EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Recommendation to Approve Agreement 59-064V - Florida International University Dual Enrollment Articulation Program

This request is to approve the Agreement between the Florida International University Board of Trustees (FIU) and The School Board of Broward County, Florida (SBBC), for one (1) year starting August 1, 2018 through July 31, 2019.

Program Details

- SBBC and FIU are encouraged by Section 1007.271, Florida Statue to enter into a Dual Enrollment Articulation Agreement that outlines how both institutions will partner to provide accelerated programs to eligible students
- SBBC and FIU have had an ongoing agreement to supply students with access to Dual Enrollment courses and the necessary instructional materials that go along with those courses.
- Secondary school students who meet eligibility requirements may enroll in Dual Enrollment opportunities through FIU

Procurement Method

Pursuant to Purchasing Policy 3320, Section II, H, and the Department of Education, Rule 6A-1.012, 11(b), Florida Administrative Code as authorized by Section 1010.04(4)(a), Florida Statues, the requirement for requesting competitive solicitation for commodities or contractual services from three (3) or more sources is hereby waived as for the SBBC's purchase of copyrighted materials purchased directly from a recognized educational institution, Florida International University.

Piggyback Agreement with Barnes and Noble College Bookseller, LLC

This request is to approve the Piggyback Agreement between Barnes & Noble Bookseller, LLC (B&N) and The School Board of Broward County, Florida (SBBC), for one (1) year starting August 1, 2018 through July 31, 2019. This Agreement will facilitate the purchase of goods and services through B&N under at the same terms, conditions, and prices awarded under FIU's RFP J98-78.

Procurement Method

Rule 6A-1.012(6), Florida Administrative Code and SBBC Policy 3320 Part II, subparagraph M, states that in lieu of requesting competitive solicitations from three (3) or more sources, the School Board may make purchases at or below the specified prices from contracts awarded by other city or county governmental agencies, other districts school boards, community colleges, federal agencies, the public or governmental agencies of any state, or from state university system cooperative bid agreements, when the proposer awarded a contract by another entity will permit purchases by a district school board at the same terms, conditions and prices (or below such prices) awarded in such contract, and such purchases are to the economic advantage of the district school board

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Financial Impact

The spending authority being requested is \$154,000 as detailed below. The agreement will provide the opportunity for schools to participate in the program. All funding will come from the individual participating school's budget.

The current agreement 58-043V with the FIU started on June 25, 2014, and expires on June 30, 2018, with a spending authority of \$31,000 per high school campus location.
