Financial Impact Statement	This proposal would result in a positive financial impact for the District to continue funding the 60 mental health positions that were established SY 20 to expand the provision of mental health services to students and families in Broward County Public Schools.

Program Description	<p>Broward County Public Schools (BCPS) recognizes that an inclusive approach to the delivery of mental health services is essential to student success and requires the involvement of our community partners, employees, and families. BCPS Mental Health Assistance Allocation Plan includes detailed information regarding the delivery of evidence-based mental health services; current supports that address mental health needs; collaborative partnerships with community providers and agencies; and the process for coordinating mental health services with a student’s primary care provider and other mental health providers. The Social/Emotional Learning (SEL) and Reimagining Middle Grades initiatives are mental wellness approaches that will bridge into the additional supports provided by this proposal. The proposal provides additional support for Tier 1, Tier 2, and Tier 3 mental health interventions.</p> <p>This plan allowed for the hiring of up to 60 new staff in Student Support Initiatives & Recovery, Employee Assistance Program, and Exceptional Student Learning Support through the categorical funding, to implement services with fidelity.</p> <p>Charter Schools, <u>who chose to opt out of the District’s Plan</u>, are required to send their Governing Body approved Mental Health Plan to the District, to be attached to BCPS’ Plan, for submission to the State.</p>
