TITLE: New Agreement between The School Board of Broward County, Florida and Broward College									
REQUESTED ACTION: Approve the new agreement between The School Board of Broward County, Florida and Broward College. The agreement period upon execution by both parties through June 30, 2015.									
SUMMARY EXPLANATION AND BACKGROUND: Broward College, Talent Development and the Office of Academics will partner to provide professional learning opportunities for mathematics and science teachers at Lauderhill 6-12 and pre-service teachers at Broward College. This initiative will provide an innovative, student-centered learning community approach in which both pre-service and in-service teachers will collaborate to implement the Project Lead the Way (PLTW) program at Lauderhill 6-12. PLTW is an integrated engineering program offered within mathematics and science and Broward College will train pre-service teachers in PLTW prior to clinical placement at Lauderhill 6-12. Additionally, Broward College's Exceptional Student Education (ESE) pre-service teachers will support struggling students in all curriculum areas at Lauderhill 6-12. Broward College and Broward County Public Schools (BCPS) will co-sponsor the cost of the professional learning and each provides \$12,500 to a fund for related expenses for a total fund of \$25,000. This agreement has been reviewed and approved as to form and legal content by the Office of the General Counsel.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Below is an executive summary of the Agreement between The School Board of Broward County, Florida and Broward College, which supports the delivery of the Project Lead the Way (PLTW) engineering program and struggling students in all curriculum areas.

Program Description	<p>Broward College pre-service teachers will partner with BCPS and Talent Development to provide support for the Project Lead the Way (PLTW) implementation at Lauderhill 6-12 STEM MED Magnet School. PLTW provides students with foundational knowledge and technology-integrated applications of engineering and its use and effects on society. PLTW has a strong focus in entrepreneurship, mentoring and leadership while providing students with transferable skills in the understanding and use of technological tools including software and hardware. Broward College will provide pre-service teachers with PLTW training prior to clinical placement at Lauderhill 6-12. Additionally, Broward College's Exceptional Student Education (ESE) pre-service teachers will support struggling students in all curriculum areas at Lauderhill 6-12.</p> <p>Broward College and BCPS will each contribute \$12,500 to create a \$25,000 professional development fund for use in supporting the professional learning of both Lauderhill 6-12 and the Broward College pre-service teachers.</p> <p>This Agreement will provide for support of the implementation of the PLTW curricula with fidelity.</p>
Evaluation Plan	The teachers' individual Professional Growth Plan (PGP) (required by Florida Statute 1012.984 (b)(5)) is used by to collect, analyze, and interpret data to guide professional learning at the school and to seek professional development at the school or district level. Site-based plans will be based on needs gathered from student achievement data, professional growth plan data, staff performance data and community surveys.
Research Methodology	The District's Professional Pathway Policy (School Board Policy 4214) provides a framework to ensure that professional development programs provide educators with necessary knowledge, attitudes, skills, aspirations and behaviors to impact student achievement. Professional development at BCPS has four strands: 1) planning, 2) delivery, 3) follow-up, and 4) evaluation at the district, school, and faculty level. Through these strands the district offers its employees a Master In-service Plan (MIP) for in-service activities (Florida Statute 1012.98 (1)).

WHEREAS, the vision for the Broward College's Teacher Education program (TEP) and Lauderhill 6-12 is to partner to provide a student-centered, innovative teaching and learning community.; and

WHEREAS, Broward College will support the implementation of **Project Lead the Way** (PLTW) at Lauderhill 6-12.

WHEREAS, Broward College's Exceptional Student Education (ESE) pre-service teachers will provide additional support to struggling students at Lauderhill 6-12.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of the mutual covenants contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1 - RECITALS

1.01 **Recitals.** The parties agree that the foregoing recitals are true and correct and that such recitals are incorporated herein by reference.

ARTICLE 2-SPECIAL CONDITIONS

2.01 **Term of Agreement.** Unless terminated earlier pursuant to Section 3.05 of this Agreement, the term of this Agreement shall commence upon approval of all parties and conclude on June 30, 2015.

2.02 Demonstration site for Teacher Preparation-TEP and BCPS's Talent Development Office and Office of Academics would collaborate to provide professional development for Lauderhill 6-12 full-time teachers and TEP's pre-service teachers. Selected Lauderhill 6-12 teachers and TEP mathematics and science pre-service teachers will partner in the classroom to provide an innovative, student-centered learning community. The requirements for this component are as follows:

- a. Select TEP Mathematics and Science Pre-service Teachers will complete their required field experience placements in designated classroom settings with clinical educator trained BCPS Lauderhill 6-12 teachers.
- b. Targeted professional development trainings offered on school site by current talent development facilitators or others as needed. Trainers provide professional development to Lauderhill teachers and TEP pre-service teachers including but not limited to the following areas:
 - (1) Florida curriculum standards/CCSS Standards
 - (2) Facilitating Online Learning
 - (3) Classroom Management Techniques
 - (4) Project-Based Learning
 - (5) Cooperative Learning
 - (6) Differentiated Instruction and Assessment
 - (7) Clinical Training-Teachers only
 - (8) On-site support for teachers and pre-service teachers
 - (9) Classroom Modeling
- c. Broward College and BCPS will co-sponsor a professional development fund with each contributing \$12,500 for a total of \$25,000. These funds will be used for training mentioned above for both the teachers and pre-service teachers.

2.03 Lauderhill 6-12 is using the Project Lead the Way (PLTW) curriculum to support their STEM theme. Broward College's TEP Instructional Technology Coordinator (ITC) will train the TEP Mathematics and Science Education pre-service teachers in PLTW prior to their clinical placements.

2.04 Broward College's Exceptional Student Education (ESE) pre-service teachers will provide additional support to struggling students at Lauderhill 6-12 including academic support for ESE, ELL and general education students in all curriculum areas.

2.05 **Inspection of Broward College Records by SBBC.** BC shall establish and maintain books, records and documents (including electronic storage media) sufficient to reflect all income and expenditures of funds provided by BC under this Agreement. All Broward College Records, regardless of the form in which they are kept, shall be open to inspection and

subject to audit, inspection, examination, evaluation and/or reproduction, during normal working hours, by SBBC's agent or its authorized representative to permit SBBC to evaluate, analyze and verify the satisfactory performance of the terms and conditions of this Agreement and to evaluate, analyze and verify any and all invoices, billings, payments and/or claims submitted by BC or any of BC payees pursuant to this Agreement. BC Records subject to examination shall include, without limitation, those records necessary to evaluate and verify direct and indirect costs (including overhead allocations) as they may apply to costs associated with this Agreement. BC Records subject to this section shall include any and all documents pertinent to the evaluation, analysis, verification and reconciliation of any and all expenditures under this Agreement without regard to funding sources.

(a) Broward College's Records Defined. For the purposes of this Agreement, the term "Broward College Records" shall include, without limitation, accounting records, payroll time sheets, cancelled payroll checks, W-2 forms, written policies and procedures, computer records, disks and software, videos, photographs, executed subcontracts, subcontract files (including proposals of successful and unsuccessful bidders), original estimates, estimating worksheets, correspondence, change order files (including sufficient supporting documentation and documentation covering negotiated settlements), and any other supporting documents that would substantiate, reconcile or refute any charges and/or expenditures related to this Agreement.

(b) Duration of Right to Inspect. For the purpose of such audits, inspections, examinations, evaluations and/or reproductions, SBBC's agent or authorized representative shall have access to BC's Records from the effective date of this Agreement, for the duration of the term of this Agreement, and until the later of five (5) years after the termination of this Agreement or five (5) years after the date of final payment by SBBC to BC pursuant to this Agreement.

(c) Notice of Inspection. SBBC's agent or its authorized representative shall provide BC reasonable advance notice (not to exceed two (2) weeks) of any intended audit, inspection, examination, evaluation and or reproduction.

(d) Audit Site Conditions. SBBC's agent or its authorized representative shall have access to BC's facilities and to any and all records related to this Agreement, and shall be provided adequate and appropriate work space in order to exercise the rights permitted under this section.

(e) Failure to Permit Inspection. Failure by BC to permit audit, inspection, examination, evaluation and/or reproduction as permitted under this Section shall constitute grounds for termination of this Agreement by SBBC for cause and shall be grounds for the denial of some or all of any BC's claims for payment by SBBC.

(f) Overcharges and Unauthorized Charges. If an audit conducted in accordance with this Section discloses overcharges or unauthorized charges to SBBC by BC in excess of two percent (2%) of the total billings under this Agreement, the actual cost of SBBC's audit shall be paid by BC. If the audit discloses billings or charges to which BC is not

contractually entitled, BC shall pay said sum to SBBC within twenty (20) days of receipt of written demand under otherwise agreed to in writing by both parties.

(g) Inspection of Subcontractor's Records. BC shall require any and all subcontractors, insurance agents and material suppliers (hereafter referred to as "Payees") providing services or goods with regard to this Agreement to comply with the requirements of this section by insertion of such requirements in any written subcontract. Failure by BC to include such requirements in any subcontract shall constitute grounds for termination of this Agreement by SBBC for cause and shall be grounds for the exclusion of some or all of any Payee's costs from amounts payable by SBBC to BC pursuant to this Agreement and such excluded costs shall become the liability of BC.

(h) Inspector General Audits. BC shall comply and cooperate immediately with any inspections, reviews, investigations, or audits deemed necessary by the Florida Office of the Inspector General or by any other state or federal officials.

2.06 Inspection of SBBC Records by BC. SBBC shall establish and maintain books, records and documents (including electronic storage media) sufficient to reflect all income and expenditures of funds provided by SBBC under this Agreement. All SBBC records, regardless of the form in which they are kept, shall be open to inspection and subject to audit, inspection, examination, evaluation and/or reproduction, during normal working hours, by BC's agent or its authorized representative to permit BC to evaluate, analyze and verify the satisfactory performance of the terms and conditions of this Agreement and to evaluate, analyze and verify any and all invoices, billings, payments and/or claims submitted by SBBC or any of SBBC payees pursuant to this Agreement. Failure by SBBC to include such requirements in any subcontract shall constitute grounds for termination of this Agreement by BC for cause and shall be grounds for the exclusion of some or all of any Payee's costs from amounts payable by BC to SBBC pursuant to this Agreement and such excluded costs shall become the liability of SBBC.

(h) Inspector General Audits. SBBC shall comply and cooperate immediately with any inspections, reviews, investigations, or audits deemed necessary by the Florida Office of the Inspector General or by any other state or federal officials.

2.07 Notice. When any of the parties desire to give notice to the other, such notice must be in writing, sent by U.S. Mail, postage prepaid, addressed to the party for whom it is intended at the place last specified; the place for giving notice shall remain such until it is changed by written notice in compliance with the provisions of this paragraph. 2.08 **Background Screening:** BC agrees to comply with all requirements of Sections 1012.32 and 1012.465, Florida Statutes, and all of its personnel who (1) are to be permitted access to school grounds when students are present, (2) will have direct contact with students, or (3) have access or control of school funds, will successfully complete the background screening required by the referenced statutes and meet the standards established by the statutes. This background screening will be conducted by SBBC in advance of BC or its personnel providing any services under the conditions described in the previous sentence. BC shall bear the cost of acquiring the background screening required by Section 1012.32, Florida Statutes, and any fee imposed by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement to maintain the fingerprints provided with respect to BC and its personnel. The parties agree that the failure of BC to perform any of the duties described in this section shall constitute a material breach of this Agreement entitling SBBC to terminate immediately with no further responsibilities or duties to perform under this Agreement. To the extent permitted by law, BC agrees to indemnify and hold harmless SBBC, its officers and employees from any liability in the form of physical or mental injury, death or property damage resulting in BC's failure to comply with the requirements of this Section or with Sections 1012.32 and 1012.465, Florida Statutes. Nothing herein shall be construed as a waiver by SBBC or BC of sovereign immunity or of any rights or limits to liability existing under Section 768.28, Florida Statutes.

2.09 **Indemnification.** Each party agrees to be fully responsible for its acts of negligence, or its employees' acts of negligence when acting within the scope of their employment and agrees to be liable for any damages resulting from said negligence. This section shall survive the termination of all performance or obligations under this Agreement and shall be fully binding until such time as any proceeding brought on account of this Agreement is barred by any applicable statute of limitations.

ARTICLE 3 – GENERAL CONDITIONS

3.01 **No Waiver of Sovereign Immunity.** Nothing herein is intended to serve as a waiver of sovereign immunity by any agency or political subdivision to which sovereign immunity may be applicable or of any rights or limits to liability existing under Section 768.28, Florida Statutes. This section shall survive the termination of all performance or obligations under this Agreement and shall be fully binding until such time as any proceeding brought on account of this Agreement is barred by any applicable statute of limitations.

3.02 **No Third Party Beneficiaries.** The parties expressly acknowledge that it is not their intent to create or confer any rights or obligations in or upon any third person or entity under this Agreement. None of the parties intend to directly or substantially benefit a third party by this Agreement. The parties agree that there are no third party beneficiaries to this Agreement and that no third party shall be entitled to assert a claim against any of the parties based upon this Agreement. Nothing herein shall be construed as consent by an agency or political subdivision of the State of Florida to be sued by third parties in any matter arising out of any contract.

3.03 **Independent Contractor.** The parties to this agreement shall at all times be acting in the capacity of independent contractors and not as an officer, employee or agent of one another. Neither party or its respective agents, employees, subcontractors or assignees shall represent to others that it has the authority to bind the other party unless specifically authorized in writing to do so. No right to SBBC retirement, leave benefits or any other benefits of SBBC employees shall exist as a result of the performance of any duties or responsibilities under this Agreement. SBBC shall not be responsible for social security, withholding taxes, contributions to unemployment compensation funds or insurance for the other party or the other party's officers, employees, agents, subcontractors or assignees.

3.04 **Equal Opportunity Provision.** The parties agree that no person shall be subjected to discrimination because of age, race, color, disability, gender identity, gender expression marital status, national origin, religion, sex or sexual orientation in the performance of the parties' respective duties, responsibilities and obligations under this Agreement.

3.05 **Termination.** This Agreement may be canceled with or without cause by SBBC during the term hereof upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other parties of its desire to terminate this Agreement.

3.06 **Default.** The parties agree that, in the event that either party is in default of its obligations under this Agreement, the non-defaulting party shall provide to the defaulting party (30) days written notice to cure the default. However, in the event said default cannot be cured within said thirty (30) day period and the defaulting party is diligently attempting in good faith to cure same, the time period shall be reasonably extended to allow the defaulting party additional cure time. Upon the occurrence of a default that is not cured during the applicable cure period, this Agreement may be terminated by the non-defaulting party upon thirty (30) days notice. This remedy is not intended to be exclusive of any other remedy, and each and every such remedy shall be cumulative and shall be in addition to every other remedy now or hereafter existing at law or in equity or by statute or otherwise. No single or partial exercise by any party

of any right, power, or remedy hereunder shall preclude any other or future exercise thereof. Nothing in this section shall be construed to preclude termination for convenience pursuant to Section 3.05.

3.07 **Annual Appropriation.** The performance and obligations of SBBC under this Agreement shall be contingent upon an annual budgetary appropriation by its governing body. If SBBC does not allocate funds for the payment of services or products to be provided under this Agreement, this Agreement may be terminated by SBBC at the end of the period for which funds have been allocated. SBBC shall notify the other party at the earliest possible time before such termination. No penalty shall accrue to SBBC in the event this provision is exercised, and SBBC shall not be obligated or liable for any future payments due or any damages as a result of termination under this section.

3.08 **Excess Funds.** Any party receiving funds paid by SBBC under this Agreement agrees to promptly notify SBBC of any funds erroneously received from SBBC upon the discovery of such erroneous payment or overpayment. Any such excess funds shall be refunded to SBBC with interest calculated from the date of the erroneous payment or overpayment. Interest shall be calculated using the interest rate for judgments under Section 55.03, Florida Statutes, applicable at the time the erroneous payment or overpayment was made by SBBC.

3.09 **Public Records.** Pursuant to Section 119.0701, Florida Statutes, any party contracting with SBBC is required to (a) keep and maintain available for public inspection any records that pertain to services rendered under this Agreement; (b) provide the public with access to public records on the same terms and conditions that SBBC would provide such records and at a cost that does not exceed the cost provided in Chapter 119, Florida Statutes or as otherwise provided by law; (c) ensure that public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law; and (d) meet all requirements for retaining public records and transfer, at no cost, to SBBC all public records in that party's possession upon termination of its contract with SBBC and destroy any duplicate public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements. All of such party's records stored electronically must be provided to SBBC in a format that is compatible with SBBC's information technology systems. Each party shall maintain its own respective records and documents associated with this Agreement in accordance with the records retention requirements applicable to public records. Each party shall be responsible for compliance with any public documents request served upon it pursuant to Section 119.07, Florida Statutes, and any resultant award of attorney's fees for non-compliance with that law. Each party acknowledges that this Agreement and all attachments thereto are public records and do not constitute trade secrets.

3.10 **Student Records:** Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary within this Agreement, any party contracting with SBBC under this Agreement shall fully comply with the requirements of Section 1002.22, Florida Statutes, or any other state or federal law or regulation regarding the confidentiality of student information and records. Each such party agrees, for itself, its officers, employees, agents, representatives, contractors or subcontractors, to fully indemnify and hold harmless SBBC and its officers and employees for any violation of this section, including, without limitation, defending SBBC and its officers and employees against

any complaint, administrative or judicial proceeding, payment of any penalty imposed upon SBBC, or payment of any and all costs, damages, judgments or losses incurred by or imposed upon SBBC arising out of a breach of this covenant by the party, or an officer, employee, agent, representative, contractor, or sub-contractor of the party to the extent that the party or an officer, employee, agent, representative, contractor, or sub-contractor of the party shall either intentionally or negligently violate the provisions of this section or of Section 1002.22, Florida Statutes. This section shall survive the termination of all performance or obligations under this Agreement and shall be fully binding until such time as any proceeding brought on account of this Agreement is barred by any applicable statute of limitations.

3.11 **Compliance with Laws.** Each party shall comply with all applicable federal and state laws, codes, rules and regulations in performing its duties, responsibilities and obligations pursuant to this Agreement.

3.12 **Place of Performance.** All obligations of SBBC under the terms of this Agreement are reasonably susceptible of being performed in Broward County, Florida and shall be payable and performable in Broward County, Florida.

3.13 **Governing Law and Venue.** This Agreement shall be interpreted and construed in accordance with and governed by the laws of the State of Florida. Any controversies or legal problems arising out of this Agreement and any action involving the enforcement or interpretation of any rights hereunder shall be submitted to the jurisdiction of the State courts of the Seventeenth Judicial Circuit of Broward County, Florida.

3.14 **Entirety of Agreement.** This document incorporates and includes all prior negotiations, correspondence, conversations, agreements and understandings applicable to the matters contained herein and the parties agree that there are no commitments, agreements or understandings concerning the subject matter of this Agreement that are not contained in this document. Accordingly, the parties agree that no deviation from the terms hereof shall be predicated upon any prior representations or agreements, whether oral or written.

3.15 **Binding Effect.** This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns.

3.16 **Assignment.** Neither this Agreement or any interest herein may be assigned, transferred or encumbered by any party without the prior written consent of the other party. There shall be no partial assignments of this Agreement including, without limitation, the partial assignment of any right to receive payments from SBBC.

3.17 **Incorporation by Reference.** Exhibits attached hereto and referenced herein shall be deemed to be incorporated into this Agreement by reference.

3.18 **Captions.** The captions, section designations, section numbers, article numbers, titles and headings appearing in this Agreement are inserted only as a matter of convenience, have no substantive meaning, and in no way define, limit, construe or describe the scope or intent of such articles or sections of this Agreement, nor in any way effect this Agreement and shall not be construed to create a conflict with the provisions of this Agreement.

3.19 **Severability**. In the event that any one or more of the sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses or provisions contained in this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, illegal, unlawful, unenforceable or void in any respect, such shall not affect the remaining portions of this Agreement and the same shall remain in full force and effect as if such invalid, illegal, unlawful, unenforceable or void sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses or provisions had never been included herein.

3.20 **Preparation of Agreement**. The parties acknowledge that they have sought and obtained whatever competent advice and counsel as was necessary for them to form a full and complete understanding of all rights and obligations herein and that the preparation of this Agreement has been their joint effort. The language agreed to herein expresses their mutual intent and the resulting document shall not, solely as a matter of judicial construction, be construed more severely against one of the parties than the other.

3.21 **Amendments**. No modification, amendment, or alteration in the terms or conditions contained herein shall be effective unless contained in a written document prepared with the same or similar formality as this Agreement and executed by each party hereto.

3.22 **Waiver**. The parties agree that each requirement, duty and obligation set forth herein is substantial and important to the formation of this Agreement and, therefore, is a material term hereof. Any party's failure to enforce any provision of this Agreement shall not be deemed a waiver of such provision or modification of this Agreement unless the waiver is in writing and signed by the party waiving such provision. A written waiver shall only be effective as to the specific instance for which it is obtained and shall not be deemed a continuing or future waiver.

3.23 **Force Majeure**. Neither party shall be obligated to perform any duty, requirement or obligation under this Agreement if such performance is prevented by fire, hurricane, earthquake, explosion, wars, sabotage, accident, flood, acts of God, strikes, or other labor disputes, riot or civil commotions, or by reason of any other matter or condition beyond the control of either party, and which cannot be overcome by reasonable diligence and without unusual expense ("Force Majeure"). In no event shall a lack of funds on the part of either party be deemed Force Majeure.

3.24 **Survival**. All representations and warranties made herein, indemnification obligations, obligations to reimburse SBBC, obligations to maintain and allow inspection and audit of records and property, obligations to maintain the confidentiality of records, reporting requirements, and obligations to return public funds shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

3.25 **Authority**. Each person signing this Agreement on behalf of either party individually warrants that he or she has full legal power to execute this Agreement on behalf of the party for whom he or she is signing, and to bind and obligate such party with respect to all provisions contained in this Agreement.





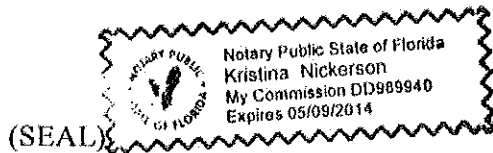
