacy Officer and/or Information Technology staff to resolve any privacy investigations and concerns in a timely manner;
- 9) prepare and distribute, at its own cost, any and all required breach notifications, under federal and Florida Law, or reimburse SBBC/BC any direct costs incurred by SBBC/BC for doing so, including, but not limited to, those required by Section 501.171, Florida Statutes;
- 10) be responsible for any fines or penalties for the respective party's failure to meet breach notice requirements pursuant to federal and/or Florida law;
- 11) provide each other with the name and contact information of its employee who shall serve as SBBC or BC's primary security contact and shall be available to assist SBBC or BC in resolving obligations associated with a security breach of confidentiality of education records; and
- 12) securely erase education records from any media once that media equipment is no longer in use or is to be disposed; secure erasure will be deemed the deletion of the education records using a single pass overwrite Secure Erase (Windows) or Wipe (Unix).
- B. All SBBC education records shall remain the property of SBBC, and any party contracting with SBBC serves solely as custodian of such information pursuant to this Agreement and claims no ownership or property rights thereto and, upon termination of this Agreement shall, at SBBC's request, return to SBBC or dispose of the education records in compliance with the applicable Florida Retention Schedules and provide SBBC with a written acknowledgment of said disposition.
- C. All BC education records shall remain the property of BC, and any party contracting with BC serves solely as custodian of such information pursuant to this Agreement and claims no ownership or property rights thereto and, upon termination of this Agreement shall, at BC's request, return to BC or dispose of the education records in compliance with the applicable Florida Retention Schedules and provide BC with a written acknowledgment of said disposition.
- 1.04 Order of Precedence among Agreement Documents. In the event of conflict between the provisions of the Agreement and the provisions contained herein, the provisions of the following documents shall take precedence in this order:
 - a) this First Amendment to Agreement; and

- b) the Agreement.
- 1.05 Other Provisions Remain in Force. Except as expressly provided herein, all other portions of the Agreement remain in full force and effect.
- 1.06 <u>Authority for this First Amendment</u>. Each person signing this First Amendment to Agreement on behalf of either party individually warrants that he or she has full legal power to execute this First Amendment to Agreement on behalf of the party for whom he or she is signing, and to bind and obligate such party with respect to all provisions contained in this First Amendment to Agreement.

Area 3- Social Science/Behavioral Sciences:

At least one of the courses that you choose from these areas need to be selected from the CORE list: AMH2020 or POS2041 (Social Science) or ANT2000, ECO2013, PSY2012, or SYG2000 (Behavioral Science). If you do not take at least one of these courses, the Social/Behavioral Sciences area will not be satisfied.

Area 4- Sciences:

At least one of the courses that you choose from this area needs to be selected from the CORE list: BSC1005, BSC2010, BSC2085, EVR1001, AST1002, CHM1020, CHM1020, CHM1045, ESC1000, PHV1020, PHV2048, or PHV2053, If you do not take at least one of these courses, the Science area will not be satisfied.

Area 5- Math:

At least one of these courses need to be from the CORE list: MAC1105, MAC2311, MGF1106, MGF1107, or STA2023. If you do not take at last one of these courses, the Math area will not be satisfied.

UNDERSTANDING THE ELECTIVE COURSES (24 credits)

These may include any combination of college-level courses recommended/required for a discipline major and/or courses from the General Education offerings in Communications. Humanities, Mathematics, Natural Sciences, & Social and Behavioral Sciences. Excluded are college preparatory courses and courses designed especially for technical education curricula. When choosing electives, students should

give careful attention to their major field of study and to the requirements of the institution to which they plan to transfer. Certain technical/occupational courses can be used to satisfy this area requirement. Please consult with an Academic Advisor.

UNDERSTANDING THE GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

WRITING REQUIREMENT (W) (4 courses)

In keeping with the Gordon Rule, all students must take ENC1101; ENC1102 and two additional writing credit courses (6 additional credits) to graduate with the AA. In each of these courses, a variety of assignments relevant to the content of the course may be made. Students must achieve a grade of "C" or higher in the courses to satisfy the writing requirement.

Students must be eligible for ENC1101 to enroll in designated writing credit courses. Some students who were enrolled in an accredited college or university prior to January 1, 1983, may be exempt from the Writing Requirement. Please see an Academic Advisor for assistance.

INTERNATIONAL/INTERCULTURAL (I) (1 course)

<u>MOTE</u>: Of the 36-credit General Education requirements, three credits must be camed in an approved International / Intercultural course.

COMPUTER COMPETENCY

Students must fulfill the computer literacy requirement within the first 15 credit hours of enrollment at BC by successfully completing the CG\$1060C course or by passing the computer competency test.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE COMPETENCY

Students must successfully meet the foreign language requirement as prescribed in college policy and the college catalog.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

- Complete prescribed College Preparatory and ESL Program courses, if required, with a grade of "C" or higher.
- Complete 25% of the prescribed college-level semester credit hours at Broward College.
- Earn a cumulative degree grade point average of 2.0 or higher at BC including transfer credits in courses that comprise the A.A. degree.
- ✓ Fulfill all financial and other obligations to the College.

College Academy at Broward College Collegiate High School

Student Performance Contract

Section 1007,273, Florida Statutes require that each student participating in a collegiate high school program must enter into a student performance contract. Please review the following guidelines and sign the form below.

Students attending the College Academy @ BC are working toward a 24-credit high school diploma and an Associate of Arts degree.

Students must attend all classes punctually every class day. A College Academy @ BC student is expected to attend class as scheduled, arrive at school and class on time, and demonstrate appropriate behavior and a readiness to learn. Students attending Broward College classes must consult the course syllabus for attendance procedures.

Students are required to maintain full time student status each semester, a minimum of four classes (excluding labs) or 12 credits, whichever is greater. Juniors must participate in Term 3, 2A. Seniors take courses during Term 1 & 2, unless a course is needed to fulfill the AA degree and/or HS diploma.

Students at the College Academy @ BC must maintain a minimum unweighted high school GPA of 3.0, good attendance and exemplary disciplinary records. A Broward College dual enrollment GPA of 2.5 is required to remain at the College Academy @ BC. Students who do not carn a satisfactory grade (C or better) in a class will be permitted to retake the class.

College Academy students have the option to complete a CAPE Industry Certification in Accounting, Networking, and Criminal Justice. Students who choose to pursue an industry certification are required to enroll in a BC course that aligns with competencies outlined in the CAPE Industry Certification. Certifications will be awarded only when students demonstrate competency or proficiency on a written exam given in a proctored environment by a third party agency.

Student conduct is governed by the Broward County Public Schools Student Code of Conduct and Broward College Student Handbook. College Academy @ BC students are required to abide by the guidelines outlined in BC's Student Handbook, which contains the academic calendar, code of conduct, students' rights and responsibilities, grading and evaluation process, academic dishonesty, disciplinary procedures, as well as accommodations provided for students with disabilities. No exceptions to these guidelines will be made for dual corrollment students. The student handbook is published online at http://www.broward.edu/studentresources/rights-and-responsibilities/pages/student-handbook.aspx.

While appropriate for college-level study, course materials and class discussions may reflect topics not typically included in secondary courses, which some parents may find objectionable for minors. Courses will not be modified to accommodate variations in student age and/or maturity per the Articulation Agreement between the SBBC and BC. Students and parents may view Broward College course descriptions at www.broward.edu/catalog. A sample CA@BC student schedule is listed below.

Students enrolled in the College Academy take all of their classes at Broward College, a public space, Adult students, vendors, and staff are present on the campus without the implementation of the screenings required in a traditional school setting by the Jessica Lundsford Act (Section 1012,467, Florida Statutes).

Instructional Materials and Fees: Pursuant to Section 1011.62(1) (i), Florida Statutes, students enrolled in dual enrollment instruction shall be exempt from the payment of tuition and fees, including laboratory fees. No fees may be charged to dual enrollment students. All <u>required</u> class instructional materials must be returned at the end of the term to the College Academy at BC/Barnes and Nobles Bookstore in order for students not to incur an obligation.

Schedule: The schedule below reflects the general course sequence and list of courses College Academy students must take to meet the high school requirements and Associate of Arts degree requirements. Student placement and exemption from some courses are based on placement test and previous college credits earned. The dates and times classes are offered is dependent on the Broward College schedule published each semester.

Most college classes are three credit courses and meet two days a week. College courses taught by College Academy faculty generally meet Monday – Friday. College Academy students typically take 15 credits per semester (five classes) and may not exceed 18 credits or six classes per semester.

Due to the college class schedule, students will have independent time on campus which should be utilized to study and prepare for college classes. SECOND AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT

THIS SECOND AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT is made and entered into as of this 2 day of ______, 20 18 by and between

THE SCHOOL BOARD OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA

(hereinafter referred to as "SBBC"), a body corporate and political subdivision of the State of Florida, whose principal place of business is 600 Southeast Third Avenue, Fort Lauderdale, Florida 33301

and

THE DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF BROWARD COLLEGE, FLORIDA

(hereinafter referred to as "BC"), a body corporate and political subdivision of the State of Florida, having its principal place of business at 225 East Las Olas Blvd, Fort Lauderdale, Florida 33301

WHEREAS, SBBC and BC (collectively, the "Parties") entered into a Dual Enrollment Articulation Agreement dated June 27, 2017 (hereafter referred as "Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the Parties are required by Section 1007.271, Florida Statutes to enter into the Agreement, which outlines how the Parties will partner to provide accelerated programs to eligible home education and public students; and

WHEREAS, the parties mutually desire to amend certain provisions of the Agreement.

- NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of the mutual covenants contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties hereby agree as follows:
- 1.01 <u>Recitals</u>. The Parties agree that the foregoing recitals are true and correct and that such recitals are incorporated herein by reference.
- 1.02 <u>Term of Agreement</u>. Pursuant to Article 2.01 of the Agreement, the term of the Agreement is hereby extended from August 1, 2018 through July 31, 2019, unless terminated earlier pursuant to Article 3.05 of the Agreement.
- 1.03 <u>Amended Provisions</u>. The Parties hereby agree to the following amendments to the Agreement throughout the term of this First Amendment:

The following shall be deleted from the Agreement:

Article 3.10 Student Records.

The following provision -2.10, g) - shall be added to the Agreement, by interlineation:

- g) <u>Career Certificate Dual Enrollment for Aviation.</u> Students who participate in Career Certificate Dual Enrollment have an opportunity to earn a Post-Secondary Adult Vocational (PSAV) Certificate for General FAA Aircraft Maintenance and Airframe/Powerplant FAA Aircraft Mechanics. Students must meet the following criteria to participate:
 - 1) Enrolled in grades 6-12 and have a 2.0 or higher unweighted high school GPA
 - 2) Take the "Tests of Adult Basic Education" (TABE) exam
 - 3) Students may only enroll in courses as outlined in Appendix D.
 - 4) Continued Eligibility: Students must earn a "C" grade or higher in each college course and maintain an unweighted high school GPA of 2.0 or higher.

For students to earn the General FAA Aircraft Maintenance and Airframe/Powerplant FAA Aircraft Mechanics certifications, they must meet the minimum clock hours, course standards outlined by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), and pass the written, oral and practical exams. No student shall be awarded a career and technical certificate of completion until the student achieves the minimum level of basic skills required for that program by the Department of Education per Florida State Board Rule 6A-10.040.

The following provisions -2.10, 2.20, 2.22, and 2.23 - shall replace the respective provisions referenced in the Agreement, by interlineation:

2.10 Special Programs.

c) Home Education. BC shall enter into a home education articulation agreement with each home school education student seeking enrollment in a dual enrollment course and the student's parent. The home education articulation agreement includes:

- 1) A list of approved courses (Appendix A) available to dually enrolled home education students.
- 2) The eligibility requirements for home education student participation. The home education dual enrollment student is only required to meet the same placement scores as a SBBC student.
- 3) It is the student's responsibility for providing his or her own transportation.
- 4) A copy of the statement on transfer guarantees developed by the Florida Department of Education,

Eligible home education dual enrollment students are subject to the same academic load limits as defined in BC policy. After obtaining 60 credits, including but not limited to other accelerated earned credits through Advanced Placement (AP), Cambridge AICE Exams, College-Level Examination Program (CLEP), or International Baccalaureate (IB), an Associate of Arts degree, or the student turns 19 (whichever occurs first), the home education student may not be admitted to BC as a dual enrollment student unless otherwise provided by law.

- d) <u>Student Life Skills.</u> District school senior students located at designated district high schools may enroll in SLS1001, Strategies for Success. Participants will be identified by their district high school principal and must meet the following criteria to participate:
 - 1) Unweighted high school GPA of 2.5-2,99 GPA or
 - 2) Unweighted high school GPA of 3.0 to 3.5 AND has NOT met the minimum standardized college placement scores for college level courses in all three areas of English, Reading and Math as met through the placement tests of the PERT, SAT or ACT.

If the senior student enrolls in SLS1001 in the Fall term, earns an A, B, or C grade and meets minimum standardized college placement scores for college level courses in Reading and English, as met through the college level placement tests of the PERT, ACT or SAT, the student will

then have the option to take ARH2000, PSY2012, FIN1100 or EDF1005 either online at BC or at a BC campus in the spring term.

2.20 Costs.

- a) <u>Courses Taken at a BC Campus.</u> SBBC shall pay the standard tuition rate per credit and course fees to BC. The standard tuition rate is \$71.98 per credit hour and \$2.33 per contact hour for career certificate programs.
 - 1) Aviation career certificate program: Pay \$1,065 for each qualified student (2.10 (g)) to take the FAA General and Airframe/Powerplant written, oral and practical exams.

2.22 SBBC Disclosure of Education Records.

- a) SBBC shall provide BC with the records listed in 2.17 (2) for the purpose of SBBC District School students to meet qualifications for enrollment, and for SBBC and BC to provide ongoing academic advisement in dual enrollment course options and progression in dual enrollment courses at BC.
- b) SBBC shall provide BC with the following education records:
 - 1) High School Transcript,
 - 2) Unweighted High School Grade Point Average (GPA), and
 - either PSAT, SAT, ACT, Advanced Placement (AP) or Postsecondary Education Readiness Test (PERT) test scores.
- c) SBBC shall obtain written consent from each student's parent/guardian or student age 18 or older prior to disclosing education records to BC pursuant to this agreement.

2.23 Confidentiality of Education Records

- a) Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary within this Agreement, SBBC and BC shall:
 - fully comply with the requirements of Sections 1002.22, 1002.221, and 1002.222, Florida Statutes; the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, 20 U.S.C § 1232g (FERPA) and its implementing regulations (34 C.F.R. Part 99), and any other state or federal law or regulation regarding the confidentiality of student information and records;
 - hold any education records in strict confidence and not use or redisclose same except as required by this Agreement or as required or permitted by law unless the parent of each student or a student age

- 18 or older whose education records are to be shared provides prior written consent for their release;
- 3) ensure that, at all times, all of its employees who have access to any education records during the term of their employment shall abide strictly be its obligations under this Agreement, and that access to education records is limited only to its employees that require the information to carry out the responsibilities under this Agreement and shall provide said list of employees to SBBC or BC upon request;
- safeguard each education record through administrative, physical and technological standards to ensure that adequate controls are in place to protect the education records and information in accordance with FERPA's privacy requirements;
- utilize the education records solely for the purposes of providing products and services as contemplated under this Agreement; and shall not share, publish, sell, distribute, target advertise, or display education records to any third party;
- 6) upon each party's discovery of a confidentiality of education records, notify the other party. For SBBC: by telephone at 754-321-0300 (Manager, Information Security), and 754-321-1900 (Privacy Officer), and email at privacy@browardschools.com; For BC: Office of the General Counsel 954-201-7639. Both parties shall take all necessary notification steps as may be required by federal and Florida law, including, but not limited to, those required by Section 501.171, Florida Statutes;
- fully cooperate with appropriate SBBC and BC staff, including Privacy Officer and/or Information Technology staff to resolve any privacy investigations and concerns in a timely manner;
- 8) prepare and distribute, at its own cost, any and all required breach notifications, under federal and Florida Law, or reimburse SBBC/BC any direct costs incurred by SBBC/BC for doing so, including, but not limited to, those required by Section 501.171, Florida Statutes;
- be responsible for any fines or penalties for the respective party's failure to meet breach notice requirements pursuant to federal and/or Florida law;
- 10) provide each other with the name and contact information of its employee who shall serve as SBBC or BC's primary security contact and shall be available to assist SBBC or BC in resolving obligations associated with a security breach of confidentiality of education records; and
- 11) securely erase education records from any media once that media equipment is no longer in use or is to be disposed; secure erasure will be deemed the deletion of the education records using a single pass overwrite Secure Erase (Windows) or Wipe (Unix).
- b) All SBBC education records shall remain the property of SBBC, and any party contracting with SBBC serves solely as custodian of such information pursuant to this Agreement and claims no ownership or property rights

- thereto and, upon termination of this Agreement shall, at SBBC's request, return to SBBC or dispose of the education records in compliance with the applicable Florida Retention Schedules and provide SBBC with a written acknowledgment of said disposition.
- c) All BC education records shall remain the property of BC, and any party contracting with BC serves solely as custodian of such information pursuant to this Agreement and claims no ownership or property rights thereto and, upon termination of this Agreement shall, at BC's request, return to BC or dispose of the education records in compliance with the applicable Florida Retention Schedules and provide BC with a written acknowledgment of said disposition.
- 1.04 Order of Precedence among Agreement Documents. In the event of conflict between the provisions of the Agreement and the provisions contained herein, the provisions of the following documents shall take precedence in this order:
 - a) this Second Amendment to Agreement; and
 - b) the First Amendment to Agreement; and
 - c) the Agreement.
- 1.05 Other Provisions Remain in Force. Except as expressly provided herein, all other portions of the Agreement remain in full force and effect.
- 1.06 <u>Authority for this Second Amendment</u>. Each person signing this Second Amendment to Agreement on behalf of either party individually warrants that he or she has full legal power to execute this Second Amendment to Agreement on behalf of the party for whom he or she is signing, and to bind and obligate such party with respect to all provisions contained in this Second Amendment to Agreement.
