

### **Item II-3. Use of School Facilities for Public Hurricane/Disaster Evacuation Shelter Agreement Executive Summary - Continued**

The School Board of Broward County, Florida (SBBC) will enter into an agreement with Broward County (County) for utilization of School Facilities for Public Hurricane/Disaster Evacuation Shelters. The County is responsible for providing emergency services to all general population residents, special needs residents, tourists and visitors of Broward County before, during and after a potential hurricane or other disaster.

Per Florida Statute, section 252.38 (1)(d), during a declared state or local emergency and upon the request of the Director of a Local Emergency Management Agency, SBBC shall participate in emergency management by providing school facilities and necessary personnel to staff such facilities.

The County will designate no less than two (2) Shelter Managers per Shelter and the District will provide two (2) Facility Managers per Shelter. School Principals and Assistant Principals are designated as Facility Managers. The District will provide four (4) Facility Servicepersons for each Special Needs Shelter and two (2) Facility Servicepersons for each General Population and Pet-Friendly Shelter. One electrician, one HVAC mechanic and one plumber will be assigned to work in each Special Needs Shelter. One Maintenance Technician will be assigned to work in each General Population and Pet-Friendly Shelter. One Food Service Manager and four food service assistants will provide meals to shelter occupants both at General Population and Special Needs Shelters. At anytime either party may request modifications to staffing for any activated shelter.

In coordination with District personnel, the County will coordinate with law enforcement in reference to public safety concerns at all activated shelters. The County will pay the School Board for any and all damages occurring as a result of the County's use of School Facilities as Hurricane Shelters, excluding damages which occurred as a direct result of an applicable hurricane or other disaster. The School District shall submit any request for reimbursement to the County within one hundred twenty (120) days following the end of the emergency period.
