<u>Background:</u> This item is being recommended for School Board approval to meet requirements for revised job title, job description and revisions to minimum qualifications.

The job description has been updated to more accurately reflect that this position has accountabilities that imply a comprehensive knowledge of the District's facilities planning and programming as it relates to the Educational Plant Survey and the Five-Year District Educational Facilities Plan. Both represent two important aspects for developing appropriate housing of educational programs, student population, the faculty, administrators, staff and ancillary services required for the School District.

The revisions to the job description do not result in a recommendation to upgrade the job from its current pay grade level.
