#### TITLE:

Recommendation to Approve Agreement - FY20-079 - College Preparatory Transition Deferment Program (CPTDP)

#### REQUESTED ACTION:

Approve the recommendation to award the above Agreement. Contract term: August 6, 2019 through June 15, 2022, 2 Years, 10 Months with an option for two (2) additional one (1) year renewal periods; User Department: Exceptional Student Learning Support (ESLS); Award Amount: \$149,559; Awarded Vendor(s): The District Board of Trustees of Broward College, Florida; Small/Minority/Women Business Enterprise Vendor(s): None.

#### SUMMARY EXPLANATION AND BACKGROUND:

The ESLS Department is expanding transition services by offering a new Transition Deferment Program for students who are interested in developing skills that will help them transition into an accredited college of their choice. This program will provide twenty-four (24) students with disabilities, who have deferred their high school diploma, to prepare for the transition into higher education with the opportunity to increase academic skills, executive functioning, and social-interpersonal skills necessary to transition successfully into college. Students will have the opportunity to experience college courses to help them determine a career path and course of study. These programs are sustainable year after year with full-time equivalent generated by the students.

This Agreement has been reviewed and approved as to form and legal content by the Office of the General Counsel.

This Agreement will be executed after School Board approval.

#### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

#### Recommendation to Approve Agreement FY20-079 - College Preparatory Transition Deferment Program (CPTDP)

#### Introduction

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#### Responsible: Procurement & Warehousing Services (PWS)

This request is to approve the recommendation to award the Agreement FY20-079 between The School Board of Broward County, Florida (SBBC), and The District Board of Trustees of Broward College, Florida (BC) for a period of two (2) years and ten (10) months, beginning August 6, 2019 through June 15, 2022, with an option for two (2) additional one (1) year renewal periods. Students who complete the College Preparatory Transition Deferment Program will have the opportunity to apply for admission into their college of choice as a degree or certificate-seeking student.

The requested spending authority is \$149,559.

#### Goods/Services Description Responsible: Exceptional Student Learning Support (ESLS)

#### College Prep Program:

Exceptional Student Learning Support (ESLS) Transition Department has been tasked with developing and offering more programs for students who choose to defer their high school diplomas. According to State mandates, students with an IEP that requires special education, transition planning, transition services, or related services through the age of twenty-one (21) may defer receipt of their standard diploma. Transition Deferment Programs must be designed to be within a results-oriented process that focuses on improving the academic and functional achievement of the child with a disability to facilitate the child's movement from school to post-school activities, including postsecondary education, vocational education, integrated employment (including supported employment), continuing and adult education, adult services, independent living or community participation.

The ESLS Department is expanding transition services by offering a new Transition Deferment Program for students who are interested in developing skills that will help them transition into an accredited college of their choice. This program will provide twenty-four (24) students with the opportunity to increase academic skills, executive functioning, and social-interpersonal skills necessary to transition successfully into college. Students will be on Broward College campus five (5) days a week working on developing math, reading, writing, self-advocacy skills, and learning strategies. They will have the opportunity to experience college courses to help students determine a career path and course of study. This program is designed to provide students the opportunity to prepare for their post-secondary education.

These programs are sustainable year after year with full-time equivalent generated by the students.

#### THE SCHOOL BOARD OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA

(hereinafter referred to as "SBBC"), a body corporate and political subdivision of the State of Florida, whose principal place of business is 600 Southeast Third Avenue, Fort Lauderdale, Florida 33301

and

## THE DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF BROWARD COLLEGE, FLORIDA

(hereinafter referred to "BC"), a political subdivision of the State of Florida, whose principal place of business is 225 East Las Olas Boulevard Fort Lauderdale, FL 33301

WHEREAS, BC enters into this Agreement to provide a College Preparatory Transition Deferment Program (CPTDP) to support up to 24 secondary district students with disabilities who have deferred their high school diploma to prepare for transition into higher education; and

WHEREAS, Students who complete the CPTDP will have the opportunity to apply for admission into their college of choice as a degree or certificate seeking student.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, in consideration of the premises and of the mutual covenants contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

#### **ARTICLE 1 - RECITALS**

1.01 <u>Recitals</u>. The parties agree that the foregoing recitals are true and correct and that such recitals are incorporated herein by reference.

#### ARTICLE 2 – SPECIAL CONDITIONS

2.01 <u>Term of Agreement</u>. Unless terminated earlier pursuant to Section 3.05 of this Agreement, the term of this Agreement shall commence on August 1, 2019 and conclude on June 15, 2022. The term of the Agreement may, by mutual agreement, in the form of a written amendment to this Agreement, between SBBC and BC be extended for two (2) additional one-year periods.

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### 2.02 SBBC Responsibilities.

(a) SBBC shall provide a certified ESE teacher and job coach to implement instruction and support students academic progress. Students will work on individualized academic intervention with a SBBC ESE teacher, in reading, math and writing. Students will also receive instruction implemented by SBBC ESE teacher and Job Coach in self-advocacy skills, college, career and work readiness.

(b) SBBC ESE specialist and ESE teacher will be responsible for the annual TIEP meetings with students and parents and implementation of goals.

(c) SBBC shall provide transporation for the students to and from BC south campus 5 days a week in coordinance with SBBC school calendar.

### 2.03 BC Responsibilities.

(a) BC shall provide a classroom on BC south campus for the ESE teachers, Job Coaches and students for implementation daily instruction.

(b) BC shall invite students enrolled in the CPTDP to visit at least two inclusive college classes per semester.

(c) CPTDP students will be enrolled in two (2) non-credit bearing BC continuing education college success skills course, designed to teach first year college students the necessary strategies in order to be successful in college.

(d) As registered students of continuing education, CPTDP students will have access to the BC student life center, inclusive co-curricular activities and campus amenties.

(e) Upon completion of the program students will have the opportunity to work directly with BC Students Services and Accessibility Resources staff to assist with their transition into college.

2.04 <u>SBBC Disclosure of Education Records and Employee Information</u>. Although no student education records shall be disclosed pursuant to this Agreement, should BC come into contact with education records during the course of contracted responsibilities, these records are confidential and protected by the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and state laws and may not be used or re-disclosed. Any use or re-disclosure may violate applicable federal and state laws. Likewise, no employee information shall be disclosed by SBBC to BC. Should BC come into contact with employee information, it may not be re-disclosed except as required or permitted by law.

2.05 <u>No Financial Arrangements</u>. This Agreement does not provide for any payment or exchange of money or financial obligations.

2.06 <u>Inspection of BC's Records by SBBC</u>. BC shall establish and maintain books, records and documents (including electronic storage media) sufficient to reflect all income and expenditures of funds provided by SBBC under this Agreement. All BC's applicable records, *Agreement with The District Board of Trustees of Broward College, Florida (FY20-079)* Page 2 of 10



regardless of the form in which they are kept, shall be open to inspection and subject to audit, inspection, examination, evaluation and/or reproduction, during normal working hours, by SBBC's agent or its authorized representative to permit SBBC to evaluate, analyze and verify the satisfactory performance of the terms and conditions of this Agreement and to evaluate, analyze and verify the applicable business records of BC directly relating to this Agreement in order to verify the accuracy of invoices provided to SBBC. Such audit shall be no more than one (1) time per calendar year.

(a) <u>Duration of Right to Inspect</u>. For the purpose of such audits, inspections, examinations, evaluations and/or reproductions, SBBC's agent or authorized representative shall have access to BC's records from the effective date of this Agreement, for the duration of the term of this Agreement, and until the later of five (5) years after the termination of this Agreement.

(b) <u>Notice of Inspection</u>. SBBC's agent or its authorized representative shall provide BC reasonable advance written notice (no less than two (2) weeks) of any intended audit, inspection, examination, evaluation and or reproduction.

(c) <u>Audit Site Conditions</u>. SBBC's agent or its authorized representative shall have access to BC's facilities and to any and all records related to this Agreement, and shall be provided adequate and appropriate work space in order to exercise the rights permitted under this section.

(d) <u>Failure to Permit Inspection</u>. Failure by BC to permit audit, inspection, examination, evaluation and/or reproduction as permitted under this section shall constitute grounds for termination of this Agreement by SBBC for cause and shall be grounds for SBBC's denial of some or all of any BC's claims for payment.

(e) <u>Inspection of Subcontractor's Records</u>. If applicable, BC shall require any and all subcontractors, insurance agents and material suppliers (hereafter referred to as "Payees") providing services or goods with regard to this Agreement to comply with the requirements of this section by insertion of such requirements in any written subcontract. Failure by BC to include such requirements in any subcontract shall constitute grounds for termination of this Agreement by SBBC for cause and shall be grounds for the exclusion of some or all of any Payees' costs from amounts payable by SBBC to BC pursuant to this Agreement and such excluded costs shall become the liability of BC.

(f) <u>Inspector General Audits</u>. BC shall comply and cooperate immediately with any inspections, reviews, investigations, or audits deemed necessary by the Florida Office of the Inspector General or by any other state or federal officials.

2.07 <u>Notice</u>. When any of the parties desire to give notice to the other, such notice must be in writing, sent by U.S. Mail, postage prepaid, addressed to the party for whom it is intended at the place last specified; the place for giving notice shall remain such until it is changed by written notice in compliance with the provisions of this paragraph. For the present, the Parties designate the following as the respective places for giving notice:

2.08 Background Screening. BC shall comply with all requirements of Sections 1012.32 and 1012.465, Florida Statutes, and all of its personnel who (1) are to be permitted access to school grounds when students are present, (2) will have direct contact with students, or (3) have access or control of school funds, will successfully complete the background screening required by the referenced statutes and meet the standards established by the statutes. This background screening will be conducted by SBBC in advance of BC or its personnel providing any services under the conditions described in the previous sentence. BC shall bear the cost of acquiring the background screening required by Section 1012.32, Florida Statutes, and any fee imposed by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement to maintain the fingerprints provided with respect to BC and its personnel. The parties agree that the failure of BC to perform any of the duties described in this section shall constitute a material breach of this Agreement entitling SBBC to terminate immediately with no further responsibilities or duties to perform under this Agreement. BC agrees to indemnify and hold harmless SBBC, its officers and employees from any liability in the form of physical or mental injury, death or property damage resulting from BC failure to comply with the requirements of this section or with Sections 1012.32 and 1012.465, Florida Statutes.

2.09 **Public Records.** The following provisions are required by Section 119.0701, Florida Statutes, and may not be amended. BC shall keep and maintain public records required by SBBC to perform the services required under this Agreement. Upon request from SBBC's custodian of public records, BC shall provide SBBC with a copy of any requested public records or to allow the requested public records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time at a cost that does not exceed the cost provided in Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, or as otherwise provided by law. BC shall ensure that public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of the Agreement's term and following completion of the Agreement if BC does not transfer the public records to SBBC. Upon completion of the Agreement, BC shall transfer, at no

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cost, to SBBC all public records in possession of BC or keep and maintain public records required by SBBC to perform the services required under the Agreement. If BC transfers all public records to SBBC upon completion of the Agreement, BC shall destroy any duplicate public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements. If BC keeps and maintains public records upon completion of the Agreement, BC shall meet all applicable requirements for retaining public records. All records stored electronically must be provided to SBBC, upon request from SBBC's custodian of public records, in a format that is compatible with SBBC 's information technology systems.

2.10 <u>Indemnification</u>. Each party agrees to be fully responsible for its acts of negligence, or its employees' acts of negligence when acting within the scope of their employment and agrees to be liable for any damages resulting from said negligence. This section shall survive the termination of all performance or obligations under this Agreement and shall be fully binding until such time as any proceeding brought on account of this Agreement is barred by any applicable statute of limitations.

2.11 **Insurance Requirements.** SBBC acknowledges that BC is a political subdivision of the State of Florida and warrants, and represents it participates in the Florida College Risk Management Consortium, with headquarters in Gainesville, Florida, for workers compensation, general liability and other coverage, with said protection being applicable to officers, employees, servants, and agents while acting within the scope of their employment BC. Its self-insured and various policies are authorized and stated in Florida Statutes, Section 1001.64(27) and Section 768.28. BC agrees to maintain its participation in the Florida College Risk Management Consortium for the duration of the Agreement. Furthermore, nothing contained herein shall be construed or interpreted as: (i) denying to either party any remedy or defense available under the laws of he State of Florida; (ii) the consent of BC to be sued; or (iii) a waiver of BC's sovereign immunity beyond the waiver provided in Section 768.28, Florida Statutes.

(i) SBBC reserves the right to review, reject or accept any of BC'spolicies of insurance, including limits, coverage or endorsements, herein throughout the term of this Agreement.

2.12 <u>Equal Opportunity Provision</u>. The parties agree that no person shall be subjected to discrimination because of age, race, color, disability, gender identity, gender expression, marital status, national origin, religion, sex or sexual orientation in the performance of the parties' respective duties, responsibilities and obligations under this Agreement.



2.13 <u>Annual Appropriation</u>. The performance and obligations of SBBC under this Agreement shall be contingent upon an annual budgetary appropriation by its governing body. If SBBC does not allocate funds for the payment of services or products to be provided under this Agreement, this Agreement may be terminated by SBBC at the end of the period for which funds have been allocated. SBBC shall notify the other party at the earliest possible time before such termination. No penalty shall accrue to SBBC in the event this provision is exercised, and SBBC shall not be obligated or liable for any future payments due or any damages as a result of termination under this section.

## ARTICLE 3 – GENERAL CONDITIONS

3.01 <u>No Waiver of Sovereign Immunity</u>. Nothing herein is intended to serve as a waiver of sovereign immunity by any agency or political subdivision to which sovereign immunity may be applicable or of any rights or limits to liability existing under Section 768.28, Florida Statutes. This section shall survive the termination of all performance or obligations under this Agreement and shall be fully binding until such time as any proceeding brought on account of this Agreement is barred by any applicable statute of limitations.

3.02 <u>No Third Party Beneficiaries</u>. The parties expressly acknowledge that it is not their intent to create or confer any rights or obligations in or upon any third person or entity under this Agreement. None of the parties intend to directly or substantially benefit a third party by this Agreement. The parties agree that there are no third party beneficiaries to this Agreement and that no third party shall be entitled to assert a claim against any of the parties based upon this Agreement. Nothing herein shall be construed as consent by an agency or political subdivision of the State of Florida to be sued by third parties in any matter arising out of any Agreement.

3.03 <u>Independent Contractor</u>. The parties to this Agreement shall at all times be acting in the capacity of independent contractors and not as an officer, employee or agent of one another. Neither party or its respective agents, employees, subcontractors or assignees shall represent to others that it has the authority to bind the other party unless specifically authorized in writing to do so. No right to SBBC retirement, leave benefits or any other benefits of SBBC employees shall exist as a result of the performance of any duties or responsibilities under this Agreement. SBBC shall not be responsible for social security, withholding taxes, contributions to unemployment compensation funds or insurance for the other party or the other party's officers, employees, agents, subcontractors or assignees.

The parties agree that, in the event that either party is in default of 3.04 Default. its obligations under this Agreement, the non-defaulting party shall provide to the defaulting party (30) calendar days written notice to cure the default. However, in the event said default cannot be cured within said thirty (30) calendar day period and the defaulting party is diligently attempting in good faith to cure same, the time period shall be reasonably extended to allow the defaulting party additional cure time. Upon the occurrence of a default that is not cured during the applicable cure period, this Agreement may be terminated by the non-defaulting party upon thirty (30) calendar days notice. This remedy is not intended to be exclusive of any other remedy, and each and every such remedy shall be cumulative and shall be in addition to every other remedy now or hereafter existing at law or in equity or by statute or otherwise. No single or partial exercise by any party of any right, power, or remedy hereunder shall preclude any other or future exercise thereof. Nothing in this section shall be construed to preclude termination for convenience pursuant to Section 3.05.

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3.05 <u>Termination</u>. This Agreement may be canceled with or without cause by BC or SBBC during the term hereof upon thirty (30) calendar days written notice to the other parties of its desire to terminate this Agreement. BCshall have no liability for any property left on BC'sproperty by any party to this Agreement after the termination of this Agreement. Any party contracting with BC's under this Agreement agrees that any of its property placed upon BC'sfacilities pursuant to this Agreement shall be removed within ten (10) business days following the termination, conclusion or cancellation of this Agreement and that any such property remaining upon BC's facilities after that time shall be deemed to be abandoned, title to such property shall pass to BC, and BC may use or dispose of such property as BC deems fit and appropriate.

3.06 <u>Compliance with Laws</u>. Each party shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, BC or SBBC policies, codes, rules and regulations in performing its duties, responsibilities and obligations pursuant to this Agreement.

3.07 <u>Place of Performance</u>. All obligations of SBBC under the terms of this Agreement are reasonably susceptible of being performed in Broward County, Florida and shall be payable and performable in Broward County, Florida.

3.08 <u>Governing Law and Venue</u>. This Agreement shall be interpreted and construed in accordance with and governed by the laws of the State of Florida. Any controversies or legal problems arising out of this Agreement and any action involving the enforcement or interpretation of any rights hereunder shall be submitted exclusively to the jurisdiction of the State courts of the Seventeenth Judicial Circuit of Broward County, Florida or to the jurisdiction of the United States District Court for the Southern District of Florida. Each party agrees and admits that the state courts of the Seventeenth Judicial Circuit of Broward County, Florida or the United States District Court for the Southern District of Broward County, Florida or the United States District Court for the Southern District of Broward County, Florida or the United States District Court for the Southern District of Broward County, Florida or the United States District Court for the Southern District of Broward County, Florida or the United States District Court for the Southern District of Broward County, Florida or the United States District Court for the Southern District of Florida shall have jurisdiction over it for any dispute arising under this Agreement.

3.09 <u>Entirety of Agreement</u>. This document incorporates and includes all prior negotiations, correspondence, conversations, agreements and understandings applicable to the matters contained herein and the parties agree that there are no commitments, agreements or understandings concerning the subject matter of this Agreement that are not contained in this document. Accordingly, the parties agree that no deviation from the terms hereof shall be predicated upon any prior representations or agreements, whether oral or written.

3.10 <u>Binding Effect</u>. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns.

3.11 <u>Assignment</u>. Neither this Agreement nor any interest herein may be assigned, transferred or encumbered by any party without the prior written consent of the other party. There shall be no partial assignments of this Agreement including, without limitation, the partial assignment of any right to receive payments from SBBC.

3.12 <u>Captions</u>. The captions, section designations, section numbers, article numbers, titles and headings appearing in this Agreement are inserted only as a matter of convenience, have no substantive meaning, and in no way define, limit, construe or describe the scope or intent of such articles or sections of this Agreement, nor in any way affect this Agreement and shall not be construed to create a conflict with the provisions of this Agreement.



3.13 <u>Severability</u>. In the event that any one or more of the sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses or provisions contained in this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, illegal, unlawful, unenforceable or void in any respect, such shall not affect the remaining portions of this Agreement and the same shall remain in full force and effect as if such invalid, illegal, unlawful, unenforceable or void sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses or provisions had never been included herein.

3.14 <u>Preparation of Agreement</u>. The parties acknowledge that they have sought and obtained whatever competent advice and counsel as was necessary for them to form a full and complete understanding of all rights and obligations herein and that the preparation of this Agreement has been their joint effort. The language agreed to herein expresses their mutual intent and the resulting document shall not, solely as a matter of judicial construction, be construed more severely against one of the parties than the other.

3.15 <u>Amendments</u>. No modification, amendment, or alteration in the terms or conditions contained herein shall be effective unless contained in a written document prepared with the same or similar formality as this Agreement and executed by each party hereto.

3.16 <u>Waiver</u>. The parties agree that each requirement, duty and obligation set forth herein is substantial and important to the formation of this Agreement and, therefore, is a material term hereof. Any party's failure to enforce any provision of this Agreement shall not be deemed a waiver of such provision or modification of this Agreement unless the waiver is in writing and signed by the party waiving such provision. A written waiver shall only be effective as to the specific instance for which it is obtained and shall not be deemed a continuing or future waiver.

3.17 **Force Majeure.** Neither party shall be obligated to perform any duty, requirement or obligation under this Agreement if such performance is prevented by fire, hurricane, earthquake, explosion, wars, sabotage, accident, flood, acts of God, strikes, or other labor disputes, riot or civil commotions, or by reason of any other matter or condition beyond the control of either party, and which cannot be overcome by reasonable diligence and without unusual expense ("Force Majeure"). In no event shall a lack of funds on the part of either party be deemed Force Majeure.

3.18 <u>Survival</u>. All representations and warranties made herein, indemnification obligations, obligations to reimburse BC or SBBC, obligations to maintain and allow inspection and audit of records and property, obligations to maintain the confidentiality of records, reporting requirements, and obligations to return public funds shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

3.19 <u>Agreement Administration</u>. SBBC has delegated authority to the Superintendent of Schools or his/her designee to take any actions necessary to implement and administer this Agreement.

3.20 <u>Counterparts and Multiple Originals</u>. This Agreement may be executed in multiple originals, and may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original, but all of which, taken together, shall constitute one and the same Agreement.



3.21 <u>Authority</u>. Each person signing this Agreement on behalf of either party individually warrants that he or she has full legal power to execute this Agreement on behalf of the party for whom he or she is signing, and to bind and obligate such party with respect to all provisions contained in this Agreement.


