

## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Status	Approve the first annual renewal to Agreement (19-CP-CSA-8267-02) between Broward County (Children’s Services Administration Section [CSAS]) and The School Board of Broward County, Florida (SBBC).
Funds Requested	\$170,000
Financial Impact Statement	<p>There is a positive financial impact to the District of \$170,000 and a match of \$170,00 from the District.</p> <p>On September 13, 2018, the Broward County Board of County Commissioners approved funding recommendations made by the Broward County Behavioral Health Services (<i>Children’s Services Administration Section [CSAS]</i>) for The School Board of Broward County, Florida Family Counseling Program (FCP) to receive a grant in the amount of \$1,175,902 with a two-year renewal option. Subsequently, December 10, 2019 both parties agreed to increase the grant funding to \$1,500,000 while exercising the first renewal option. FCP is requesting to exercise the first renewal option by further increasing grant funding amount to \$1,670,000.</p>

Program Description	<p>The Broward County Children’s Services Administration Section grant provides funding to support programs and services that provide individual and family counseling, in school settings, for children and youth, ages 2 to 17 or through age 21 if enrolled in a school GED course or vocational school. The Family Counseling Program (FCP) is available to all students and families of Broward County, whether students are enrolled in public, private, or charter schools. Services include individual and family counseling utilizing evidence-based treatment modalities including trauma focused cognitive behavior therapy (TF-CBT). The family therapists also provide crisis intervention and management particularly in the areas of suicidal, self-destructive, and bullying behaviors.</p> <p>Since the inception of the first Family Counseling center in 1980, the FCP has expanded to 40 centers strategically placed across the county geographically into catchment areas that correspond with the School District’s system of Innovation Zones. The FCP utilizes the professional skills of 58 Masters level, licensed therapists. Receiving this additional awarded grant amount will allow the District to continue its effort in providing family counseling services to students and families.</p>
