Foreward

The mission of the Grants Administration and Government Programs (GAGP) Department is to maximize resources available to the school district to improve educational services and to ensure accountability in the use of those resources. The Annual Report of Grant Activity for 2009-10 highlights the results of our efforts to fulfill this mission. The Annual Report has been prepared to provide a historical perspective of the District's grant funding and to illustrate the important role grant programs play in meeting strategic district goals and school improvement plans. The report highlights the District's grant funding accomplishments.

The report provides individual grant profiles detailing information on projects that were operational in Broward County Public Schools during the school year, between July 1, 2009 and June 30, 2010. This document is a product of the Grant Retrieval, Analysis, Notification, and Tracking System (GRANTS) database, maintained by GAGP. The database information utilized in this report was gathered from Board Agenda Item Request forms, grant applications or contracts, award documents, and feedback from project managers.

This report illustrates the District's astonishing efforts in securing external resources to support programs that focus on student-centered education, teacher development, school security, and other initiatives to meet the specific needs of the students of the Broward County Schools. The GAGP Department is pleased to recognize the outstanding efforts of the many school and district staff who have contributed to the development and acquisition of grants funding during the 2009-10 fiscal year. Together, we are truly making a difference in the lives of Broward County students.

Grants Administration and Government Programs

Broward County Public Schools' Grants Administration and Government Programs (GAGP) Department is responsible for assuring that schools have the opportunity to participate in grant programs which are available through federal, state, local, and private sources. The Department maintains information relative to existing and pending legislation regarding grants and communicates this information to appropriate departments and personnel. The staff provides:

- Grant Development and Submission Assistance
- Classroom & School-wide Funding Information
- State-of-the-Art Grants Research
- Nuts & Bolts Post Award Assistance
- Grant Funding Forecast for School Planning

The GAGP Department is assisted by a cadre of Grant Liaisons, who are assigned at every school, to disseminate grant information and serve as the main source of communication with the schools regarding grant programs.

Annual Report Summary

Broward County Public Schools strives to provide the highest quality education for all students in the District. Through the hard work and dedication of District and school staff, supported by GAGP, the District was able to generate proposals for both formula and competitive grants that secured over **\$393,616,641** in funding from federal, state, and local agencies; foundations; and the corporate community.

Total grant funding for 2009-10 was approximately \$217,212,560 higher than the previous year, due mostly to the increase in education funding through the American Recovery and Reinvention Act (ARRA). Grant funding secured through District efforts helped to support 215 projects that enhanced student achievement, advanced school improvement plans, and supported District initiatives.



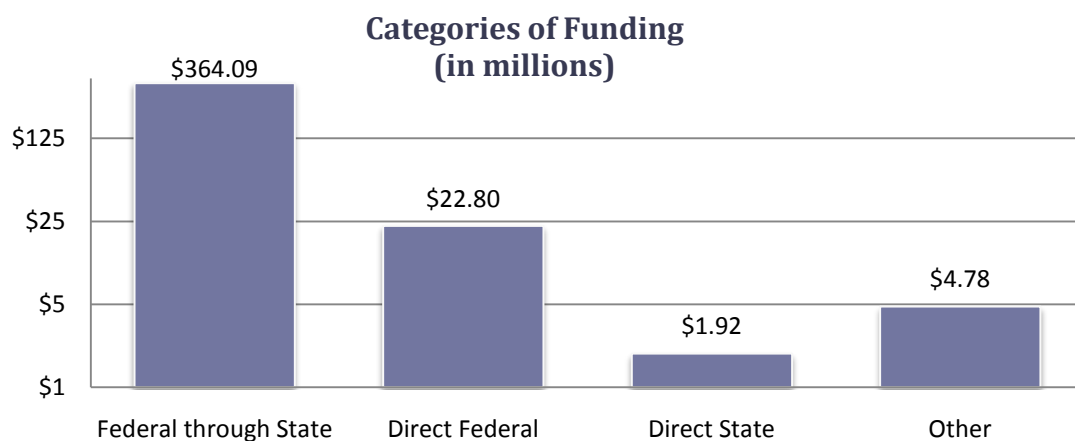
The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) is a federal bill that was signed into law on February 17, 2009. This bill provides new, one-time funding for school districts. Of the total funds that the District secured in 2009-10, \$212,484,896 were part of the ARRA economic stimulus and education initiative. These ARRA funds flowed through to the District through multiple programs, some pre-existing (including Title I and Individuals with Disabilities Act) and some brand new (State Fiscal Stabilization Fund). The overarching goals of the funds were to save jobs and spur innovation. Additional guidance from the US Department of Education identified four areas of assurances that school districts must focus the funds on: improving the quality of standards and assessments, improving local data systems, improving teacher effectiveness, and supporting struggling schools.

Sources of Funding

During the 2009-10 school year, the District received a total of \$36,624,001 through competitive grant programs excluding ARRA funding, representing approximately 21% of total grant funds excluding ARRA funding. This is a slight decrease of 3.5% in grant competitive grant funding over the previous year. In order to receive these funds, the District submitted grant applications which competed with other school districts, institutions of higher education, and/or non-profit organizations on the local, state, and national level. An estimated 50% of all competitive grant proposals submitted this year (not including continuations) were selected for funding. This rate is a higher than average success rate for competitive grant proposals.

The District receives four different types of grant funding: 1) Direct Federal includes grants awarded directly to the school district by a unit of the Federal Government; 2) Federal through State comprise federal funds awarded to the District through the State of Florida as an intermediary; 3) Direct State includes state funding awarded to the District; and 4) Other includes grant awards made by local governments, corporations, and private foundations.



The **Federal through State** category accounted for the largest sum of funding for the District at a total of \$364.1 million. This category includes many formula and ARRA grant programs, such as the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), Title I, Carl D. Perkins grants, and Dale Hickman Excellent Teaching Program, . Additionally, the District received competitive funding in this category through the Public Charter School Federal Grant Program, Florida Teacher Quality Program, and the 21st Century Community Learning Centers Program.

The **Direct Federal** category was the next largest category with \$22.8 million of grant funding received from federal agencies. A large portion of the funds awarded were for the Head Start Program which received over \$14.9 million in grant funding including ARRA funding. The District successfully obtained competitive funds through a variety of U.S. Department of Education programs, including Teaching American History, Transition to Teaching, Smaller Learning Communities, Partnerships in Character Education, Early Reading First, and Safe Schools/Healthy Students.

The Florida Department of Education and other **Direct State** funding sources provided the District with \$1.92 million in grant funding. This category included formula grants such as the Adults with Disabilities Program, through which the District received over \$1.4 million, as well several competitive funding including Collaborative Curriculum Challenge Grant, and Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program.

Under the **Other Funding** category, local public funding totaled \$4.78 million during the 2009-10 fiscal year. Primary funding agencies through this source included local governmental sources, which totaled \$4,120,438,

such as the Early Learning Coalition, the Children's Services Board of Broward County, Workforce One, and City governments. Private foundations and corporations provided \$656,034, including awards from A.D. Henderson Foundation, Hazelden Foundation, Hewlett Packard Corporation, American Institute of Aeronautics Foundation, The Disney Company and Youth Service America, Target Corporation, MDRC, Dollar General, ING Corporation, Boston Foundation, Toshiba America Foundation, Jim Moran Foundation, Kids in Need Foundation, Lennar Foundation, Wal-mart Foundation, FPL Group Foundation, Wachovia Bank, Schwab Charitable Fund, AT&T Foundation, Lowe's Charitable and Educational Foundation, the National Education Association, the Community Foundation of Broward County, and others.

The purpose of the Adult General Education (AGE) grant program is to assist adults in becoming literate and obtaining the knowledge and skills necessary for employment and self-sufficiency, assist adults who are parents obtaining the educational skills necessary to become full partners in the educational development of their children, and assist adults in completing high school or the equivalent. Broward's program enhanced curriculum, instruction, and assessment of students enrolled in Adult Education programs; assisted in raising the educational level, job placement, and/or career advancement of adults; provided a research-based reading program for adults; provided a public awareness campaign encouraging adults with basic skills to enroll in programs; and provided staff development for administrators, teachers, and volunteers. Program Description:

The purpose of the Adults with Disabilities grant program is to provide adults with disabilities the opportunity for enhancement of skills that are consistent with their abilities and needs. Broward's program provided for 865 adult students with disabilities. The educational goal of the program was for every student to become an active participant and contributing member of society. In order for students, particularly those with moderate to severe disabilities, to achieve this goal, the curriculum extended beyond the classroom and school and into the surrounding community to ensure the development of critical daily living skills. The curriculum for the Adults with Disabilities program was based on teaching functional activities in the classroom and through community participation that facilitates acquisition of skills needed to gain self-sufficiency in students' daily lives. Adult and computer literacy instruction, daily living skills, workforce preparation, supported employment, and community leisure recreation skills.
