Project Description	The School Board of Broward County, Florida, has been awarded a grant for th total amount of \$363,000, which was approved by the board on June 25, 2019. Th grant is funded by CareerSource Broward from federal Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) funds. The program will serve students who meet WIOA eligibility requirements. The first Amendment to this Agreement extends the end date from June 30, 2020, to December 31, 2020, and modifies the budget with ne additional funds. The impact of the COVID-19 crisis postponed the planner student summer internships, which were to be funded by this grant. The extension will allow for students to engage in internships during the first semester of th 2020-2021 school year. The program design includes individual career pathway plans, employability skills development, financial literacy skills, and on-the-jot training delivered by BCPS employed teachers, counselors, and job coaches.
Evaluation Plan	Grant deliverables are reviewed by CareerSource Broward through monthly meetings with CTACE for quality control and grant compliance.
Research Methodology	According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics annual data, Florida yout unemployment rate for ages 16-19 was 29.2 percent and for ages 20-24 was 15.7 percent. Studies show that youth who drop out are more likely to be unemployed underemployed and incarcerated. High School dropouts are 72 percent more likely to be unemployed as compared to high schools graduates.
