## RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF ATTENDANCE AWARENESS MONTH SEPTEMBER 2020

WHEREAS, regular attendance is essential to student achievement and graduation, and is measured as being counted in attendance more than 95% of school days; and

WHEREAS, chronic absenteeism is identified as a student that is absent for 10 percent or more of school days for any reason, including suspensions, excused absences and unexcused absences. Just two or three days a month is a proven predictor of academic trouble and dropout rates; and

WHEREAS, we are committed to dedicating our resources and attention to reducing chronic absenteeism rates, with a focus starting as early as prekindergarten and kindergarten; and

WHEREAS, improving attendance rates and reducing chronic absenteeism in a community takes commitment, collaboration, and tailored approaches to barriers and strengths in each community; and

WHEREAS, the impact of chronic absence hits low-income students and children of color particularly hard if they do not have the resources to make up for lost time in the classroom and are more likely to face systemic barriers to getting to school or connecting to e-learning during a public health emergency; and

WHEREAS, chronic absence can be significantly reduced when schools, families, and communities work together to monitor and promote good attendance and address hurdles that keep children from getting to school; and

WHEREAS, schools and community partners can more frequently attempt to engage absent students to determine what barriers they face to attending school and what would help them attend more regularly; and

WHEREAS, health care providers and school nurses can share the importance of school attendance with families and can offer proactive, preventive care to reduce absences; and

WHEREAS, schools and districts must do more to track, calculate, and share the data on how many students are chronically absent so that we can see the attendance gaps and can deliver the right interventions to the right students;



## RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF DIGITAL CITIZEN WEEK OCTOBER 19 THROUGH OCTOBER 23, 2020

WHEREAS, digital media is driving significant changes to the ways children live and learn, and those changes bring exciting opportunities, such as new career paths and innovative means of self-expression; and

WHEREAS, studies show technology and media use begins at an increasingly young age, with as many as 38 percent of children under 2 years of age using mobile devices for media; and

WHEREAS, teenagers have been shown to use an average of nine hours of media daily, not including media use for school or homework; and

WHEREAS, digital media also poses potential dangers, including cyber bullying and exploitation, if not managed appropriately through education or other means; and

WHEREAS, when parents and educators are unaware of what activities are being conducted online, the result can be an increase in cyberbullying and online victimization; and

WHEREAS, the 2015 Youth Risk Behavior Survey shows that 12.5 percent of high schoolers and 14.5 percent of middle schoolers in Broward County report they have been electronically bullied; and

**WHEREAS**, on July 11, 2007, both the United States House and the Senate passed a resolution declaring November, National Homeless Youth Awareness Month; and

**WHEREAS**, as reported by the National Center for Homeless Education, according to the United States Department of ED Facts Initiative, more than 1.5 million children and youths were identified across the United States as homeless during the 17-18 school year; and

**WHEREAS**, over 96,000 school-aged children and youths were identified as homeless in the state of Florida during the 17-18 school year; and

**WHEREAS**, in Broward County Schools, 5435 students were identified as homeless during the 18-19 school year reflecting a 10.5% increase over SY17-18 (4917 students).

**WHEREAS**, of the 5435 students identified, 236 (4.4%) attended pre-school; 2928 (54%) attended elementary school, 1102 (20.3%) attended middle school and 1158 (21.3%) attended high school and centers, and 316 students were unaccompanied in that they did not reside with a parent or legal guardian; and

**WHEREAS**, of the 5435 students identified, 356 (6.6%) were unsheltered; 432 (8%) resided in motels and hotels; 510 (9.4%) resided in temporary shelters; and 4137 (76%) resided doubled-up out of economic necessity or similar situation; and

**WHEREAS**, youths of color, lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer and questioning (LGBTQ) students are disproportionately represented within the homeless youth population; and

**WHEREAS**, youths experiencing homelessness are 87% more likely to drop out of school; and

**WHEREAS**, Broward Schools' Homeless Education Assistance Resource Team (HEART) endeavors to increase identification of homeless children and youth (PreK-12) by educating District and school-based staff, and our community at large regarding the McKinney-Vento Act's definition of homelessness (amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act); and

**WHEREAS**, HEART seeks to empower homeless youth and families through educational advocacy, resources, community referrals, and increased emphasis on college, career and life readiness intended to break the strongholds of poverty and homelessness; and

**WHEREAS**, District and school-based staff in partnership with numerous community agencies, organizations and foundations endeavor to remove barriers faced by homeless children and youth by advocating for increased programs, goods and services meeting the physical, educational, social emotional, mental health, and housing needs of this vulnerable population; and

Children who have witnessed violence at home are also five times more likely to commit or suffer violence when they become older, 89% of teens between the ages of thirteen and eighteen say they have been in dating relationships and only half of all tweens (ages 11-14) claim to know the warning signs of a bad/hurtful relationship. One in three teenagers report knowing a friend or peer who has been hit, punched, kicked, slapped, choked or physically hurt by their partner. 42% of boys and 43% of girls say the abuse occurs in a school building or on school grounds. And, if trapped in an abusive relationship, 73% of teens said they would turn to a friend for help; but only 33% who have been in or known about an abusive relationship said they have told anyone about it; and,

**WHEREAS**, many teens living with dating violence do so in silence. Their silence is due to fear. As a community, we must not be silent on this issue and must actively promote dating violence awareness in addition to supporting and promoting programs offering vital prevention and assistance services to our community; and

## RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF CONCUSSION MANAGEMENT PROTOCOLS INCLUDING NEUROCOGNITIVE TESTING FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT ATHLETES

**WHEREAS**, a concussion is a disturbance in brain function that occurs following either a blow to the head, face, or neck or as a result of the violent shaking of the head or body; and

**WHEREAS**, a concussion resulting from playing in interscholastic sports may result in the rapid onset of neurological impairment and acute clinical symptoms such as chronic headache, fatigue, mental sluggishness, sleep difficulties, personality changes (e.g. increased irritability), sensitivity to light or noise, dizziness, and coordination difficulties as well as deficits in short term memory, concentration, problem solving, and general academic functioning that reflect a functional neurological disturbance; and

**WHEREAS**, the incidence of concussion leaves student-athletes vulnerable to conditions such as Second Impact Syndrome, which can result in death or permanent disability, or Post-Concussion Syndrome, which involves movement system, thinking, behavioral, and emotional difficulties that can last up to weeks, months, or even years after injury to the brain, should a student-athlete sustain a second concussion prior to the complete resolution of the primary injury; and

**WHEREAS**, concussion management protocols include:

- Agreement with Memorial Healthcare System/Joe DiMaggio Children's Hospital to provide state/nationally certified athletic trainers at all twenty-nine high schools. Athletic trainers serve as first responders for sports medicine issues including concussions,
- All student athletes participating in interscholastic sports shall be required as a participating condition to take a baseline neurocognitive test. The student athlete shall take a baseline neurocognitive every other year unless the student athlete sustained a concussion in the prior year, in which case a new baseline test shall be done. The neurocognitive test will aid in the evaluation of a concussed athlete's post injury condition and track their recovery for a safe return to play and thereby help to prevent or minimize the cumulative effects of concussion,

- Annual BCAA Athletic Directors & Coaches concussion education sponsored by the Department of Sports Medicine at NSU Florida, Memorial Healthcare System/Joe DiMaggio Children's Hospital and the Broward County Athletic Association will be held,
- Adhere to the National Operating Committee on Standards for Athletic Equipment (NOCSAE) to annually recondition every football helmet, while limiting the lifespan of football helmets to five years, and destroying all football helmets after the five-year period,

WHEREAS, the School Board of Broward County supports a comprehensive education campaign to increase awareness about concussion management, including prevention, symptoms and treatment developed with the assistance of Memorial Healthcare System / Joe DiMaggio Children's Hospital, NSU Florida, booster clubs and community organizations such as the Daniel Brett Foundation. These efforts will include all 29 public high school, with the intentions of at one point including the 42 public middle schools; and

WHEREAS, for the past three years, funding for the neurocognitive testing, called IMPACT, has been exclusively funded by NSU Florida; and

WHEREAS, the multiple healthcare providers in Broward county are cohesively working together to create the proper guidelines for care and prevention of Student-Athlete concussions and their overall health and well-being. This collaboration includes, but is not limited to, Memorial Healthcare System/Joe DiMaggio Children's Hospital, NSU Florida, Holy Cross and Cleveland Clinic Florida. This group can be classified as the medical component of the Broward County Public Schools Sports Medicine and Student Wellness Committee; and



WHEREAS, the Florida Legislature passed Florida Statute 383.50, *Treatment of Abandoned Newborns*, the Safe Haven Law, in July, 2000. Subsequently, in 2001 the Gloria M. Silverio Foundation, a 501(c)3 Florida not-for-profit organization, started the first major project, "A Safe Haven for Newborns", in response to the tragedy of newborn abandonment in Florida; and

WHEREAS, the Foundation started in Miami and today, through public awareness efforts, is in all 67 Florida counties, partnering with the Florida Fire Chiefs Association, Emergency Medical Services, many hospitals and other organizations and agencies throughout the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, Florida law states that a birth parent (mother or father) may anonymously leave an infant approximately seven days old or younger, and who does not appear to be abused or neglected, in the hands of staff at a fire station or hospital, letting that person know they are leaving the baby in a "safe haven", without fear of being arrested or charged with abandonment; and

WHEREAS, many hospital emergency rooms, fire stations, and ambulance stations have a sign identifying their building as a "Safe Haven for Newborn Station"; and

WHEREAS, the lifeline of the organization is the 24/7 statewide multilingual helpline, 1-877-767-BABY (2229), which was initially created to assist young mothers who were considering the "Safe Haven" option or wanted to know more about the law; and the organization has grown into helping pregnant girls/women or mothers in crisis or need covering a wide variety of issues; and the website <http://www.asafehavenfornewborns.com> has been established to assist in accessing information; and A Safe Haven for Newborns Community Service app has been developed to educate high school and higher education students while they earn their required service hours; and

WHEREAS, as of today over 324 babies have been saved from abandonment in the State of Florida; over 5,000 mothers have been assisted in their time of need or crisis; 72 mothers, their anonymity not a concern, chose to place their baby directly with a licensed adoption agency, 5 parents successfully regained their parental rights; and 44 newborns were saved from abandonment in other states, and one saved in the country of Honduras, securing their future; and

WHEREAS, WHO (World Health Organization) recognizes that asthma is a major public health importance; and


WHEREAS, the annual health care cost of asthma is approximately \$56 billion dollars; and



## THE OLD DILLARD MUSEUM FLORIDA EMANCIPATION DAY CELEBRATION

**WHEREAS**, the struggle for equality and justice has been and continues to be a grand inspiration in the hearts, minds and endeavors of people of all races, creeds, and colors in the development of nations, cultures and the stability of economic systems; and

**WHEREAS**, the history of the emancipation of people of African descent has been a powerful and provocative lesson in human rights in this state, in our nation, and in the Western Hemisphere; and

**WHEREAS**, in this state all Blacks were emancipated from slavery by the enforcement of the Emancipation Proclamation, an executive order of President Abraham Lincoln during the Civil War; and

**WHEREAS**, enacted nearly two and a half years before it could be fully enforced, the proclamation was not totally applied in the state of Florida when it was signed on January 1, 1862, because this state was able to hold its capitol city as a Confederate state throughout the Civil War that split this nation; and

**WHEREAS**, The Knott House Museum in Tallahassee and the Florida Secretary of State each year re-enact U.S. Army Brigadier General Edward Moody McCook reading an order on May 20, 1865, that emancipated all Blacks in the State as part of re-affirming the state of Florida as a part of the United States; and

**WHEREAS**, Broward County Public Schools has made notable efforts to preserve and infuse the history of Africans and African-Americans in its curriculum, its classrooms, and in its support of African American heritage, including its support of the Old Dillard Museum, a site listed on the National Register of Historic Places as the first public schoolhouse for Blacks in Broward County; and

**WHEREAS**, the Old Dillard Museum and a host of its community supporters wish to joyfully recall the opportunities and responsibilities that emancipation afforded to African-Americans in the state, the nation, and throughout the Western Hemisphere by holding a celebration on the museum site, showcasing aspects of our history, music, and literature, and

**WHEREAS**, a Florida Emancipation Day Celebration will be held at Old Dillard Museum on Saturday, June 19, 2021, that honors the tradition of giving all people the opportunity to manage their own lives, to choose their own professions, and to enhance the development of their own cultural pursuits.





## RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF JUNETEENTH AWARENESS MONTH JUNE 2021

**WHEREAS**, as "Juneteenth Independence Day" in recognition of June 19, 1865, the date on which slavery legally came to an end in the United States; and

**WHEREAS**, approximately eleven and one-half million people of African descent survived the voyage to the New World, the number that died is likely greater, only to be subjected to murder, beatings, branding, rape, tearing apart of families and forced to submit to slavery for more than 200 years after arrival in the United States; and

**WHEREAS**, news of the end of slavery did not reach the frontier areas of the United States, in particular the State of Texas and the other Southwestern States, until months after the conclusion of the Civil War, more than 2½ years after President Abraham Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation on January 1, 1863; and

**WHEREAS**, slavery was not officially abolished until the ratification of the 13th Amendment to the Constitution of the United States in December 1865; and

**WHEREAS**, The "19th of June" or Juneteenth Independence Day, along with the "4th of July", completes the cycle of freedom for America's Independence Day observances. "Until All are Free, None are Free" is an oft repeated maxim that can be used to highlight the significance of the end of the era of slavery in the United States; and

**WHEREAS**, through other systems of oppression, such as sharecropping, Jim Crow, redlining, and mass incarceration, the plunder of black wealth and black persons continued past slavery and persists to this day, affecting the physical and mental health, safety, and education of African Americans; and


**WHEREAS**, liberation from these systems of oppression must include political, economic, and educational liberation. This liberation is manifested in ways such as culturally responsive schools, financial literacy, access to loans, jobs, and the means of self-improvement, and the ability to own the land in one's own neighborhood.
