Policy Updates

Page	Update	Rationale
2	Removing Children of Military Families definition	Information is outlined in each of Choice priority sections
5	II. B. language removed added to A.	Done to simplify language
9, 15, 20	Language added to state where Choice information and applications can be found online and how parents will be notified	Paper applications are only available upon request and all Choice information is provided online to schools and families
11	Magnet theme priority clarified	Clarification on what is included in determining theme or continuation of theme priority
12	Include a priority for Pompano Beach HS for students who have attended the Young Scholar Program	To provide students who have participated in this program to continue at the school
14, 18, 25, 34	Leave of absence language to state that a child must already be attending a school or enrolled in an approved Hospital Homebound Program	Clarify leave of absence language
22	Additional priority added for students already attending a school on a one year reassignment where seats become available	Aligns to accommodate students impacted by the previous year's policy update allowing additional space to be utilized at schools
23	Include a reassignment priority setting aside 25% of the remaining available seats for students on reassignment to continue on to the feeding middle or high school	Increases support of students who decide to continue in the school's feeder pattern
32	Simplified McKay language	Scholarship language revised for clarification, alignment with the School Choice window, and to provide for more school options
