WHEREAS, children whose parents are not present benefit from a relationship with nurturing and actively involved parent figures, such as grandparents, uncles, aunts, Big Brothers, Big Sisters and mentors, and such role models are increasingly taking an active role in the lives of children whose biological parents are absent; and

**WHEREAS**, parents who are involved with their children feel better about themselves and have a greater success in their careers and lives;

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that The School Board of Broward County, Florida, hereby proclaims **September 2003 as Take Your "Parent" to School Month in Florida**, and extends best wishes to all children and their parents for a most enjoyable experience and urges the entire school district to welcome them to participate.
