

## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

### Recommendation to Approve Agreement 59-101V - PRE-AP Program

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#### Introduction

##### Responsible: Procurement & Warehousing Services (PWS)

This request is to approve the recommendation to award the Agreement 59-101V - PRE-AP Program between The School Board of Broward County, Florida (SBBC), and College Board beginning May 1, 2019 through April 30, 2020. The objective of this program is to help students access and complete college-level work before leaving high school and to improve their college readiness. There is no previous agreement with College Board for these services. The spending authority requested for the term of this Agreement is \$ 6,400.

#### Goods/Services Description

##### Responsible: Academics and Pompano Beach High School (PBHS)

Pre-AP offers instructional frameworks and resources, student practice, and formative assessments in motivating, engaging courses that give ALL students the chance to learn the foundational knowledge and skills needed to be successful in AP and other college-level coursework.

Teachers of Pre-AP courses participate in a professional learning experience that gives them a foundation in the program. Pre-AP teachers have the opportunity to apply to be part of the Pre-AP National Faculty.

#### Procurement Method

##### Responsible: PWS

The requirement for a competitive solicitation is waived as authorized by Chapter 6A-1.012, Florida Administrative Code, Section 11(a) and School Board Policy 3320, Part II, Rule G.

#### Financial Impact

##### Responsible: PWS, Academics, and PBHS

The financial impact to Pompano Beach High School is \$6,400 as shown in the table below:
