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Project Description	Under the BEC Program, Broward College will offer coursework to help prepare teachers through a rigorous program of study and practice necessary to retain employment and earn their Initial Teaching Professional Certificate. The professional learning and coursework includes: 1) Instructional Strategies, 2) Classroom Management, 3) Foundations of Research Based Practices in Reaching Education, 4) Principles of Educational Psychology, 5) Educational Tests and Measurements, 6) Introduction to Exceptional Student Education, and 7) ESOL Issues and Strategies. Up to sixty-five eligible teachers will be able to participate in the BEC Program and these teachers' tuition will be paid for through Title II Part A.						
Evaluation Plan	Broward College will register participants in coursework, provide academic credit for courses taken, and notify SBBC if any participant fails to complete a course. Broward College will ensure completion of all required assessments described in the course syllabi to determine performance evaluations in the course.						
Research Methodology	The BEC program is for teachers who are paid instructional Broward County Public Schools employees who are teachers of record in a K-12 classroom and who need to complete the professional education coursework to partially meet the requirements for a Florida Professional Educator's Certificate.						
Alignment with Strategic Plan	This grant aligns with District Strategic Plan Goal 1: High-Quality Instruction by ensuring teachers take the necessary courses to obtain their Professional Educator's Certificate.
