EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Recommendation to Approve First Amendment to the Agreement FY20-085 – Development of Student-Owned and Operated Businesses Curriculum Program

Introduction

Responsible: Procurement & Warehousing Services (PWS)

This request is to approve the First Amendment to the Agreement between Network for Teaching Entrepreneurship, Inc.(NFTE), and The School Board of Broward County, Florida (SBBC). The agreement was approved at the Regular School Board Meeting on July 23, 2019, under item EE-9, starting August 1, 2019 through July 31, 2022, with an approved spending authority of \$255,000. The agreement provides entrepreneurship programs that inspire young people from under-resourced communities to stay in school, to recognize business opportunities, and to plan for successful futures.

The purpose of this Amendment is to amend the schools enrolled in the program. Schools being added are Attucks Middle Schools, Henry D. Perry Education Center, Boyd Anderson High School (includes Lauderdale Lakes Middle School), Fort Lauderdale High School (includes Sunrise Middle School), Western High School (includes Indian Ridge Middle School) and Coconut Creek High School (includes Margate MS & Silver Lakes MS).

There is no additional financial impact to the District.

Goods/Services Description Responsible: Career, Technical, Adult and Community Education (CTACE)

The NFTE program allows students to experience and learn the development and operation of entrepreneurship. Project-based learning and other guided classroom activities culminate in a regional competition, where students present their business plans and product designs. All schools were vetted as to their interest and commitment to the fidelity of the program. Based on this process, schools accepted to participate. The list of schools included in the program are:
