





APPRENTICESHIP

FINANCIAL RESOURCES

CTACE supports CTE in grades 6-12 with the following resources:

Carl D. Perkins Federal Grant Secondary CTE Programs: \$2,463,155 (18-19 grant)

School Board Special Project Funding for CTE Expansion: \$1,200,000

Additional Financial Resources Needed: \$0

- ✓ Schools are expected to receive over \$7,000,000 from FLDOE CAPE Bonus FTE.
- ✓ Schools will invest approximately \$1,500,000 of this total to self maintain Industry Certification exams and Student Competitions.
- ✓ Schools will have money left for teacher bonuses, and CTE equipment.
- ✓ Self-sustainability will allow CTACE to expand program offerings.
- ✓ School labs can be updated and/or re-designed to create state-of-the art industry settings.
