Project Description	Helping Abused, Neglected, Disadvantaged Youth, Inc. (HANDY) implements the Life Skills component of the CTACE departments Innovative Concepts (iCon) Program that serves at risk juniors and seniors. The iCon program is funded by the Workforce Investment Act (WIA) Grant, through the Broward Workforce Development Board (this includes funding for this HANDY agreement). HANDY has been providing these services to the eight iCon Program schools through the original agreement approved by the board on 08/20/13. Those eight schools are: Blanche Ely, Boyd Anderson, Deerfield Beach, Dillard, Hallandale, McArthur, Plantation, and Stranahan. Through this amendment, HANDY will provide Life Skills instruction during the afterschool iCon Program for one hour per day, one day per week for 13 weeks at two additional high schools: Fort Lauderdale and Piper. The two new schools are being added because the Broward Workforce Development Board severed an agreement with a non-school board provider and is funding iCon to continue services to these students.	
Evaluation Plan	The iCon program has specified deliverables that are set by the Broward Workforce Development Board, and are monitored by Workforce One to assure iCon is operating within the grant guidelines.	
Research Methodology	The research methodology regarding the evaluation plan is developed by the Broward Workforce Development Board in alignment with the Federal Grant Guidelines under which they operate.
