On August 17, 1999, The School Board of Broward County, Florida, approved a Charter School Agreement enabling The City of Pembroke Pines, to open a charter school named Pembroke Pines Charter Elementary School - 5051. This contract was effective for fifteen years and ends on June 30, 2014.

Pursuant to Section 1002.33 (8)(b), Florida Statutes, a school's Charter School Agreement may be renewed subject to a program review and provided that none of the statutory grounds for non-renewal have been documented.

The City of Pembroke Pines, on behalf of The City of Pembroke Pines Charter Elementary School - 5051, desires to reference the charter school's designation as a high-performing charter school within the Charter School Agreement and receive a fifteen-year renewal pursuant to Section 1002.331, Florida Statutes. In addition, Section 1002.33(2)(b), Florida Statutes states, "a high-performing charter school is authorized to increase its student enrollment once per school year to more than capacity identified in the charter, but student enrollment may not exceed the current facility capacity." The City of Pembroke Pines Charter Elementary School – 5051, is increasing its student enrollment capacity to 2,470 under the renewal agreement that is within the current multiple facility capacity.

The Sponsor has conducted annual reviews of the charter school's academic progress, operational performance and financial viability, and concurs with the State's designation of high-performing charter school.

The Superintendent's Charter School Review Committee has reviewed and analyzed the Charter Renewal Program Review submitted by The City of Pembroke Pines, on behalf of Pembroke Pines Charter Elementary - 5051, and has recommended a renewal of its Charter Agreement.

It is requested that The School Board of Broward County, Florida, approve the renewal of the Charter School Agreement for The City of Pembroke Pines, on behalf of Pembroke Pines Charter Elementary - 5051, for a fifteen-year period.
