Project Description	Provide educational oversight & services to at-risk female students between the ages of 12-18, in a prevention/intervention day treatment program. The Department of Equity & Diversity is responsible for monitoring the education and administrative support services for the students attending PACE. PACE is a volunteer day treatment program that is part of Florida Department of Juvenile Justice education program.
Evaluation Plan	SBBC will annually assess student achievement using District and State approved assessments such as the Florida Standards Assessment (FSA), End of Course Exam (EOC), number of High School Diplomas awarded, number of High School Equivalency Diplomas awarded, number of High School credits awarded as established by the Florida Department of Education and post-secondary career opportunities. During 2018-2019 school year, 176 youth were serviced, 330 high school credits were earned; 9 youth received a standard high school diploma; 176 youth were enrolled in CTE courses; 27 youths obtained employment.
Research Methodology	Florida State Statutes 1003.27 and 1003.51 support the rationale of this program, which mandate that the Department of Juvenile Justice and local school district collaborate to provide a free and public education to all youth in juvenile justice settings.
