Currently, Broward Virtual University offers over 90 online courses to educators. With grant funds the school district will develop video content to enhance participants' learning of the course content. By adding the visual dimension to the course content, participants will be better able to implement what they are learning in their classrooms and in turn help to improve student achievement.  As a result of the work completed through this initiative, educators will have a more robust learning experience in the online courses. By having the opportunity to fully study and examine teaching practices on a more complex level, educators are more likely to assimilate proven strategies into their own teaching repertoire.
