This Memorandum of Agreement provides for one-time, non-recurring funding for support of youth mental health. This grant will support youth mental health training, suicide prevention and HOPE clubs, accelerating implementation of the District's mindfulness initiative, education on human trafficking, and trauma-based education initiatives. BCPS has requested a list of proposed expenditures to procure direct staff training, train-the-trainer staff training, curriculum, instructional materials for mental health, equipment for school based and newly hired referendum funded staff, teacher and school-based staff stipends, and the expansion of mental health and comprehensive wellness student clubs. The list of proposed expenditures is limited to non-recurring costs and do not include staff positions. Final approval of the allowable expenses will be determined by USF after submission.
