MONTH IN REVIEW

At the close of July, many of South Florida's small businesses have re-opened in some capacity and are showing signs of impending optimism. Even while facing ongoing challenges related to the pandemic and sheltering intensified concerns relative to the economic and financial toll, most are making – or plan to make – adaptions regarding business operations to survive the test of time.

According to the <u>MetLife & U.S. Chamber of Commerce Small Business Coronavirus Impact Poll</u>, one in five small businesses reported a temporary closure at some point since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic (23%), 43% have re-opened. "Businesses across the country are beginning to re-open but see a long road ahead," said Tom Sullivan, Vice President of Small Business Policy, U.S. Chamber of Commerce. Two-thirds (66%) are concerned about potential closure or staying closed if there is a second wave of the coronavirus.



A supportive environment for the small business community remains at the forefront of the Economic Development & Diversity Compliance Department's (EDDC) focus. This month, the team reached more than 1000 suppliers through weekly email campaigns identifying available funding sources, procurement opportunities, professional development training, entrepreneurial workshops, and business support services. EDDC also made multiple outreach calls to encourage certified suppliers to participate in pending opportunities.

Through remote vehicles, EDDC continued to deliver its core services to include small/minority/women business enterprise certifications, bids notifications, technical assistance, targeted outreach, and

assisting buying agencies with identifying certified suppliers.

MEET THE SMALL BUSINESS ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Small Business Advisory Committee (SBAC) is a volunteer group appointed by The Schools Board of Broward County, FL (SBBC), to serves as an advisory team for the Supplier Diversity Outreach Program (SDOP) managed by the Economic Development & Diversity Compliance Department. The committee is actively engaged and is primarily responsible for encouraging the inclusion of small, minority, and women-owned (SMWBE) businesses in the District's spend, monitoring the utilization of available SMWBE firms within the market area, evaluating the effectiveness of the SDOP, and providing recommendations for best practices and benchmarking for a successful small business program. The SBAC work diligently with the EDDC in its efforts to heighten the visibility of Broward County Public Schools as a pillar institution that values diversity and inclusion.

SBAC meetings are hosted monthly. All meetings are open to the public. View upcoming meetings dates or email EDDC for more information.
