Historical Financial Impact	Historically, students in the program have been either 254 or 255 WFTE on the matrix of services. For the 2013-2014 school year a student would generate approximately \$13,664 for a 254 matrix and \$19,544 for a 255 matrix.
Initial Agreement with Carlton Palms	The initial agreement was developed in 2010. Agreement was renewed for 2011-12, 2012-13, and 2013-2014 school years. Students are still in attendance at Carlton Palms therefore requesting approval for 2014-15 school year.
