EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Recommendation for Additional Spending Authority AG20-036 – Instructional Materials Five – Year Plan School Year 2020-2025

Introduction

Responsible: Procurement & Warehousing Services (PWS)

This request is to approve the Additional Spending Authority for the Five (5) Year Instructional Materials Implementation plan resulting from the revised Florida instructional materials adoption schedule for adoption years 2019-2020 through 2024-2025. The item was approved at the Regular School Board Meeting on March 19, 2019, under item FF-1, with an approved spending authority of \$8,563,278.

The additional spending authority being requested is \$2,424,541.

Goods/Services Description Responsible: Innovative Learning

This plan includes the purchase of gap materials while also purchasing specific curriculum area materials. Florida Statute 1006.40(5) requires multiple steps in the approval process to ensure input from all

stakeholders, which includes:

- Online access to student editions of the committee recommended instructional materials for twenty (20) days.
- An open, noticed Public Hearing during which the public may comment on the recommended instructional materials (February 5, 2019).
- An open, notice School Board Meeting to approve an annual instructional materials plan to identify any instructional materials that will be purchased through the District's instructional materials review process (March 19, 2019).

Procurement Method Responsible: PWS

According to Purchasing Policy 3320, Part 2, H: "The requirement of requesting competitive solicitations from three (3) or more sources is hereby waived as authorized by chapter 6A-1.012 (F.A.C.) State Board of Education Administrative rules for the purchase of educational services and any type of copyrighted materials."

Financial Impact

Responsible: PWS and Innovative Learning

The additional total spending authority being requested is \$2,424,541 as detailed below. The funding will be taken from the Florida Department of Education categorical instructional materials allocation.

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Explanation:

1) The need for additional spending authority results from unforeseen additional instructional materials and their digital counterparts that are needed to fill in the remaining gap years for mathematics, as well as additional materials for Dual Language programs, all needed for eLearning due to COVID-19. The items include HMH Math Algebra 2 and Geometry Honors, Study Edge (Algebra Nation), Dual Language Go Math in Spanish, and Teacher Created Materials for Dual Language Social Studies. There are additional invoices for the STEMScopes deferred payment year three (3), as well as freight that was not included in the Board item for World Language adoption.
