PROMISE Program Changes

- A student committing more than one misdemeanor must be referred to the threat assessment team, which includes law enforcement, to determine if the act should be reported to law enforcement (Alignment to F.S. 1006.13)
- Students committing one of the revised 9 PROMISE eligible incidents shall be referred to the PROMISE program(Alignment to Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School Public Safety Commission Report, p.279, #1)
- Noncompliance with the PROMISE program requirements results in notification to the State Attorney's Office (Alignment to Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School Public Safety Commission Report, p.279, #2)
- PROMISE incidents shall accrue through 12th grade with a maximum of three (3) referral assignments to the program (Alignment to Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School Public Safety Commission Report, p.279, #3-4)
- PROMISE incidents are currently being reported to DJJ's Prevention Web System (Alignment to Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School Public Safety Commission Report, p.279, #5)
- The PROMISE program does not limit the discretion of law enforcement (Alignment to Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School Public Safety Commission Report, p.279, #6)



Highlighted Discipline Matrix Changes

- Increase in the number of incidents that qualify for possible or mandatory expulsion with continuing education services
- Incidents associated with potential threats require the convening of the threat assessment team to determine if the act shall be reported to law enforcement
- Use, possession, sale, and/or transmittal of e-cigarette, vapor devices and/or components of e-cigarettes, vapor devices or similar is now a new incident code with similar consequences as Tobacco
- Guidance on PROMISE eligible and SESIR level incidents are outlined
 on each school level's Discipline Matrix
- Consultation and referral to law enforcement is outlined in the Discipline Matrix



Discipline Overview

Incident	 Student commits a disciplinary incident School conducts a thorough investigation and notifies the parent School convenes the threat assessment team and/or consults with law enforcment, as appropriate
Suspension	 Student is issued the consequence and interventions as outlined in the Discipline Matrix Student is assigned to the appropriate suspension program (internal suspension, alternative to external suspension (AES), or PROMISE AES)
External Suspension	 Student is issued an external suspension if he/she refuses AES assignment or elects not to attend the assigned AES program Note: PROMISE AES assignments are mandatory and students must attend. Noncompliance shall result in a referral to the Juvenile Justice System of Care (JJSC) or State Attorney's Office, as appropriate
Law Enforcement	• When law enforcement is consulted, as prescribed by the Discipline Matrix, the student may receive criminal actions, including but not limited to, an arrest, in addition to the school-based consequence

WORDS TO KNOW



- E-Cigarettes: (Electronic Cigarette) is an electronic device containing a nicotine-based liquid that is vaporized and inhaled, used to simulate the experience of smoking tobacco.
- Vaping: the action or practice of inhaling and exhaling the vapor produced by an e-cigarette or similar device.
- JUUL: is a type of popular e-cigarette
- JUULing: a slang term for the recreational use of the leading brand of electronic cigarettes, JUUL
- JUUL Pods: cartridge that contains e-juice for the JUUL




WORDS TO KNOW




- Nicotine: a toxic colorless or yellowish oily liquid that is the chief active constituent of tobacco. It acts as a stimulant in small doses, but in larger amounts blocks the action of autonomic nerve and skeletal muscle cells. Nicotine is also used in insecticides.
- Vapor: a substance diffused or suspended in the air, especially one normally liquid or solid
- Aerosol: a substance enclosed under pressure and able to be released as a fine spray, typically by means of a propellant gas.
- E-juice: the liquid that is in an e-cigarette or JUUL Pod
- **Combustible Tobacco:** capable of igniting and burning and typically found in the found in tobacco cigarettes or pipe tobacco





Percentage of Florida High School Students Who:




Percentage of Florida High School Students Who Have:

Percentage of Florida Middle School Students Who Have:




TEEN E-CIG USERS ARE MORE LIKELY TO START SMOKING.*2






Parts in a basic E-Cigarette

- Battery
- Heater/Atomizer
- Cartridge

How an electronic cigarette works

Smokeless cigarettes, or electronic cigarettes, do not burn tobacco directly. They deliver nicotine into an atomizing chamber, where it is heated and turned into a vapor. The vapor is drawn into the body in the same way as a regular cigarette is smoked:





FOUR TYPES OF E-CIGARETTES












E-JUICE: SWEET FLAVORS ABOUND










E-CIGARETTE USE IS NOT SAFE FOR YOUNG PEOPLE







SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS TO LOOK FOR IN YOUR TEEN

- Psychological distress and lack of impulse control
 - Irritability, anger, impatience, anxiety
- Difficulty concentrating
 - Cognitive and performance impairment
- Change in hunger and eating patterns
 - Weight gain (loss)
- Increased craving for tobacco/nicotine
- Sudden interest in burning scented candles or incense
- Sudden use of cheap perfume/cologne
- Missing phone chargers
- Negative change in grades





BCPS RESPONSE

- Hosted the 6th Above the Influence March to emphasize being "above the influence" of substances including, e-cigarette/vaping and marijuana
- Creation of a THC Taskforce of internal and external stakeholder to develop a strategic plan related to electronic nicotine delivery systems
- Expanded the amount of resources/curriculum available on School Climate & Discipline Department's (SC&D) website (<u>https://www.browardschools.com/Page/38911</u>), SharePoint and CANVAS
- CATCH My Breath curriculum disseminated to schools, which focuses on increasing awareness and knowledge on the harms of e-cigarette and JUUL
- Ongoing ParentLink Awareness/Informational Notices



BCPS RESPONSE

- Presentations offered to schools through community partnerships with organizations, including, but not limited to, United Way, Hanley Foundation, Broward Sheriff's Office and the National Guard
- Heath Education teachers were trained on the CATCH curriculum and made aware of the future trends with ENDS
- Instructional Facilitator recently added to SC&D's staff with the function of substance abuse education, with an emphasis on ENDS education and prevention
- Ongoing Students Working Against Tobacco (SWAT) clubs to facilitate Teen Talk forums for parents and the larger community
- Expansion of secondary schools offering SWAT clubs
- Tobacco Cessation Programs to secondary level students are offered through Nova Southeastern University's Medical School

BCPS RESPONSE

- Ongoing professional development and informational sessions specific to e-cigarettes and vaping are coordinated by the Office of Academics and Student Support Initiatives & Recovery
- SC&D launched a Vaping Prevention PSA Contest opportunity for all secondary students – Winners will be announced at the RSBM on 5/21/19
- Revisions to Policy 5006: Suspension and Expulsion and creation of a specific incident code within the Discipline Matrix of the Code of Student Conduct for Use, Possession, Sale, and/or Transmittal of e-cigarette, vapor devices and/or components of e-cigarette, vapor devices or similar



BCPS FORTHCOMING RESPONSE

- Informational flyers/posters for students and parents marketed through schools, parent advisory groups, faith-based communities, homeowners associations, etc.
- Vaping Prevention Art Contest and second release of the PSA Prevention Contest
- Mini-Documentary
- Increase collaboration with cities to educate the public on the harms of ecigarettes
- Presentations to City and County Commissions to restrict, prohibit or increase the age requirement for sale of e-cigarette products to at least 21 years of age
- Petition City Commissioners to adopt an Electronic Nicotine Delivery System
 Resolution
- Engage in legislative action to prohibit online purchases from being delivered directly to homes and/or mail services



BCPS FORTHCOMING RESPONSE

- Host a Substance Abuse and Human Trafficking Conference January 2020
- Launch Hanley evidence-informed Marijuana Prevention Plus Wellness Program, targeting youth ages 8-18
- Launch a pilot elementary curriculum developed by CATCH My Breath
