The Basic School Health Services allocation through the BCHD will fund a 1.0 FTE Program Manager and 27 agency HST's under the supervision of 5 agency Registered Nurses. The following schools will receive Basic School Health Services though this staffing model: Gator Run Elementary, Fox Trail Elementary, Flamingo Elementary, Tequesta Trace Middle, Walter C. Young Resource Center, Deerfield Beach Elementary, Oakland Park Elementary, Winston Park Elementary, Oakridge Elementary, Olsen Middle, Bethune Elementary, Bennett Elementary, North Andrews Garden Elementary, Wilton Manors Elementary, Attucks Middle, Driftwood Middle, Sheridan Park Elementary, Hollywood Hills Elementary, Croissant Park Elementary, Dillard Elementary, Walker Elementary, Sunland Park Elementary, Stephen Foster Elementary, Horizon Elementary, Plantation Elementary, Village Elementary, and Welleby Elementary. High schools (16) will be eliminated from current funding for Basic School Health, with the exception of Coconut Creek High which is a comprehensive school and Coral Springs High, which is a requirement of the taxing authority for CSC. On-Call Services will be provided by RN's for all schools without on-site health service personnel. The BCHD will continue to provide on-site health service personnel on-site.

Basic School Health Services to 85 schools with an on-site HST with RN supervision will continue to be provided by current funding partners. The Childrens' Services Council (CSC) will allocate funding of approximately 1.1 million to provide direct on-site health care personnel to 45 schools, (elementary and middle schools). Community agencies are expected to receive this funding to provide the services.

The BCHD's policy is to execute an agreement only after the other party signs therefore the BCHD will execute this agreement after the School Board approves. This agreement has been reviewed and approved as to form and legal content by the School Board Attorney.
