ROAD TO CHILD OUTCOMES PARTICIPANT AGREEMENT

This Agreement is made this <u>att</u> day of <u>June</u> 2014 by and between The School Board of Broward County, Florida (hereinafter referred to as "SBBC"), and **ABC School**, (hereinafter referred to as "Child Care Provider").

WHEREAS, the goal of the *Road to Child Outcomes* initiative is to provide supports to systematically integrate quality within the Early Care and Education Community; building on national best practices and adapting evidenced based exemplary practices focused on the Child, Family, and Teacher and Learning Environment, in order to realize maximum outcomes for children in identified communities.

NOW THEREFORE, FOR AND IN CONSIDERATION of the mutual covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth, the Parties agree as follows:

Definitions:

- (1) Early Learning Coalition of Broward County, Inc. (ELC) A not-for-profit agency governed by a Board of 25 individuals representing business, community, and early childhood leaders, as delineated in the Local Coalition Plan and approved by Florida's Office of Early Learning. The mission of the ELC is: to provide the resources, advocacy, leadership, coordination and oversight for early care and education from birth to school-at and to support access to school-age care to ensure children's success in school.
- (2) Contracted Service Provider An agency contracted by the ELC to provide services under the Road to Child Outcomes initiative.
- (3) Child Care Provider An organization that provides direct child care and early education services that will receive services under the Road to Child Outcomes Initiative.
- (4) Road to Child Outcomes Contract The contract entered into by the ELC and SBBC to deliver Road to Child Outcomes services as described and set forth in said contract. The Road to Child Outcomes Contract is incorporated herein by reference.
- (5) Road to Child Outcomes Initiative The goal of the Road to Child Outcomes initiative is to provide supports to systematically integrate quality within the early care and education community; building on national best practices and adapting evidenced based exemplary practices focused on the child, family, and teacher and learning environment, realizing maximum outcomes for children in identified communities.

Responsibilities of SBBC in its capacity as a Contracted Service Provider:

In accordance with the Road to Child Outcomes Contract, SBBC will provide services that support the major *Road to Child Outcomes* program goals as follows:



Major Program Goals

- (1) Child Focus: Within designated/approved early education facilities, provide oversight of *Road to Child Outcomes* activities including referral, evaluation, and longitudinal tracking/monitoring between developmental screening, classroom instruction, child developmental assessments, and kindergarten readiness.
 - (a) Ensure that each *Child Care Provider* conducts regular assessments of all School Readiness children birth to five (not yet in kindergarten), especially those requiring additional developmental support(s), using a nationally researched based, comprehensive early childhood, electronic child assessment, with the results used to inform instruction.
 - (b) Ensure that each *Child Care Provider* provides the appropriate screens and assessments and work with "Master Teacher Teams", as the term is defined in the *Road to Child Outcomes* contract between the ELC and the Contract Service Provider, to ensure children are receiving the education instruction and supports necessary to maximize their development. The children's development will be measured by an approved nationally researched based, comprehensive early childhood, electronic child assessment system.
- (2) Family Focus: Provide family engagement and support services to families of children participating in the *Road to Child Outcomes* consistent with the Center for Social Policy Strengthening Families Approach that will provide additional tools, opportunities, and information to parents to help empower parents to advocate on behalf of their child, as well as to be an active part of their child's development as the child's "first teacher" and partner with their child's early care and education facility. The requirements for complying with the Center for Social Policy Strengthening Families Approach is set forth at the following website address: (http://www.cssp.org/reform/strengthening-families/the-basics/the-strengthening-families-approach)
 - (a) The family engagement services shall involve both a family and their child's early education facility.
 - (b) The family engagement services provided will be consistent with the educational curriculum and developmental experiences the child is experiencing in his or her classroom.
 - (c) The family engagement services will strive to provide expanded positive life experiences for parents that they can share with their children.
- (3) Teacher and Learning Environment Focus: Provide services designed to attain and support implementation of quality standards in early learning programs.
 - (a) Establish "Master Teacher Teams" whose primary role will be to visit classrooms and coach teachers using reflective practice to improve instruction.
 - (b) Ensure "Master Teacher Teams" administer program evaluation instruments to measure practices in preschool classrooms (e.g., CLASS™, ERS®, TSG®); plan and present training opportunities to improve programmatic areas; provide follow-up



support individualized to the level of teacher development; and plan procedures for performance based assessments to ensure reliable collection of child outcome information through portfolio review meetings and professional development.

Responsibilities of ABC School in its capacity as Childcare Provider:

- (1) Inform and orient all staff at the child care facility about involvement with *Road to Child Outcomes*, the benefits, and requirements.
- (2) Participate in the *Community of Practice* professional development initiative sponsored by the ELC.
- (3) Ensure all participating instructional classroom staff completes available training in identified tools such as Classroom Assessment Scoring System (CLASS) and Teaching Strategies GOLD (TSG) in a timely manner and follow through with implementation plans, and reliability checks.
- (4) Facilitate access of the Master Teachers and other *Road to Child Outcomes* initiative staff to the child care center, classrooms, and teachers, for purposes of conducting observations (e.g. CLASS), providing coaching, other professional development, and quality supports.
- (5) Ensure school staff implements CLASS dimensions into their everyday interactions as agreed upon between the Family Central coach and the teacher.
- (6) Ensure school staff documents children's progress and inputs data in the TSG website, generates reports, and makes planning decisions based on data.
- (7) Identify and put into action a leadership team including the director, to provide ongoing support and insight to staff, sustainability of effective teacher-child interactions according to CLASS, and using the child assessment information from TSG, develop plans to support children's learning outcomes.
- (8) Work in partnership with Parent Educator, Master Teachers, and other *Road to Child Outcomes* initiative staff, to implement family engagement and support services provided by SBBC.
- (9) Work in partnership with Master Teachers and other *Road to Child Outcomes* initiative staff to achieve and maintain overall high quality care including the learning environment to realize maximum child outcomes.

Indemnification

This section shall survive the termination of all performance or obligations under this Agreement and shall be fully binding until such time as any proceeding brought on account of this Agreement is barred by any applicable statute of limitations.

(1) By Contracted Provider: SBBC agrees to be fully responsible up to the limits of Section 768.28, Florida Statutes, for its acts of negligence, or its employees' acts of



negligence when acting within the scope of their employment and agrees to be liable for any damages resulting from said negligence.

(2) By Child Care Provider: Childcare Provider agrees to indemnify, hold harmless and defend SBBC, its agents, servants and employees from any and all claims, judgments, costs, and expenses including, but not limited to, reasonable attorney's fees, reasonable investigative and discovery costs, court costs and all other sums which SBBC, its agents, servants and employees may pay or become obligated to pay on account of any, all and every claim or demand, or assertion of liability, or any claim or action founded thereon, arising or alleged to have arisen out of the products, goods or services furnished by Childcare Provider, its agents, servants or employees; the equipment of Childcare Provider its agents, servants or employees while such equipment is on premises owned or controlled by SBBC; or the negligence of Childcare Provider or the negligence of Childcare Provider's agents when acting within the scope of their employment, whether such claims, judgments, costs and expenses be for damages, damage to property including SBBC's property, and injury or death of any person whether employed by Childcare Provider, SBBC or otherwise.

<u>Miscellaneous</u>

Term and Effective Date: The Agreement shall begin upon execution by all parties and remain in effect so long as the *Road to Child Outcomes* Participation Agreement is in effect.

Independent Contractor: The parties to this agreement shall at all times be acting in the capacity of independent contractors and not as an officer, employee or agent of one another. Neither party or its respective agents, employees, subcontractors or assignees shall represent to others that it has the authority to bind the other party unless specifically authorized in writing to do so. No right to SBBC retirement, leave benefits or any other benefits of SBBC employees shall exist as a result of the performance of any duties or responsibilities under this Agreement. SBBC shall not be responsible for social security, withholding taxes, contributions to unemployment compensation funds or insurance for the other party or the other party's officers, employees, agents, subcontractors or assignees.

Equal Opportunity Provision: The parties agree that no person shall be subjected to discrimination because of age, race, color, disability, gender identity, gender expression marital status, national origin, religion, sex or sexual orientation in the performance of the parties' respective duties, responsibilities and obligations under this Agreement.

No Waiver of Sovereign Immunity: Nothing herein is intended to serve as a waiver of sovereign immunity by any agency or political subdivision to which sovereign immunity may be applicable or of any rights or limits to liability existing under Section 768.28, Florida Statutes. This section shall survive the termination of all performance or obligations under this Agreement and shall be fully binding until such time as any proceeding brought on account of this Agreement is barred by any applicable statute of limitations.



Agreement Modification: This Agreement may be modified during its initial term or any renewal term by mutual agreement of the parties provided such agreement is in writing and executed by both parties.

Entire Instrument: The Agreement constitutes the entire instrument relating to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous instruments, understandings, negotiations, and discussions, both written and oral, among such parties with respect to such subject matter. There are no representations, promises or undertakings other than those expressly set forth in the Agreement.

No Waiver: No wavier of any provisions of the Agreement will constitute a waiver of any other provisions of the Agreement, nor shall any such waiver constitute a continuing waiver unless otherwise expressly so provided.

No Third Party Beneficiary: Nothing expressed or implied in the Agreement shall be construed to confer upon or give any rights or remedies to any person other than the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns.

Venue: This Agreement shall be construed, performed, and enforced in all respects in accordance with the laws, rules and regulations of the State of Florida.

Severability: If any provision, term, or condition of the Agreement is held to be illegal, invalid, or void for any reason whatsoever, by any court of competent jurisdiction, and such declaration shall be finally upheld on any and all appeals and petitions taken therefrom, the Agreement shall be read as if such illegal, invalid or void provision were not a part of the Agreement, and the remainder of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

Priority of Documents: In the event of a conflict between the terms of this Agreement and the *Road To Child Outcomes* Contract between the ELC and SBBC, the terms and conditions of the *Road To Child Outcomes* Contract shall prevail.

Termination: This Agreement may be terminated by either party at any time upon no less than seven (7) days written notice to the other party.

Authority: Each person signing this Agreement on behalf of either party individually warrants that he or she has full legal power to execute this Agreement on behalf of the party for whom he or she is signing, and to bind and obligate such party with respect to all provisions contained in this Agreement.

Notice: Any notices, communications and waivers under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be as delivered by the following methods: (i) hand delivery, (ii) by depositing such notice in the United States mail, certified or registered mail with return receipt requested, postage prepaid or (iii) via overnight air courier service. Unless otherwise provided in this Agreement, notice by registered or certified mail shall be deemed given on the date it is officially recorded as delivered by return receipt or equivalent, and in the absence of such record of delivery it shall be presumed to have been delivered on the seventh day after it was deposited in the mail.

- (3) Child Care Provider An organization that provides direct child care and early education services that will receive services under the Road to Child Outcomes Initiative.
- (4) Road to Child Outcomes Contract The contract entered into by the ELC and SBBC to deliver Road to Child Outcomes services as described and set forth in said contract. The Road to Child Outcomes Contract is incorporated herein by reference.

Notice: Any notices, communications and waivers under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be as delivered by the following methods: (i) hand delivery, (ii) by depositing such notice in the United States mail, certified or registered mail with return receipt requested, postage prepaid or (iii) via overnight air courier service. Unless otherwise provided in this Agreement, notice by registered or certified mail shall be deemed given on the date it is officially recorded as delivered by return receipt or equivalent, and in the absence of such record of delivery it shall be presumed to have been delivered on the seventh day after it was deposited in the mail.

ROAD TO CHILD OUTCOMES PARTICIPANT AGREEMENT

This Agreement is made this Other day of June 2014 by and between The School Board of Broward County, Florida (hereinafter referred to as "SBBC"), and Youth Impact, Inc., Early Education Center (hereinafter referred to as "Child Care Provider").

WHEREAS, the goal of the *Road to Child Outcomes* initiative is to provide supports to systematically integrate quality within the Early Care and Education Community; building on national best practices and adapting evidenced based exemplary practices focused on the Child, Family, and Teacher and Learning Environment, in order to realize maximum outcomes for children in identified communities.

NOW THEREFORE, FOR AND IN CONSIDERATION of the mutual covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth, the Parties agree as follows:

Definitions:

- (1) Early Learning Coalition of Broward County, Inc. (ELC) A not-for-profit agency governed by a Board of 25 individuals representing business, community, and early childhood leaders, as delineated in the Local Coalition Plan and approved by Florida's Office of Early Learning. The mission of the ELC is: to provide the resources, advocacy, leadership, coordination and oversight for early care and education from birth to school-at and to support access to school-age care to ensure children's success in school.
- (2) Contracted Service Provider An agency contracted by the ELC to provide services under the Road To Child Outcomes initiative.
- (3) Child Care Provider An organization that provides direct child care and early education services that will receive services under the Road to Child Outcomes Initiative.
- (4) Road to Child Outcomes Contract The contract entered into by the ELC and SBBC to deliver Road to Child Outcomes services as described and set forth in said contract. The Road to Child Outcomes Contract is incorporated herein by reference.
- (5) Road to Child Outcomes Initiative The goal of the Road to Child Outcomes initiative is to provide supports to systematically integrate quality within the early care and education community; building on national best practices and adapting evidenced based exemplary practices focused on the child, family, and teacher and learning environment, realizing maximum outcomes for children in identified communities.

Responsibilities of SBBC in its capacity as a Contract Service Provider:

In accordance with the Road to Child Outcomes Contract, SBBC will provide services that support the major *Road to Child Outcomes* program goals as follows:



Major Program Goals

- (1) Child Focus: Within designated/approved early education facilities, provide oversight of *Road to Child Outcomes* activities including referral, evaluation, and longitudinal tracking/monitoring between developmental screening, classroom instruction, child developmental assessments, and kindergarten readiness.
 - (a) Ensure that each *Child Care Provider* conducts regular assessments of all School Readiness children birth to five (not yet in kindergarten), especially those requiring additional developmental support(s), using a nationally researched based, comprehensive early childhood, electronic child assessment, with the results used to inform instruction.
 - (b) Ensure that each *Child Care Provider* provides the appropriate screens and assessments and work with "Master Teacher Teams", as the term is defined in the *Road to Child Outcomes* contract between the ELC and the Contract Service Provider, to ensure children are receiving the education instruction and supports necessary to maximize their development. The children's development will be measured by an approved nationally researched based, comprehensive early childhood, electronic child assessment system.
- (2) Family Focus: Provide family engagement and support services to families of children participating in the *Road to Child Outcomes* consistent with the Center for Social Policy Strengthening Families Approach that will provide additional tools, opportunities, and information to parents to help empower parents to advocate on behalf of their child, as well as to be an active part of their child's development as the child's "first teacher" and partner with their child's early care and education facility. The requirements for complying with the Center for Social Policy Strengthening Families Approach is set forth at the following website address: (http://www.cssp.org/reform/strengthening-families/the-basics/the-strengthening-families-approach)
 - (a) The family engagement services shall involve both a family and their child's early education facility.
 - (b) The family engagement services provided will be consistent with the educational curriculum and developmental experiences the child is experiencing in his or her classroom.
 - (c) The family engagement services will strive to provide expanded positive life experiences for parents that they can share with their children.
- (3) Teacher and Learning Environment Focus: Provide services designed to attain and support implementation of quality standards in early learning programs.
 - (a) Establish "Master Teacher Teams" whose primary role will be to visit classrooms and coach teachers using reflective practice to improve instruction.
 - (b) Ensure "Master Teacher Teams" administer program evaluation instruments to measure practices in preschool classrooms (e.g., CLASS™, ERS®, TSG®); plan and present training opportunities to improve programmatic areas; provide follow-up



support individualized to the level of teacher development; and plan procedures for performance based assessments to ensure reliable collection of child outcome information through portfolio review meetings and professional development.

Responsibilities of Youth Impact, Inc., Early Education Center in its capacity as *Childcare Provider*:

- (1) Inform and orient all staff at the child care facility about involvement with *Road to Child Outcomes*, the benefits, and requirements.
- (2) Participate in the *Community of Practice* professional development initiative sponsored by the ELC.
- (3) Ensure all participating instructional classroom staff completes available training in identified tools such as Classroom Assessment Scoring System (CLASS) and Teaching Strategies GOLD (TSG) in a timely manner and follow through with implementation plans, and reliability checks.
- (4) Facilitate access of the Master Teachers and other *Road to Child Outcomes* initiative staff to the child care center, classrooms, and teachers, for purposes of conducting observations (e.g. CLASS), providing coaching, other professional development, and quality supports.
- (5) Ensure school staff implements CLASS dimensions into their everyday interactions as agreed upon between the Family Central coach and the teacher.
- (6) Ensure school staff documents children's progress and inputs data in the TSG website, generates reports, and makes planning decisions based on data.
- (7) Identify and put into action a leadership team including the director, to provide ongoing support and insight to staff, sustainability of effective teacher-child interactions according to CLASS, and using the child assessment information from TSG, develop plans to support children's learning outcomes.
- (8) Work in partnership with Parent Educator, Master Teachers, and other *Road to Child Outcomes* initiative staff, to implement family engagement and support services provided by SBBC.
- (9) Work in partnership with Master Teachers and other *Road to Child Outcomes* initiative staff to achieve and maintain overall high quality care including the learning environment to realize maximum child outcomes.

Indemnification

This section shall survive the termination of all performance or obligations under this Agreement and shall be fully binding until such time as any proceeding brought on account of this Agreement is barred by any applicable statute of limitations.



- (1) By Contracted Provider: SBBC agrees to be fully responsible up to the limits of Section 768.28, Florida Statutes, for its acts of negligence, or its employees' acts of negligence when acting within the scope of their employment and agrees to be liable for any damages resulting from said negligence.
- (2) By Child Care Provider: Childcare Provider agrees to indemnify, hold harmless and defend SBBC, its agents, servants and employees from any and all claims, judgments, costs, and expenses including, but not limited to, reasonable attorney's fees, reasonable investigative and discovery costs, court costs and all other sums which SBBC, its agents, servants and employees may pay or become obligated to pay on account of any, all and every claim or demand, or assertion of liability, or any claim or action founded thereon, arising or alleged to have arisen out of the products, goods or services furnished by Childcare Provider, its agents, servants or employees; the equipment of Childcare Provider its agents, servants or employees while such equipment is on premises owned or controlled by SBBC; or the negligence of Childcare Provider or the negligence of Childcare Provider's agents when acting within the scope of their employment, whether such claims, judgments, costs and expenses be for damages, damage to property including SBBC's property, and injury or death of any person whether employed by Childcare Provider, SBBC or otherwise.

Miscellaneous

Term and Effective Date: The Agreement shall begin upon execution by all parties and remain in effect so long as the *Road to Child Outcomes* Participation Agreement is in effect.

Independent Contractor: The parties to this agreement shall at all times be acting in the capacity of independent contractors and not as an officer, employee or agent of one another. Neither party or its respective agents, employees, subcontractors or assignees shall represent to others that it has the authority to bind the other party unless specifically authorized in writing to do so. No right to SBBC retirement, leave benefits or any other benefits of SBBC employees shall exist as a result of the performance of any duties or responsibilities under this Agreement. SBBC shall not be responsible for social security, withholding taxes, contributions to unemployment compensation funds or insurance for the other party or the other party's officers, employees, agents, subcontractors or assignees.

Equal Opportunity Provision: The parties agree that no person shall be subjected to discrimination because of age, race, color, disability, gender identity, gender expression marital status, national origin, religion, sex or sexual orientation in the performance of the parties' respective duties, responsibilities and obligations under this Agreement.

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Venue: This Agreement shall be construed, performed, and enforced in all respects in accordance with the laws, rules and regulations of the State of Florida.
