# Recommendation to Approve Second Amendment and Additional Spending Authority 58-151V - Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University

#### Introduction: Responsible: Procurement and Warehousing Services (PWS)

This request is to approve the Second Amendment Agreement between Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University (ERAU) and The School Board of Broward County, Florida (SBBC). The agreement was approved on November 7, 2017, SBOM under item FF-2, beginning on January 4, 2018 through June 30, 2020, with an approved spending authority of \$18,031. The First Amendment was approved on August 21, 2018, RSBM item EE-7 with an approved additional spending authority of \$18,216.

The additional spending authority requested is \$35,612.

### Good/Services Description: Responsible: Secondary Learning

This Agreement will give Career, Technical & Adult Community Education (CTACE) students access to the college-level curriculum and college credit through a concurrent enrollment model. Students passing these college courses will earn an ERAU college credit that can be transferred to any Florida University. Embry Riddle will fund teacher training, teacher certification, course curriculum, course materials, and required technology and equipment to run the courses in the areas of aeronautics/aviation. The District will not pay individual tuition costs, but rather a per section fee to run these courses. This project will allow CTACE students who have not historically been able to take dual enrollment offerings the opportunity to engage in hands-on college-level work that will open a path to post-secondary options.

### Procurement Method Responsible: PWS

Direct negotiation was conducted with the vendor based on Purchasing Policy 3320. Pursuant to the Department of Education, Rule 6A-1.012, 11(b), Florida Administrative Code as authorized by Section 1010.04(4)(a), Florida Statues, and Purchasing Policy 3320, Section II, H, the requirement for requesting competitive solicitation for commodities or contractual services from three (3) or more sources is hereby waived as for the SBBC's purchase of educational services.

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# Financial Impact Responsible: PWS and Secondary Learning

The spending authority being requested is \$35,612, as detailed below.
