Policy 6000.6 Revision

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New Head Start Performance Standards

- Revised Head Start Performance Standards were released in Fall 2016
- The old version was made up of **eleven** sections
- The new version was streamlined to five sections
- Burdensome and/or redundant standards were removed
 - Shift from compliance to outcomes-based
- New Performance Standards allow for local innovation
 - Ability to waiver certain structural requirements if it meets the needs of the community



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Changes to Performance Standards

Five big changes

- Changing requirement from half day to full day programs
- 2. Limiting suspension and prohibiting expulsion
- Monitoring attendance and addressing chronic absenteeism
- 4. Staff Qualifications and Competency Requirements
- 5. Professional Development for Coaches



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Changes to Policy 6000.6

Policy 6000.6 was revised to match the new Head Start Performance Standards

- There are five sections that match each of the Head Start Performance Standards
- Language reflecting organizational structures and locally specific policies were revised to match the same language used in Broward County Public Schools
